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- 8 **Section 1**. W.S. 39-15-105(a)(viii) by creating a new
- 9 subparagraph (U) and 39-16-105(a)(viii) by creating a new
- 10 subparagraph (K) are amended to read:

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12 **39-15-105.** Exemptions.

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- 14 (a) The following sales or leases are exempt from the
- 15 excise tax imposed by this article:

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2	(viii) For the purpose of exempting sales of
3	services and tangible personal property as an economic
4	incentive, the following are exempt:

6	(U) Sales of equipment to a
7	telecommunications service provider, video programming
8	service provider or provider of internet access used to
9	provide broadband internet service in an unserved area, as
10	defined in W.S. 9-12-1501(e), under this subparagraph. The
11	following shall apply:
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13	(I) A telecommunications service
14	provider, video programming service provider or provider of
15	internet access may allocate the sales price of equipment
16	using any reasonable method, instead of specific geographic
17	accounting, if the method is consistently used by the provider
18	and supported by verifiable data that reasonably reflects the
19	location where the equipment is used;
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21	(II) As used in this subparagraph:
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1	(1) "Broadband internet service"
2	means high speed internet access that in residential areas is
3	capable of download speeds of at least twenty-five (25)
4	megabits per second and upload speeds of at least three (3)
5	megabits per second or, in business corridors, as defined by
6	rule of the Wyoming business council under W.S. 9-12-1501(g),
7	is capable of download speeds of at least one (1) gigabit per
8	second and upload speeds of at least one hundred (100)
9	megabits per second;

11	(2) "Equipment" means tangible
12	objects which are integral to the broadband internet service
13	infrastructure of a telecommunications service provider,
14	video programming service provider or provider of internet
15	access and shall exclude equipment sold or leased to a
16	customer of a provider;
17	
18	(3) "Provider of internet access"
19	means a person, or any agent, contractor or subcontractor of
20	the person, who in the course of business, provides a service
21	that enables users to access content, information, electronic
22	mail or other services offered over the internet and may also
23	include access to proprietary content, information and other

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1	services as part of a package of services offered to consumers
2	and does not include telecommunications services, except to
3	the extent such services are purchased, used or sold by a
4	provider of internet access to provide internet access;

6	(4) "Telecommunications service
7	provider" means a person, or any agent, contractor or
8	subcontractor of the person, who in the course of business,
9	provides telecommunications services, as defined in W.S.
10	39-15-101(a)(xxxix)(U);
11	
12	(5) "Video programming service
13	provider" means a person, or any agent, contractor or
14	subcontractor of the person, who in the course of business,
15	provides programming from, or comparable to, a television
16	broadcast station, including cable service as defined in 47
17	U.S.C. § 522(6).

21	(a) The following purchases or leases are exempt from
22	the excise tax imposed by this article:
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1 (viii) For the purpose of exempting sales of services and tangible personal property as an economic 2 3 incentive, the following are exempt: 4 (K) Purchases of equipment by a 5 telecommunications service provider, video programming 6 service provider or provider of internet access used to 7 8 provide broadband internet service in an unserved area, as defined in W.S. 9-12-1501(e). A telecommunications service 9 10 provider, video programming service provider or provider of 11 internet access may allocate the purchase price of equipment using any reasonable method, instead of specific geographic 12 13 accounting, if the method is consistently used by the provider and supported by verifiable data that reasonably reflects the 14 location where the equipment is used.
