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specifically provided under (b) Except as this subsection, subsection (f) of this section W.S. 23-1-705(a), no person may apply for and receive more than one (1) moose or one (1) ram bighorn sheep license in any consecutive five (5) year period. Effective for the 1995 hunting season and each hunting season thereafter, licenses issued under this subsection shall be based upon the number of points assigned to each applicant for a particular species. Effective January 1, 2000, licenses issued under this subsection shall be issued partially through a preference point drawing and partially through a random drawing of all remaining unsuccessful applicants for that year. The department shall assign points to each license applicant for a specific species by multiplying the number of years the applicant has unsuccessfully applied for a license times one 16 (1). The calculation used to assign points to an applicant for a particular species under this subsection shall include 17 any year the applicant does not apply for a big or trophy 18 19 game animal hunting license for that species, provided in the 20 case of a resident the applicant pays the fee specified in W.S. 23-2-101(k) and in the case of a nonresident the 21 22 applicant pays the appropriate fee established by the 23 commission under W.S. 23-2-101(m), and shall include points

any unsuccessful license applicant failing to apply for a

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license, or pay the applicable fee in lieu of applying, or

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(g) In addition to the authority granted under 7 subsection (b) of this section, the commission may through 8 9 rule and regulation develop and implement a preference point 10 program for nonresident antelope, nonresident deer and 11 nonresident elk licenses which are limited in quota and would 12 otherwise be issued through a random drawing. A program 13 established pursuant to this subsection may be implemented for all or selected hunt areas and may be applied to all or 14 portions of licenses for any particular species. 15 The 16 commission may charge nonresident license applicants a 17 nonrefundable fee to accumulate preference points under the program as provided in W.S. 23-2-101(m). The calculation used 18 19 to assign points under this program shall include points 20 awarded to the applicant under subsection (j) of this section.

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22 (h) Rules and regulations shall be promulgated by the 23 game and fish commission to carry out subsections (a) through

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1 (f) and (j) of this section and may be promulgated as provided

in subsection (g) of this section.

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4 (j) The department shall award one (1) preference point 5 to any person who attends and completes a hunter safety course 6 that is conducted by the department under W.S. 23-2-106(b) or another course that is similar in content and instruction and 7 8 that is approved by the commission. A person shall only accumulate one (1) preference point under this subsection 9 10 once every five (5) years. The person may designate preference points earned under this subsection toward any particular 11 12 species for which the commission has established a preference

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point program.

23-2-109. Multiple applications for limited licenses
16 prohibited; penalty.

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Except as otherwise authorized by law or rule of the commission, no person shall submit more than one (1) application for a license for the same big or trophy game species or for wild turkey, if the issuance of the license has been limited by the commission. A violation of this subsection shall be punishable as a high misdemeanor

2 of all points then assigned to the person pursuant to W.S.

3 23-1-703(b), or (g) or (j), and disqualification in the year

4 of submission for any license for the species for which the
