1 (ii) Cowboys and cowgirls transcend ethnicity, 2 gender, geographic boundaries and political affiliations; 3 4 (iii) The cowboy and cowgirl today exemplify the 5 Code of the West, which accentuates the values of courage, pride, persistence, hard work, toughness, fairness, fidelity, 6 honesty, directness, integrity 7 loyalty, and 8 principles-based lifestyle; 9 10 (iv) The cowboy and cowgirl are fiercely 11 independent, preserve an innovative spirit and remain 12 committed to the ideal of equality, underscoring the core values of Wyoming today; 13 14 15 The cowboy and cowgirl are responsible (V)16 stewards of Wyoming's natural heritage, living off the land 17 and working to protect and enhance the environment for future 18 generations; 19 20 (vi) The cowboy and cowgirl continue to be an 21 important part of Wyoming's economy and make products valued in markets across the United States and internationally; 22
