A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to cities, towns and counties; authorizing

2 electronic publication of certain city, town and county

3 notices as specified; making conforming amendments; repealing

4 an obsolete provision; specifying applicability; and

5 providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 **Section 1.** W.S. 15-1-110(a), 15-1-116(a) and (c),

10 15-2-204(a)(intro), 18-3-515, 18-3-516(a) and (f), 18-3-517,

11 18-3-519(a) and 18-4-105 are amended to read:

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13 15-1-110. Minutes of meetings and titles of ordinances

14 passed to be published; exception; contents; publication of

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1 names, salaries and wages of specified officials and 2 employees.

STATE OF WYOMING

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4 (a) The governing body of any city or town shall may 5 designate a legal newspaper and publish once therein or on the website of the legal newspaper the minutes of all regular 6 and special meetings of the governing body and the titles of 7 all ordinances passed. If the city or town does not designate 8 9 a newspaper is not published in the city or town under this 10 <u>subsection</u> the proceedings or ordinances shall be posted for 11 at least ten (10) days in the city or town clerk's office on 12 the website of the city or town and in such other places as 13 the governing body determines. The clerk of each city or town shall within twelve (12) days after adjournment of every 14 15 meeting, furnish the newspaper or post on the city or town 16 website a copy of the proceedings of the meeting. Except for 17 salaries and wages published under subsection (b) of this section, the copy shall include any bill presented to the 18 19 governing body stating the amount of the bill, the amount 20 allowed, the purpose of the bill and the claimant. Claims for 21 part-time employees may be summarized by department without listing each part-time employee. The If designated under this 22

2 within nine (9) days after receipt.

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4 15-1-116. Ordinances; publication required; exception; 5 attestation; recodification or revision.

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(a) Every ordinance before becoming effective shall be 7 published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation, 8 9 which maintains a physical office at which advertisements are 10 accepted and which is open to the public during regularly set 11 business hours within the boundaries of the city or town, on 12 the website of a newspaper of general circulation or on the 13 website of the city or town. If selected to provide publication under this subsection, the newspaper shall 14 publish the ordinance within nine (9) days from the date of 15 16 receipt. If there is no such newspaper or website, the ordinance shall be posted for at least ten (10) days in the 17 city clerk's office and in such other places as the governing 18 19 Emergency ordinances are effective upon body determines. 20 proclamation of the mayor, and as soon thereafter as is 21 practicable they shall be published and posted in the manner required of other ordinances. 22

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1 (c) A recodification or revision of ordinances shall be 2 published by title only together with a brief summary of the recodification or revision, in the manner provided 3 4 subsection (a) of this section for newspaper or website publication, provided that a copy of the recodification or 5 revision shall be available to the public at all reasonable 6 7 hours in the office of the city or town clerk.

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Immediately after the end of the fiscal year, the 12 governing body shall publish in a newspaper, if one is 13 published in the town, or if there is none then by posting in 14 15 three (3) or more public places, of general circulation in 16 the city or town, on the website of a newspaper of general circulation or on the website of the city or town an exhibit 17 of the receipts and expenditures specifying:

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1 Each board of county commissioners at their regular July 2 meeting shall request a statement of the receipts and 3 expenditures of the county during the preceding twelve (12) 4 months setting forth the source and amount of all receipts and the purpose and the amount of all expenditures to be 5 prepared upon reconciliation of all accounts by the county 6 treasurer and county clerk, not later than September 30. The 7 8 statement shall be signed by the chairman and clerk of the 9 board and shall be posted on the county's designated official 10 website in the manner provided in W.S. 18-3-516(f) and published may publish the statement at least once in the 11

county's designated official newspaper.

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(a) Each board of county commissioners shall post a comprehensive summary of the entire proceedings of all regular and special meetings held by the board on the county's official website in the manner provided in subsection (f) of this section and may publish the comprehensive summary of the entire proceedings of all regular and special meetings held by them one (1) time in the county's designated official

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1 newspaper. The county clerk of each county shall within 2 twelve (12) working days after adjournment of every meeting 3 for which the next scheduled meeting will be called to order 4 in two (2) weeks time or less, or within eighteen (18) working 5 days after adjournment of every meeting for which the next scheduled meeting will be called to order in more than two 6 7 (2) weeks time, furnish the paper with a copy of the 8 proceedings if the proceedings will be published in a newspaper. Except for salaries and wages published under 9 10 subsection (b) of this section, the copy shall include any 11 bill presented to the board stating the amount of the bill, 12 the amount allowed, the purpose of the bill and the claimant. 13 Claims for part-time employees may be summarized by department without listing each part-time employee. The 14 15 newspaper shall publish the copy of proceedings within nine 16 (9) days after receipt. The board shall post on its official 17 website, and if practicable publish, notice of the time of all regular and special meetings. 18

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20 (f) For all publications required by statute to be
21 posted on a county's official website, the publication shall
22 be posted on the county's official website and may be posted
23 at times required for publication in a designated official

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newspaper. Until June 30, 2016, Each board of county commissioners shall may cause to be published in the designated official newspaper once per month, no less than twelve (12) times per year, a general public notice pertaining to access to county information. After June 30, 2016, this general public notice shall be published at least once per

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year.

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15 **18-3-519.** Requirements as to newspaper publishing legal notices.

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18 (a) The publication of any legal notice, printing or
19 advertising required by law is without force or effect unless
20 published on the county's official website or in a newspaper
21 which has been regularly issued at least once each week for
22 a period of fifty-two (52) consecutive weeks prior to the

date of the first publication of the notice or advertisement,

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1 has a paid circulation of at least five hundred (500) and

2 each page is not less than ten (10) inches by twelve and

3 one-half (12.5) inches in size.

6 Laramie and Albany counties.

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8 All taxes and licenses are payable in money, and all properly

9 attested orders and warrants are entitled to preference for

10 payment according to date of presentation and acceptance at

11 the treasurer's office, the oldest date to have preference.

12 The treasurer shall not refuse to pay any order or warrant

13 because there are unpresented prior orders or warrants if

14 there is sufficient money in the treasury to pay all prior

15 orders or warrants, with interest due thereon, as well as the

16 order then presented. When the total of payable, interest

17 drawing unpresented orders, amounts to five hundred dollars

18 (\$500.00), the treasurer shall cause two (2) weekly notices

19 to be <u>published on the county's official website or</u> inserted

20 in the official county newspaper briefly describing them by

21 numbers, date, amount and in whose favor drawn, notifying the

22 holders that they will cease to draw interest ten (10) days

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1 after the second notice. This section shall not apply to

2 Laramie and Albany counties.
