Common college transcript-implementation.

## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to community colleges and the University of
- 2 Wyoming; establishing requirements for the community college
- 3 commission's common college transcript system; authorizing an
- 4 at-will position; providing appropriations; and providing for
- 5 an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 **Section 1**. W.S. 21-18-202(a)(vi) is amended to read:

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11 21-18-202. Powers and duties of the commission.

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13 (a) The commission shall perform the following general

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14 functions:

1	(vi) Develop and maintain a common transcript
2	system that uses common course numbering for all courses
3	provided at the community colleges or and the University of
4	Wyoming. The system shall facilitate program planning and the
5	transfer of students and course credits between the community
6	colleges and the University of Wyoming. The development and
7	ongoing maintenance of the statewide course numbering system,
8	including determining course equivalencies, shall be
9	accomplished with the assistance of appropriate committees
10	that shall include faculty members and staff of the community
11	colleges and the University of Wyoming. The system shall:
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13	(A) Facilitate program planning and the
14	transfer of students and course credits between the community
15	colleges and the University of Wyoming;
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17	(B) Offer functionality to transmit
18	transcript information between the community colleges and the
19	University of Wyoming;
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21	(C) Extend to the community college
22	commission, the Wyoming department of education, the
23	department of workforce services and the University of

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1 Wyoming a statewide longitudinal education data system, which shall serve as a statewide exchange for management and 2 3 analytical reporting in support of education and workforce 4 outcomes; 5 6 (D) Use a common transcript vendor; 7 8 (E) Use electronic course catalog software to ensure a consistent experience for students between the 9 10 community colleges and the University of Wyoming. Each 11 community college and the University of Wyoming may use 12 different course catalog software. The software shall provide 13 a search function for educational programs; 14 (F) Use course transfer software to support 15 both in-state and out-of-state transfer students. The 16 17 software shall be common across each community college and the University of Wyoming and shall provide a common database 18 19 that provides identification and reconciliation of 20 differences in curricula elements of courses with the same 21 course number;

1	(G) Use curriculum process management
2	software to facilitate and ensure consistency in curricula
3	development and streamline the transfer process between a
4	Wyoming community college and the University of Wyoming. The
5	software shall ensure that a student who completes the
6	requirements for an associate degree after transfer to the
7	University of Wyoming or other university is awarded the
8	earned degree;
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10	(H) Result in internal college or university
11	planning and student program planning with required automated
12	transfer among the community colleges and the University of
13	Wyoming. The automated transfer shall allow automatic
14	transcription of course credits among the community colleges
15	and the University of Wyoming for those credits earned through
16	the common course catalog system and within programs with
17	articulation agreements between the community colleges and
18	the University of Wyoming.

20	Section 2.
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22	(a) Four hundred seventy thousand dollars (\$470,000.00)
23	is appropriated from the general fund to the community college

1 commission for one (1) at-will contract employee and for

2 contract services necessary to implement this act. The

3 appropriation made under this subsection is for the period

4 beginning July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020.

5 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, these funds shall

6 not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any

7 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this

8 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,

9 2020.

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11 is appropriated two hundred forty-five (b) There 12 thousand dollars (\$245,000.00) from the general fund to the community college commission for one (1) at-will contract 13 employee and for contract services necessary to implement 14 15 this act. The appropriation made under this subsection is for 16 the period from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. Notwithstanding 17 any other provision of law, these funds shall not be 18 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any 19 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this 20 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,

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2021.

1 hundred thirty-seven thousand (C) Eight dollars 2 (\$837,000.00) is appropriated from the general fund to the 3 community college commission. Of this appropriation, two 4 hundred two thousand dollars (\$202,000.00) is appropriated for transcript consumption licensing, installation and 5 training required to implement this act and six hundred 6 thirty-five thousand dollars (\$635,000.00) is appropriated 7 8 for purposes of procuring electronic course catalog software 9 and curriculum process management software. Appropriations 10 made under this subsection are for the period from the effective date of this act to June 30, 2022. Notwithstanding 11 12 any other provision of law, these funds shall not be 13 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds 14 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 15 16 2022.

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(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the community college commission shall include in its exception budget request for the biennial budget period commencing July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2022 additional appropriations necessary to carry out the purposes of this act.

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1 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon

2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as

3 provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
