1 AN ACT relating to elections; modifying requirements for 2 recognition of minor political parties and provisional parties; specifying requirements for nominations by petition; 3 4 and providing for an effective date. 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 6 7 8 Section **1.** W.S. 22-1-102(a)(xviii) and (xxv), 9 22-4-402(d) and 22-5-304 are amended to read: 10 11 22-1-102. Definitions. 12 13 (a) The definitions contained in this chapter apply to 14 words and phrases used in this Election Code and govern the 15 construction of those words and phrases unless they are

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specifically modified by the context in which they appear. As
used in this Election Code:

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4 (xviii) "Minor political party" means a political 5 organization whose candidate for any one (1) of the offices 6 of the United States house of representatives, governor or 7 secretary of state, received not less than two percent (2%) 8 one percent (1%) nor more than ten percent (10%) of the total 9 votes cast for that office in the most recent general 10 election;

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12 (xxv) "Provisional party" means a political organization which has filed a legally valid petition as 13 provided under article 4 of chapter 4 of this code. 14 The 15 filing of a legally valid petition entitles the provisional 16 party to participate in the next general election. If the 17 provisional party's candidate for any one (1) of the offices of the United States house of representatives, governor or 18 19 secretary of state, receives not less than two percent (2%) 20 one percent (1%) of the total votes cast for that office in 21 that election, the provisional party does not lose party 22 status;

Petition; form; validity. 2 3 (d) To be valid, a petition shall contain the names and 4 signatures of registered electors equal in number to not less 5 than two percent (2%) one percent (1%) of the total number of votes cast for the office of United States house of 6 representative representatives in the last general election. 7 8 9 22-5-304. Qualifications and of signers number 10 required. 11 12 (a) For a statewide partisan office, a petition shall 13 be signed by registered electors, resident in the state and 14 eligible to vote for the petitioner, numbering not less than 15 two percent (2%) one percent (1%) of the total number of votes 16 cast for representative in congress in the last general 17 election for the entire state. 18 19 (b) For a countywide partisan office, a petition shall 20 be signed by registered electors, resident in the county and 21 eligible to vote for the petitioner, numbering not less than 22 two percent (2%) one percent (1%) of the total number of votes

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cast for representative in congress in the last general
election for the entire county.

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4 (c) For a district partisan election, a petition shall be signed by registered electors, resident in the district 5 and eligible to vote for the petitioner, numbering not less 6 than two percent (2%) one percent (1%) of the total number of 7 8 votes cast for the office in that particular district in the last general election. If a district's boundaries have 9 10 changed since the last general election, then the required 11 number of petition signatures shall not be less than two 12 percent (2%) one percent (1%) of the number of registered voters in the current district boundaries at the close of day 13 14 on the day immediately preceding the primary election. 15 16 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2019.
