## A JOINT RESOLUTION

for

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing to amend the Wyoming

2 Constitution; imposing term limits on the offices of state

3 senator and state representative, the governor, secretary of

4 state, treasurer, auditor and superintendent of public

5 instruction; and providing a ballot statement.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING,

8 two-thirds of all the members of the two houses, voting

9 separately, concurring therein:

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11 Section 1. The following proposal to amend Wyoming

12 Constitution, Article 3, Section 2 and Article 4, Sections 2

13 and 11 is proposed for submission to the electors of the State

14 of Wyoming at the next general election for approval or

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1 rejection to become valid as a part of the Constitution if

2 ratified by a majority of the electors at the election:

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4 Article 3, Section 2. Members' terms and 5 qualifications.

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7 (a) Senators shall be elected for the term of four (4) years and representatives for the term of two (2) years. The 8 senators elected at the first election shall be divided by 9 10 lot into two classes as nearly equal as may be. The seats of senators of the first class shall be vacated at the expiration 11 12 of the first two years, and of the second class at the 13 expiration of four years. No person shall be a senator who has not attained the age of twenty-five years, or a 14 15 representative who has not attained the age of twenty-one 16 years, and who is not a citizen of the United States and of 17 this state and who has not, for at least twelve months next preceding his election resided within the county or district 18 19 in which he was elected.

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(b) No person shall be eligible to serve as a senator
if the person by the end of the current term of office will
have served, or but for resignation would have served, twelve

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- 1 (12) or more years in the same senate office. No person shall
- 2 <u>be eligible to serve as a representative if the person by the</u>
- 3 <u>end of the current term of office will have served, or but</u>
- 4 for resignation would have served, ten (10) or more years in
- 5 the same house of representatives office. Any time served as
- 6 <u>a senator or representative before January 4, 2021, shall not</u>
- 7 <u>be counted for purposes of these term limits.</u>

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- 9 Article 4, Section 2. Qualifications of governor; term
- 10 limit.

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- 12 No person shall be eligible to the office of governor unless
- 13 he be the person is a citizen of the United States and a
- 14 qualified elector of the state, who has attained the age of
- 15 thirty years, and who has resided 5 years next preceding the
- 16 election within the state or territory, nor shall he the
- 17 person be eligible to any other office during the term for
- 18 which he the person was elected. No person shall be eligible
- 19 to serve as governor if the person by the end of the current
- 20 term of office will have served, or but for resignation would
- 21 <u>have served, two (2) or more terms as the governor. Any time</u>
- 22 served as the governor before January 4, 2021, shall not be
- 23 <u>counted for purposes of this term limit.</u>

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2 Article 4, Section 11. State officers; election;

3 qualifications; terms.

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5 There shall be chosen by the qualified electors of the state at the times and places of choosing members of 6 legislature, a secretary of state, auditor, treasurer, and 7 8 superintendent of public instruction, who shall have attained 9 the age of twenty-five (25) years respectively, shall be 10 citizens of the United States, and shall have the qualifications of state electors. They shall severally hold 11 12 their offices at the seat of government, for the term of four 13 (4) years and until their successors are elected and duly qualified. The legislature may provide for such other state 14 15 officers as are deemed necessary. No person shall be eligible 16 to serve as the secretary of state, auditor, treasurer, or superintendent of public instruction if the person by the end 17 of the current term of office will have served, or but for 18 resignation would have served, two (2) or more terms in the 19 20 same office. Any time served as secretary of state, auditor, 21 treasurer, or superintendent of public instruction before January 4, 2021, shall not be counted for purposes of these 22 23 term limits.

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2 Section 2. That the Secretary of State shall endorse

3 the following statement on the proposed amendment:

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5 The adoption of this amendment will impose term limits for

6 state senators and state representatives, the governor,

7 secretary of state, auditor, treasurer and superintendent of

8 public instruction. If a person will have served, or but for

9 resignation would have served, twelve (12) or more years in

10 the same senate office, ten (10) or more years in the same

11 house of representatives office or two (2) terms in elected

12 state executive office, the person would not be eliqible to

13 be elected or appointed again to that office. Time served in

14 the same office before January 4, 2021 would not be counted

15 for determining term limits.
