6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 35-9-203(a), 41-10-110(g) and 41-10-151
- 9 are amended to read:

- 11 35-9-203. Powers and duties of board of directors
- 12 generally; administration of finances; assessment and levy of
- 13 taxes.

1 (a) The board of directors of any fire protection 2 district is hereby authorized to enact such ordinances as may 3 be necessary to establish and operate a fire protection 4 district and shall file them with the county clerk for each county in which the district is located. The board of 5 directors of fire protection districts shall administer the 6 finances of such districts according to the provisions of the 7 8 Wyoming Uniform Municipal Fiscal Procedure Act, except that 9 an annual audit in accordance with W.S. 16-4-121 is not 10 required. Each fire protection district shall comply with the 11 provisions of W.S. 9-1-507(a)(iii). The assessor shall, at 12 the time of making the annual assessment of his county, also 13 assess the property of each fire protection district in his county and return to the county assessor at the time of 14 15 returning the assessment schedules, separate schedules listing the property of each fire protection district 16 17 assessed by him. The separate schedules shall be compiled by the county assessor, footed, and returned to the board of 18 19 county commissioners as provided for other assessment 20 schedules.

1 (g) The district shall be subject to an audit or 2 oversight of its accounts by the director of the state 3 department of audit or his designee as required by W.S. 4 9-1-507(a)(iii) or 16-4-121(f), as applicable. The board of directors shall cause an audit or other oversight to be made 5 of all financial affairs of the district during each fiscal 6 year ending June 30, during the next succeeding six (6) 7 8 months. If an audit is required, a summary of the financial 9 statement shall be certified by the person making the audit, 10 which shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the district, one (1) issue during the next succeeding two 11 (2) weeks following the audit. Except as provided in W.S. 12 13 9-1-507(d), the audit, if required, shall be made by a 14 certified public accountant, who is not otherwise employed by
