9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 Section 1. W.S. 21-2-202(a) by creating a new paragraph

12 (xxxviii), 21-3-110(a) by creating new paragraphs (xxxvii)

13 and (xxxviii), 21-3-131(b)(x), 31-5-507 by creating new

14 subsections (e) and (f) and 35-9-505(b) are amended to read:

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16 21-2-202. Duties of the state superintendent.

1 2 (a) In addition to any other duties assigned by law, 3 the state superintendent shall: 4 5 (xxxviii) In consultation with the office of homeland security, the attorney general's office, the state 6 fire marshal and the state construction department, create 7 8 model school safety and security quidelines to assist school districts in developing comprehensive safety and security 9 10 plans, as required by W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxxvii). 11 12 21-3-110. Duties of boards of trustees. 13 (a) The board of trustees in each school district 14 15 shall: 16 17 (xxxvii) Develop and annually review a comprehensive safety and security plan for all school 18 19 district facilities to maximize safety of students and staff. 20 The school district may use any portion of department of 21 education school safety and security guidelines in developing its own plan. The plan shall be submitted to the department 22 of education during the school district's accreditation 23

1 review. The plan is not a public record available for public

2	inspection under the Public Records Act, W.S. 16-4-201 et
3	seq. The plan shall, at a minimum, include the following
4	elements:
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6	(A) Intervention techniques and strategies
7	to use with students who demonstrate signs of having the
8	potential to engage in violent behavior, including
9	coordination with mental health services and social services;
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11	(B) Publicization to all school district
12	staff and students regarding the state's student and school
13	safety call center, as authorized in W.S. 9-1-603(a)(ix);
14	
15	(C) Publicization to all district staff of
16	available digital applications to alert first responders to
17	<pre>emergency situations;</pre>
18	
19	(D) A description of how the school district
20	will evaluate, procure and implement advances in school
21	safety and security technology;

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1	(E) A description of how the school district
2	will coordinate effectively with law enforcement resources;
3	
4	(F) A system to comply with the staff
5	training requirements contained in paragraph (xxxviii) of
6	this subsection.
7	
8	(xxxviii) Establish and implement a system to
9	train all school district employees on techniques to improve
10	school safety and security in the event of a violent intruder
11	attack. The training shall be based on a nationally recognized
12	program in school safety and security training. The system
13	shall include methods to:

15	(A) Recognize a violent intruder attack has
16	commenced;
17	
18	(B) Clearly and directly notify other
19	individuals within a school and law enforcement officials
20	that a violent intruder attack has commenced;
21	
22	(C) Safely and strategically evacuate during
23	a violent intruder attack;

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2	(D) Barricade or otherwise secure a room or
3	other portion of a school facility during a violent intruder
4	attack;

6	(E) Use noise, movement, distance,
7	distraction and subterfuge to interrupt a violent intruder
8	attack.

13	(b) Each district shall establish and maintain minimum
14	standards for the operation of school buses, including:

16	(x) Effective school year 2016-2017, and each
17	school year thereafter, all school buses transporting
18	students to and from school and to and from student
19	activities, as defined under W.S. 21-13-320(b)(i) and (ii),
20	shall be equipped with an external video system and may be
21	equipped with an internal video system. Equipment
22	specifications shall be prescribed by rule and regulation of
23	the department. Recordings or images from a video system

1 <u>installed under this paragraph shall not be a public record</u>

2 <u>under the Public Records Act, W.S. 16-4-201 et seq. Recordings</u>

3 or images may be entered into evidence for a violation of

4 W.S. 31-5-507(a) and may be discoverable for criminal

5 actions.

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7 31-5-507. Meeting or passing stopped school bus;

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10 (e) When a recording or image from a video system

11 installed under W.S. 21-3-131(b)(x) evidences that a vehicle

12 has been engaged in a violation of subsection (a) of this

13 section and the identity of the driver of the vehicle is

14 unknown, the person who registered the vehicle shall be fined

one hundred dollars (\$100.00). A certificate, based on

16 inspection of recorded images produced by an external video

17 system equipped on a school bus pursuant to W.S.

18 21-3-131(b)(x) and sworn to or affirmed by a law enforcement

19 officer shall be prima facie evidence of the facts contained

20 <u>in it.</u>

22 (f) It shall be a defense to enforcement of a fine

23 issued under subsection (e) of this section that the person

1 who registered the vehicle and was issued the fine was not

2 operating the vehicle and did not provide permission to the

3 <u>driver of the vehicle to operate the vehicle at the time of</u>

4 the violation.

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6 35-9-505. Applicability; fire and safety drills

required in schools; supervision of drills.

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9 In every public and private school in Wyoming, 10 there shall be a fire drill at least once every month. Safety drills may be used in lieu of fire drills if approved by and 11 12 coordinated with the local fire department provided fire drills are conducted at each school not less than four (4) 13 times during any one (1) academic year and further provided 14 the school's fire alarm is tested at each fire or safety 15 16 drill. A safety drill includes any organized response to a 17 potential threat to the health and safety of the student population and drills contemplated by a school district's 18 19 comprehensive safety and security plan developed in 20 accordance with W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxxvii). The 21 administration shall supervise and administer this subsection and shall determine the types of safety drills appropriate 22 for each school. In localities where a paid fire department 23

1 is maintained, a fire department member shall be requested to

2 be in attendance at each fire or safety drill conducted within

3 a school for the purpose of instruction and constructive

4 criticism.

6 Section 2.

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8 There is appropriated one hundred thousand dollars (a) 9 (\$100,000.00) from the school foundation program account to 10 the department of education. This appropriation shall only be expended for purposes of assisting school districts to 11 12 provide safety and security training to school district 13 staff. The department shall endeavor to provide funding to as many school districts as possible. The appropriation provided 14 in this section shall be for the period beginning July 1, 15 16 2019 and ending June 30, 2020. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be transferred 17 18 or expended for any other purposes and any unexpended funds 19 shall revert to the school foundation program account on July 20 1, 2020. The department's standard budget request for fiscal 21 years 2021-2022 shall include a similar appropriation request. 22

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1 (b) By July 1, 2019, a school district may apply to the

2 department for financial assistance to provide safety and

3 security training to school district staff. Application shall

4 be on a form and in a manner prescribed by the department.

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6 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2019.
