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13 **9-2-1028.** Definitions.

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15 (a) As used in this act:

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1 (vi) "Resident firm" means a firm that: 2 3 4 (A) Possesses a physical office within the 5 state that is staffed by persons employed in the state; and 6 7 (B) Acknowledges in the firm's current 8 statement of qualifications or application that if selected for the project, the firm will perform at least fifty percent 9 10 (50%) of the contract for professional services using staff 11 or contractors employed in the state. 12 (vi)(vii) "This act" means W.S. 9-2-1027 through 13 14 9-2-1033. 15 16 9-2-1031. Selection procedures. 17 18 For each proposed project, the (a) principal 19 representative of the agency for which the project is proposed 20 shall evaluate current statements of qualifications and 21 performance data of firms on file with the department or the agency, together with any applications submitted by other 22

qualified firms, and shall select not less than three (3)

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1	firms	considered	qualified	to	perform	the	required

2 professional services. Consideration in each selection

3 process by the principal representative shall be based upon

4 the ability of professional personnel, past performance,

5 willingness to meet time requirements, location, residency

6 <u>including whether the firm is a resident firm as defined by</u>

7 this act, current and projected work loads, the volume of

8 work previously awarded to the firm by the agency, and the

9 equitable distribution of contracts among qualified firms.

10 The agency shall provide a complete description of the work

11 to the firms selected. These firms shall submit an unpriced

12 proposal to do the work. For purposes of this subsection,

13 residency does not require satisfaction of the elements

14 contained in W.S. 16-6-101(a)(i).

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16 Section 2. This act shall only apply to the procurement

17 of professional services on or after July 1, 2019.

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19 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2019.
