1 occupied structure or vehicle, or separately secured or occupied portion thereof, with intent to commit theft and: 2 3 4 (i) Commits no theft or commits a theft of 5 property with a value of less than one thousand dollars 6 (\$1,000.00) in the course of committing the crime; 7 8 (ii) Did not enter with intent to commit a felony 9 and committs no felony in the course of committing the crime; 10 11 (iii) The building, structure or vehicle was not 12 locked and was not in fact occupied at the time of entry; and 13 14 (iv) The building, structure or vehicle was not designed or adapted for overnight accommodation. 15 16 17 (f) Burglary for minor theft is a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, a 18 19 fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or 20 both. 21
