## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to elections; amending nomination procedures

- 2 for major party candidates, minor party candidates and
- 3 independent candidates as specified; repealing provisions
- 4 related to the nomination of independent candidates; making
- 5 conforming amendments; requiring rulemaking; and providing
- 6 for effective dates.

15 **22-1-102. Definitions.** 

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1 The definitions contained in this chapter apply to (a) 2 words and phrases used in this Election Code and govern the 3 construction of those words and phrases unless they are 4 specifically modified by the context in which they appear. As used in this Election Code: 5 6 7 (liii) "Candidate" means any person who knowingly seeks nomination or election to public office by: 8 9 10 (A) Filing an application for nomination by primary election, nomination by political party convention or 11 by petition for nomination; 12 13 14 22-4-303. Nomination of candidates. 15 16 (a) Minor parties may shall nominate candidates to be 17 placed on the general election ballot only by party convention. Under no circumstances shall a minor political 18 19 party nominate by the primary election process. 20 (b) The primary election of minor political parties 21 shall be held at the same time and at the same polling places 22 as the primary election of major political parties and shall 23

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be conducted by the same election officials. Each minor

Certification of candidates nominated; 2 printing of names. 3 4 Not less than sixty (60) days before each general election 5 the secretary of state shall transmit to each county clerk under party headings a certified list of the name and address 6 of each person nominated by primary election as indicated by 7 8 the state canvass, the name of each person nominated by 9 provisional or minor party convention, the name of each 10 independent candidate qualifying for nomination by petition, 11 filing a petition for nomination under W.S. 22-5-301(a) and 12 the office sought. The names of these candidates shall be printed on the official ballot of the general election. 13 14 15 22-6-117. Order of listing offices in partisan 16 elections. 17 The major and minor party primary and general 18 19 partisan election ballots shall contain the offices to be 20 voted on in the following order: 21 22 22-6-118. Primary ballot colors.

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1 (a) The primary ballot of political parties shall be 2 printed on the following colored paper or on paper with the 3 following color demarcation as provided by rule 4 regulation of the secretary of state: 5 (iv) Additional major <u>and minor</u> parties - A 6 7 different color for each major and minor party. 8 9 22-6-119. Format of primary ballot. 10 (a) The primary ballot of each major and minor 11 12 political party shall be printed in substantial compliance 13 with this format: 14 (i) Across the top shall be printed "Official 15 16 Primary Election Ballot followed by the name of the major or 17 minor political party; 18 19 **Section 2.** W.S. 22-5-304, 22-5-305 and 22-5-308 are 20 repealed. 21 22 Section 3. The secretary of state shall promulgate all

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rules necessary to implement the provisions of this act.

1 2 Section 4. 3 4 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this act is effective July 1, 2019. 5 6 (b) Section 3 of this act is effective immediately upon 7 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as 8 provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution. 9 10
