for

1 AN ACT relating to trade and commerce; creating the medical

2 digital innovation sandbox; authorizing innovative medical

3 digital assessment products and services as specified;

4 authorizing limited waivers from specified statutes and rules

5 under certain conditions; establishing standards and

6 procedures for sandbox applications and operations; requiring

7 criminal history background checks; creating an account;

8 requiring a consumer protection bond; requiring the adoption

9 of rules; and providing for an effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a 9 10 person who makes an innovative medical digital assessment product or service available to consumers in the medical 11 12 digital innovation sandbox may be granted a waiver from 13 specified requirements imposed by statute or rule, or portions thereof, if these statutes or rules do not currently 14 permit the product or service to be made available to 15 16 consumers. A waiver under this subsection shall be no broader 17 than necessary to accomplish the purposes and standards set forth in this act, as determined by the department or the 18 19 appropriate licensing board or authority under the chapters 20 listed in this subsection. The statutes within the following chapters of title 33 of the Wyoming statutes, and the rules 21 adopted under them, or portions thereof, may be waived by the 22 23 department and the appropriate licensing boards or

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1 (b) A person who makes an innovative medical digital 2 assessment product or service available to consumers in the 3 medical digital innovation sandbox is: 4 (i) Not immune from civil damages for acts and 5 omissions relating to this act; and 6 7 8 (ii) Subject to all criminal laws. 9 10 (c) The department may refer suspected violations of 11 law relating to this act to appropriate state or federal 12 agencies for investigation, prosecution, civil penalties and 13 other appropriate enforcement actions. 14 15 40-28-103. Medical digital innovation sandbox 16 application; standards for approval; consumer protection 17 bond. 18 19 (a) A person shall apply to the department to make an 20 innovative medical digital assessment product or service available to consumers in the medical digital innovation 21 sandbox, based on the licensing board or authority that 22

administers the statute or rule, or portion thereof, for which

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licensing board or authority that does not administer the
statute or rule for which a waiver is sought, the receiving
board or authority shall forward the application to the
correct board or authority. The person shall specify in an
application the statutory or rule requirements for which a

a waiver is sought. If an application is filed with a

7 waiver is sought and the reasons why these requirements

8 prohibit the innovative medical digital assessment product or

9 service from being made available to consumers. The

10 application shall also contain the elements required for

11 authorization which are set forth in subsection (f) of this

12 section. The department shall, by rule, prescribe a method of

13 application.

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15 (b) A business entity making an application under this 16 section shall be a domestic corporation or other organized 17 domestic entity with a physical presence, other than that of 18 a registered office or agent, in Wyoming.

20 (c) Before an employee applies on behalf of an 21 institution, firm or other entity intending to make an 22 innovative medical digital assessment product or service 23 available through the medical digital innovation sandbox, the

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- 1 employee shall obtain the consent of the institution, firm or
- 2 entity before filing an application under this section.

- 4 (d) The individual filing an application under this
- 5 section and the individuals who are substantially involved in
- 6 the development, operation or management of the innovative
- 7 medical digital assessment product or service shall, if
- 8 requested by the department as a condition of the application,
- 9 submit to a criminal history background check pursuant to
- 10 W.S. 7-19-201.

- 12 (e) An application made under this section shall be
- 13 accompanied by a fee of five hundred dollars (\$500.00).
- 14 The fee shall be deposited into the medical digital
- innovation account as provided in W.S. 40-28-104.

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- 17 (f) The department shall authorize or deny a medical
- 18 digital innovation sandbox application in writing within
- 19 ninety (90) days of receiving the application. The department
- 20 and the person who has made an application may jointly agree
- 21 to extend the time beyond ninety (90) days. The department
- 22 may impose conditions on any authorization, consistent with
- 23 this act. In deciding to authorize or deny an application

1 under this subsection, the department shall consider each of

2 the following:

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4 (i) The nature of the innovative medical digital

5 assessment product or service proposed to be made available

6 to consumers in the sandbox, including all relevant technical

7 details;

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9 (ii) The potential risk to consumers and methods

10 which will be used to protect consumers and resolve complaints

11 during the sandbox period;

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13 (iii) A prototyping, use case or scaling plan

14 proposed by the person, including a statement of arranged

15 capital;

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17 (iv) Whether the person has the necessary

18 personnel, adequate medical digital and technical expertise

19 and a sufficient plan to test, monitor and assess the

20 innovative medical digital assessment product or service;

(v) Whether any person substantially involved in 2 the development, operation or management of the innovative 3 medical digital assessment product or service has: 4 (A) Been convicted of, or is currently under 5 investigation for, fraud, state or federal securities 6 7 violations; 8 9 (B) Had any professional license revoked or 10 suspended; or 11 12 (C) Any other past criminal conduct the department deems relevant. 13 14 (g) If an application is authorized under subsection 15 16 (f) of this section, the department shall specify the 17 statutory or rule requirements, or portions thereof, for which a waiver is granted and the length of the initial 18 19 sandbox period. The department shall also post notice of the 20 approval of a sandbox application under this subsection, a 21 summary of the innovative medical digital assessment product or service and the contact information of the person making 22

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1 the product or service available through the sandbox on the

2 internet website of the department.

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4 (h) A person authorized under subsection (f) of this section to enter into the medical digital innovation sandbox 5 6 shall post a consumer protection bond with the department as security for potential losses suffered by consumers. The bond 7 8 amount shall be determined by the department in an amount not 9 less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) and shall be 10 commensurate with the risk profile of the innovative medical digital assessment product or service. The department may 11 12 require that a bond under this subsection be increased or decreased at any time based on risk profile. Unless a bond is 13 W.S. 40-28-108(b)(ii), the department 14 enforced under shall cancel or allow the bond to expire two (2) years after 15

1	(b)	Before	a	consumer	purchases	or	enters	into	an

2 agreement to receive an innovative medical digital assessment

3 product or service through the medical digital innovation

4 sandbox, the person making the product or service available

5 shall provide a written statement of the following to the

6 consumer:

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8 (i) The name and contact information of the person

9 making the product or service available to consumers;

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11 (ii) That the product or service has been

12 authorized to be made available to consumers for a temporary

13 period by the department and the appropriate licensing board

14 or authority, as applicable, under the laws of Wyoming;

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16 (iii) That the state of Wyoming does not endorse

17 the product or service and is not subject to liability for

18 losses or damages caused by the product or service;

20 (iv) That the product or service is undergoing

21 testing, may not function as intended and may entail medical

22 assessment risk;

1 (v) That the person making the product or service 2 available to consumers is not immune from civil liability for 3 any losses or damages caused by the product or service; 4 5 (vi) The expected end date of the sandbox period; 6 7 (vii) The name and contact information of the 8 department and board or authority, as applicable, and 9 notification that suspected legal violations, complaints or 10 other comments related to the product or service may be 11 submitted to the department; 12 13 (viii) Any other statements or disclosures 14 required by rule of the department which are necessary to 15 further the purposes of this act. 16 17 (c) A person authorized to make an innovative medical digital assessment product or service available to consumers 18 in the medical digital innovation sandbox shall maintain 19 20 comprehensive records relating to the innovative medical 21 digital assessment product or service. The person shall keep these records for not less than five (5) years after the 22

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1 conclusion of the sandbox period. The department may specify

2 further records requirements under this subsection by rule.

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4 (d) The department or licensing board or authority, as examine the records maintained 5 applicable, may under subsection (c) of this section at any time, with or without 6 notice. All direct and indirect costs of an examination 7 8 conducted under this subsection shall be paid by the person 9 making the innovative medical digital assessment product or 10 service available in the medical digital innovation sandbox. Records made available under this subsection shall be 11 12 confidential and shall not be subject to disclosure under the Wyoming Public Records Act but may be released to appropriate 13

state and federal agencies for the purposes of investigation.

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16 (e) Unless granted an extension pursuant to W.S. 17 40-28-107, not less than thirty (30) days before the 18 conclusion of the sandbox period, a person who makes an 19 innovative medical digital assessment product or service 20 available in the medical digital innovation sandbox shall 21 provide written notification to consumers regarding the conclusion of the sandbox period and shall not make the 22 23 product or service available to any new consumers after the

1 conclusion of the sandbox period until legal authority

2 outside of the sandbox exists to make the product or service

3 available to consumers. The person shall wind down operations

4 with existing consumers within sixty (60) days after the

5 conclusion of the sandbox period, except that, after the

6 sixtieth day, the person may:

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8 (i) Collect and receive money owed to the person

9 and service loans made by the person, based on agreements

10 with consumers made before the conclusion of the sandbox

11 period;

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13 (ii) Take necessary legal action; and

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15 (iii) Take other actions authorized by the

16 department by rule which are not inconsistent with this

17 subsection.

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19 (f) The department may enter into agreements with

20 state, federal or foreign regulatory agencies to allow

21 persons who make an innovative medical digital assessment

22 product or service available in Wyoming through the medical

23 digital innovation sandbox to make their products or services

1 available in other jurisdictions and to allow persons

2 operating in similar medical digital innovation sandboxes in

3 other jurisdictions to make innovative medical digital

4 assessment products and services available in Wyoming under

5 the standards of this act.

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7 40-28-106. Revocation or suspension of medical digital

8 innovation sandbox authorization.

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10 (a) The department may, by order, revoke or suspend

11 authorization granted to a person under W.S. 40-28-103(f) if:

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13 (i) The person has violated or refused to comply

14 with this act or any lawful rule, order or decision adopted

15 by the department;

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17 (ii) A fact or condition exists that, if it had

18 existed or become known at the time of the medical digital

19 innovation sandbox application, would have warranted denial

20 of the application or the imposition of material conditions;

1 (iii) A material error, false statement, misrepresentation or material omission was made in the 2 3 medical digital innovation sandbox application; or 4 5 (iv) After consultation with the person, continued testing of the innovative medical digital assessment product 6 7 or service would: 8 9 (A) Be likely to harm consumers; or 10 11 (B) No longer serve the purposes of this act 12 because of the medical digital or operational failure of the product or service. 13 14 (b) Written notification of a revocation or suspension 15 16 order made under subsection (a) of this section shall be 17 served using any means authorized by law, and if the notice 18 relates to a suspension, include any conditions or remedial 19 action which shall be completed before the suspension will be 20 lifted by the department. 21 40-28-107. Extension of sandbox period. 22

1 (a) A person granted authorization under W.S.

2 40-28-103(f) may apply for an extension of the initial sandbox

3 period for not more than twelve (12) additional months. An

4 application for an extension shall be made not later than

5 sixty (60) days before the conclusion of the initial sandbox

6 period specified by the department. The department shall

7 approve or deny the application for extension in writing not

8 later than thirty-five (35) days before the conclusion of the

9 initial sandbox period. An application for extension by a

10 person shall cite one (1) of the following reasons as the

11 basis for the application and provide all relevant supporting

12 information that:

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14 (i) Statutory or rule amendments are necessary to

15 conduct business in Wyoming on a permanent basis;

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17 (ii) An application for a license or other

18 authorization required to conduct business in Wyoming on a

19 permanent basis has been filed with the appropriate office

20 and approval is currently pending.

1 40-28-108. Rules and orders; enforcement of bond;

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5 (a) The department shall adopt rules to implement this

6 act.

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8 (b) The department may issue:

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10 (i) All necessary orders to enforce this act,

11 including ordering the payment of restitution, and enforce

12 these orders in any court of competent jurisdiction;

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14 (ii) An order under paragraph (i) of this

15 subsection to enforce the bond posted under W.S.

16 40-28-103(h), or a portion of this bond, and use proceeds

17 from the bond to offset losses suffered by consumers as a

18 result of an innovative medical digital assessment product or

19 service.

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21 (c) All actions of the department under this act shall

22 be subject to the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act.

1 **Section 2.** W.S. 7-19-106(a) by creating a new paragraph 2 (xxx) and 7-19-201(a) by creating a new paragraph (xxvi) are 3 amended to read: 4 7-19-106.
