A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to tobacco; specifying the sellers who are

2 retailers of tobacco products for purposes of prohibiting

3 sales to minors; providing for an injunction of retailers;

4 specifying tobacco products for taxation purposes; specifying

5 that tobacco products include electronic cigarettes, vapor

6 material and additional accessories; increasing the tax rate

7 on cigarettes; and providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 14-3-301(a)(iii), 14-3-302(e),

12 39-18-101(a) by creating new paragraphs (ix) through (xi) and

13 39-18-104(a)(i), (ii), (b)(i) and (ii) are amended to read:

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15 **14-3-301. Definitions.**

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1 (a) As used in this article:

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(iii) "Retailer" means a business of any kind at
a specific location that sells tobacco products to a user or
consumer and includes a seller who does not have a physical
presence in this state if the seller sells tobacco products
to a user or consumer in this state;

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9 14-3-302. Prohibited sales or delivery.

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11 In addition to the penalties under paragraph (e) 12 (d)(iii) of this section, any person violating subsection (c) 13 of this section for a third or subsequent time within a two 14 (2) year period may be subject to an injunction. The department of revenue or the district attorney of the county 15 16 in which the offense occurred, may petition the district court for an injunction to prohibit the sale of tobacco in the 17 18 establishment where the violation occurred or, if the 19 retailer does not have a physical presence in this state, for 20 an injunction prohibiting sales of tobacco products from that 21 retailer into this state. If the court finds that the 22 respondent in the action has violated the provisions of subsection (c) of this section for a third or subsequent time 23

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1	within a two (2) year period and may continue to violate such
2	provisions, it may grant an injunction prohibiting the
3	respondent from selling tobacco products in the establishment
4	where the violation occurred or, if the retailer does not
5	have a physical presence in this state, an injunction
6	prohibiting sales of tobacco products from that retailer into
7	this state for a period of not more than one hundred eighty
8	(180) days. For the purposes of this subsection, multiple
9	violations occurring before the petition for the injunction
10	is filed shall be deemed part of the violation for which the
11	injunction is sought. If the person against whom the
12	injunction is sought operates multiple, geographically
13	separate establishments, the injunction shall apply only to
14	the establishment where the violation occurred. The
15	injunction shall prohibit all sales of tobacco products in
16	the establishment where the violation occurred, regardless of
17	any change in ownership or management of the establishment
18	that is not a bona fide, arms length transaction while the
19	injunction is in effect.

21 **39-18-101.** Definitions.

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23 (a) As used in this article:

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2 (ix) "Electronic cigarette" means any device that 3 can be used to deliver aerosolized or vaporized nicotine to 4 the person using the device and includes a component, part 5 and accessory of the device and any vapor material intended 6 to be aerosolized or vaporized during the use of the device. "Electronic cigarette" includes, without limitation, any 7 8 electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, 9 electronic hooka, vapor pen or any similar product or device. 10 "Electronic cigarette" does not include a battery or battery charger if sold separately from the device and does not 11 12 include any product regulated as a drug or device by the 13 United States food and drug administration under subchapter V of the Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act; 14

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(x) "Tobacco product" means any product containing tobacco or nicotine and is intended for human consumption or is likely to be consumed, whether smoked, heated, chewed, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled or ingested including, without limitation, a cigarette, cigar, pipe tobacco, chewing tobacco, snuff or snus. "Tobacco product" includes electronic cigarettes and any component or accessory used in the consumption of a tobacco product including filters, rolling

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    papers, pipes and vapor material. "Tobacco product" does not
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    include any product regulated as a drug or device by the
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    <u>United States food and drug administration under subchapter</u>
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    V of the Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act;
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              (xi) "Vapor material" means any liquid solution or
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    other material containing nicotine that is depleted as an
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    electronic cigarette is used. "Vapor material" includes
    liquid solution or other material containing nicotine that is
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    sold with or inside a disposable or reusable electronic
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    cigarette.
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         39-18-104. Taxation rate.
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              There is levied and shall be collected and paid to
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    the department an excise tax upon the sale of each cigarette
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    sold by wholesalers as follows:
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              (i) Six-tenths of a cent ($.006) One and one-tenth
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    <u>cents ($.011)</u>; and
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              (ii) Two and four-tenths cents ($.024) Four and
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    four-tenths cents ($.044).
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1 2 (b) There is levied and shall be paid to the department 3 an excise tax upon the use or storage by consumers of 4 cigarettes in Wyoming but only if the tax imposed by 5 subsection (a) of this section has not been paid as follows: 6 7 (i) Six-tenths of a cent (\$.006) One and one-tenth 8 <u>cents (\$.011)</u>; and 9 10 (ii) Two and four-tenths cents (\$.024) Four and 11 four-tenths cents (\$.044). 12 13 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2019. 14
