1 AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; authorizing digital 2 driver's licenses and identification cards; establishing 3 fees; authorizing electronic notice relating to expirations, 4 renewals and other transactions; clarifying which credentials 5 may be possessed; providing definitions; providing rulemaking 6 authority; making conforming amendments; and providing for an 7 effective date.

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(d) A license issued under subsection (a) of this 5 section may include a digital driver's license. A digital 6 driver's license may be issued upon request of a licensee and 7 8 payment of the required fee. No digital driver's license shall be issued unless the applicant holds the corresponding 9 10 physical driver's license or unless the corresponding physical driver's license is issued simultaneously. The 11 12 department may digitally cancel, suspend or revalidate a 13 digital driver's license on the occasions that a physical driver's license would be taken possession of, cancelled, 14 suspended, returned or reinstated, as appropriate. A digital 15 16 driver's license shall be designed:

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18 (i) To protect to the maximum extent practicable
19 the digital driver's license holder's privacy, including the
20 use of privacy enhancing technologies or other security
21 methods as deemed appropriate by the department;

2	license holder to relinquish possession of the portable
3	electronic device in which the digital driver's license is
4	stored to present the digital driver's license.

7	
8	Every licensee shall have his driver's license in his
9	immediate possession at all times when driving a motor vehicle
10	and shall display the license upon demand of any judicial
11	officer, municipal court judge, any officer or agent of the
12	division or any police officer as defined in W.S.
13	31-5-102(a)(xxxiii). However, no person charged with
14	violating this section shall be convicted if he produces in
15	court a driver's license previously issued to him and valid
16	at the time of his arrest. For the purposes of this section
17	"display" <u>of a physical license</u> means the surrender of his
18	the physical license to the demanding officer. After
19	examination the officer shall immediately return the license
20	to the licensee except as provided in W.S. 31-5-1205(k). For
21	purposes of this section "display" of a digital driver's
22	license means that a licensee may provide access to the
23	digital driver's license on the licensee's portable

12	notification for license extension pursuant to subsection (f)
13	of this section to the last known address of an eligible
14	licensee, or notify by electronic means if the eligible
15	licensee has consented to receive notices electronically,
16	within one hundred twenty (120) days prior to license
17	expiration. The license extension application shall be
18	returned to the division with a postmark at least thirty (30)
19	days prior to before the license expiration date or, if the
20	eligible licensee has consented to receive notices

Surrender and return of license. 9 10 11 (a) Upon cancelling, suspending or revoking a license, 12 the division shall require that the any physical license be 13 surrendered to the division and that any digital driver's license be cancelled or suspended. 14 15 16 (b) Any person whose license has been cancelled, suspended or revoked shall immediately return his physical 17 license to the division. 18 19 20 (c) At the end of a period of a suspension, the division 21 shall return a license to the licensee, if unexpired, and revalidate any digital driver's license, if applicable. 22 23

1 31-7-137. Proof of receipt of notice or order; change 2 of address or name.

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4 (a) Evidence that a notice or order from the division under this act was mailed to the last known address of a 5 6 person is prima facie proof the person received the notice or order five (5) days after the notice or order was mailed. As 7 used in this section, "last known address" means the address 8 on file with the division. Evidence that a notice or order 9 10 from the division was sent by electronic means to the person's last known address, if the person has consented to receive 11 12 notices electronically, is prima facie proof that the person 13 received the notice or order one (1) day after the notice or 14 order was sent electronically.

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16 A person licensed under this act shall notify the (b) division in writing within ten (10) days of any change of his 17 address or name. Notification to the division may be by 18 19 electronic means if the division has made electronic 20 notification available and if the person opts to use 21 electronic means. The 12 13 application shall state the registrant's full legal name, social security number, date of birth and any other 14 identifying data the department may require and shall be 15 The identification 16 signed and verified by the applicant. 17 card shall at the applicant's request indicate that the applicant is an anatomical organ donor as provided by W.S. 18 19 35-5-205 or that the applicant has a medical alert designation 20 as provided for in W.S. 31-7-142. Before receiving an 21 identification card under this chapter a person who previously has been licensed or issued an identification card 22 in this or any other state but who does not have the 23

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credential in their possession shall complete an affidavit of
"No License/ID Card in Possession."
(c) An identification card issued under subsection (a)
of this section may include a digital identification card. A
digital identification card may be issued upon request of a
registrant and payment of the required fee. No digital
identification card shall be issued unless the applicant
holds the corresponding physical identification card or
unless the corresponding physical identification card is
issued simultaneously. A registrant may display a digital
identification card by providing access to the digital
identification card on the registrant's portable electronic
device. No law enforcement or judicial officer demanding
display of a registrant's digital identification card for any
identification verification purpose shall take custody of the
registrant's portable electronic device. Display of a digital
identification card shall not serve as consent to search the
registrant's portable electronic device. A digital
identification card shall be designed in accordance with
W.S. 31-7-115(d)(i) and (ii). Nothing in this section shall
be construed to require a person to accept a digital
identification card or otherwise require the purchase of

2	card.
