- 14 party affiliation, or sign an application for change of

affiliation in accordance with W.S. 22-5-214, before he may 1 2 receive a party ballot. An elector may vote only the 3 nonpartisan ballot and if so, is not required to declare 4 his party affiliation. Requesting a partisan primary 5 election ballot constitutes a declaration of affiliation. A change in declaration of party affiliation 6 shall conform to W.S. 22-5-214 and be entered on the poll 7 8 list by the election judge. 9 10 22-5-214. Change in party affiliation. 11 12 (a) An elector may change his party affiliation, except as otherwise specified in subsection (b) of this 13 section, by completing an application signed before a 14 notarial officer or election official and filing it with 15 16 the county clerk not less than fourteen (14) days before the primary election or at the polls on the day of the 17 primary or general election, or when requesting an absentee 18

(b) An elector may change his party affiliation <u>from</u>
