1 AN ACT relating to water; amending the instream flow

2 application process; requiring a hearing and providing for

3 an effective date.

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5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 41-3-1003(b) and (c) and 41-3-1004(a)
- 8 and (b) are amended to read:

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- 10 41-3-1003. Game and fish commission; construction of
- 11 measuring devices; recommendations; permits; fees and
- 12 costs.

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- 14 (b) The state game and fish commission may report
- 15 <u>recommend</u> to the water development commission annually
- 16 those specific segments of stream which the game and fish

commission considers to have the most critical need for
instream flows. The game and fish commission shall identify
the points on the stream at which the need for instream
flows begins and ends, the time of year when the flows are
most critical and a detailed description of the minimum
amount of water necessary to provide adequate instream
flows. Upon receiving a recommendation from the game and
fish commission on the need for instream flows on specific
segments of stream, the water development commission shall
file applications in the name of the state of Wyoming for
permits to appropriate water for instream flows in those
segments of stream recommended by the game and fish
commission. After submitting its recommendation to the
water development commission, the game and fish commission
shall hold a public meeting in the community closest to, or
within the same drainage as, any segments of stream for
which the game and fish commission submitted a
recommendation for instream flows. The game and fish
commission shall provide notice of the public meeting to:

(i) Landowners adjacent to any stream segment 21

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recommended for instream flows; 22

1 (ii) Owners of appropriations which divert 2 within any stream segment recommended for instream flows; 3 <u>and</u> 4 (iii) Secondary permit holders appropriating 5 stored water out of any reservoir the game and fish 6 7 commission anticipates being a source for any stream 8 segment recommended for instream flows. 9 The water development commission shall file 10 applications in the name of the state of Wyoming for 11 12 permits to appropriate water for instream flows in those segments of stream recommended by the game and fish 13 commission. Following the public meeting required by W.S. 14 41-3-1003(b) the game and fish commission shall transmit 15 any written comments received regarding the recommended 16 17 instream flow segments and the detailed written summary of the public meeting to the water development commission for 18 19 review. The state engineer shall not grant any permits to 20 appropriate or store water for instream flows prior to the game and fish commission's public meeting, receipt of 21 public comments and the public meeting summary required by 22 this subsection and prior to the completion of the study 23

- 1 provided by W.S. 41-3-1004 or prior to the hearing required
- 2 by W.S. 41-3-1006. Fees and costs of the commission
- 3 associated with permit applications and adjudication of
- 4 water rights shall be borne by the game and fish
- 5 commission.

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- 7 41-3-1004. Water development commission to determine
- 8 storage feasibility; report to the game and fish commission
- 9 and the legislature.

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- 11 (a) Immediately after permits have been applied for
- 12 After receipt of written comments and the public meeting
- 13 summary under W.S. 41-3-1003(c), the water development
- 14 commission shall determine the feasibility of providing
- 15 instream flows for the recommended segments of streams from
- 16 unappropriated direct flows or from existing storage
- 17 facilities or from new facilities. The feasibility study
- 18 shall include a determination of water necessary to
- 19 maintain or improve existing fisheries for water rights
- 20 under W.S. 41-3-1001(b) or of water necessary to provide
- 21 fisheries for water rights under W.S. 41-3-1001(a). The
- 22 feasibility study shall also include the availability of
- 23 storage sites, the estimated cost of providing any required

1	storage and such other findings and conclusions as the
2	water development commission deems appropriate. The cost of
3	any consultant and any associated costs that the water
4	development commission determines are necessary to complete
5	a feasibility study under this section shall be borne by
6	the game and fish commission. The water development
7	commission shall consult with the game and fish commission
8	prior to entering into any contract related to a
9	feasibility study under this section.
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11	(b) The water development commission shall make a
12	report its findings to the game and fish commission and to
13	the legislature outlining their findings during its next
14	general session.
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16	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2020.
