FISCAL NOTE

The fiscal impact, in the form of a potential expenditure decrease, is indeterminable.

The exact expenditure savings is undeterminable, but will be realized with the improvement in efficiencies.

The statute changes in the bill will provide three major improvements by increasing and standardizing the bonding limit to \$150,000:

- 1. Bring the values up to today's dollars;
- 2. Streamline and create standard procurement process; and
- 3. Streamline and standardization of advertising for projects.
