1 No governing body of a city or town, whether acting 2 through its governing body or by an initiative, referendum or 3 any other process, shall enact, adopt, implement or enforce 4 any policy that prohibits or restricts local officials or employees from communicating or cooperating with federal 5 law enforcement officers with regard to 6 officials or reporting immigration status information while the local 7 8 official or employee is acting within the scope of their official duties.

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11 (b) Any governing body of a city or town that acts in 12 violation of this section shall be subject to the withholding of state funding and state administered federal funding, 13 unless otherwise specifically provided by law. 14
