3	Wyoming statutes shall be authorized to serve in the
4	capacity of a medical director for any ambulance service.

7	under this section only if the person is competent to
8	monitor and assess the quality, safety and appropriateness
9	of the services provided and so long as the services being
10	monitored and assessed are within the scope of practice of

12	assistant. This section shall not apply to the extent it
13	conflicts with the Recognition of Emergency Medical
14	Services Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact Act under
15	W.S. 33-36-202.

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20	(a) An individual who holds a valid emergency medical
21	technician license issued by the division is authorized to
22	perform any act authorized by division rules, and

regulations, under written or oral authorization of a

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- 1 licensed physician or a medical director authorized by W.S.
- 2 <u>33-36-104(c)</u>, and may provide emergency medical technician
- 3 services in other states as permitted by the Recognition of
- 4 Emergency Medical Services Personnel Licensure Interstate
- 5 Compact Act, W.S. 33-36-202.

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- 7 **Section 2.** The department of health shall review and
- 8 modify its rules for consistency with this act.
