5 (i) A division of land made outside of platted 6 subdivisions for the purpose of a single gift or sale to a 7 member of the landowner's immediate family, subject to the 8 following requirements:

10 (C) The land shall have been titled in the name of the grantor, or in the name of a trust controlled 11 12 by the grantor, for a combined period prior to the division 13 of not less than five (5) years for land titled before February 27, 2019, or ten (10) years prior to the division 14 15 and for land titled on or after February 27, 2019. Parcels 16 created under this paragraph shall be titled in the name of 17 the immediate family member for whom the division is made for a period of not less than five (5) years, or for not 18 19 less than one (1) year if the parcel was created before 20 February 27, 2019, unless such the parcels are subject to limited to, 21 involuntary transfer including, but not 22 foreclosure, death, judicial sale, condemnation or 23 bankruptcy;
