A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to state funded capital construction; creating 1 accounts; providing definitions; providing appropriations for 2 purposes related to state funded capital construction; 3 4 modifying prior appropriations; making certain appropriations subject to specified terms and conditions; providing for the 5 reversion and transfer of funds; creating a subcommittee; 6 7 providing for the acceptance of gifts of real property; 8 requiring reporting; specifying funding priorities; and 9 providing for an effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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Section 1. W.S. 9-4-225 and 9-4-226 are created to read:
9-4-225. Wyoming veterans' memorial museum account.

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1 The Wyoming veterans' memorial museum account is created. The 2 account shall be administered by the military department. The 3 department may accept federal grants and other contributions, 4 grants, gifts, transfers, bequests and donations of money from any source for deposit into the account. Funds within the 5 account shall only be expended upon legislative appropriation. 6 All funds within the account shall be invested by the state 7 8 treasurer and all investment earnings from the account shall 9 be credited to the general fund. 10 11 9-4-226. Capitol square preservation account. 12 The capitol square preservation account is created. The state 13 treasurer may accept federal grants and other contributions, 14 15 grants, gifts, transfers, bequests and donations of money from 16 any source for deposit into the account. Funds within the 17 account shall only be expended upon legislative appropriation.

18 All funds within the account shall be invested by the state 19 treasurer and all investment earnings from the account shall 20 be credited to the general fund.

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7 (b) Appropriations for projects in this act remain in 8 effect until the project is completed, unless otherwise provided. The amounts appropriated for projects under this 9 10 act shall be expended only on the projects specified and any 11 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining upon completion of a project shall revert as provided by law. 12 The amounts appropriated in this act are intended to provide a maximum 13 amount for each project and shall not be construed to be an 14 15 entitlement or guaranteed amount.

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1 1. Of this other funds appropriation, one million six hundred fifty-nine 2 thousand four hundred fifty dollars (\$1,659,450.00)S13 is appropriated for 3 security fencing at the governor's residence.

5 2. Of this other funds appropriation, three million dollars 6 (\$3,000,000.00)SR is appropriated for facility remedies of concessionaires 7 within Hot Springs state park as determined by the department of state 8 parks and cultural resources.

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10 3. Of these other funds appropriations, the strategic investments and 11 projects account appropriation shall be matched in a ratio of one dollar 12 (\$1.00) from the strategic investments and projects account to one dollar 13 (\$1.00) of matching funds from the community college. Construction costs 14 shall be borne in equal amounts from the strategic investments and 15 projects account appropriation and matching funds from the community 16 college. Any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining upon completion of 17 the project shall revert to the strategic investments and projects account 18 and the community college in proportion to the contribution to the total 19 construction costs of the project.

4. The northern Wyoming community college district is authorized to expend up to five million dollars (\$5,000,000.00)S13 in other funds, matched by an equal amount of other, community college funds to acquire property, construct a construction technology center or both.

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26 5. Of this other funds appropriation, five million dollars 27 (\$5,000,000.00)S0 is appropriated from the Wyoming state penitentiary

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1 capital construction account within the strategic investments and projects 2 account. 3 4 6. Of this other funds appropriation, five million six hundred thousand 5 dollars (\$5,600,000.00)S13 is appropriated for partial demolition of the б Tonkin facility in Riverton, Wyoming and to refurbish the remaining 7 portion of the facility for future occupancy by state agencies. 8 9 7. This general fund appropriation is appropriated for capital outlay 10 expenditures associated with the chancery court within the Casper state

11 office building.

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13 8. Funds from this appropriation shall be deposited in the state 14 facilities construction account. In addition to prior appropriations from 15 the state facilities construction account, there is appropriated four 16 million dollars (\$4,000,000.00) from the state facilities construction 17 account to the state construction department for abatement activities at 18 the Wyoming life resource center.

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9. The legislature is approving level II design for northern Wyoming community college district Gillette academic center as an approved 2019 project of the Wyoming community college commission.

12	(a) The state loan and investment board shall					
13	consult with the city of Cheyenne to identify the					
14	most efficient means to construct a stormwater

This to 16 appropriation shall only be expended for purposes of 17 this subsection. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be transferred 18 19 expended for other or any purpose and any 20 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this 21 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 2020-2022. 22

1 (b) This section is effective immediately. 2 3 [WYOMING VETERANS' MEMORIAL MUSEUM] 4 5 Section 6. There is appropriated three million dollars (\$3,000,000.00) from the strategic investments and projects 6 account to the Wyoming veterans' memorial museum account. 7 8 This appropriation shall only be transferred to the Wyoming veterans' memorial museum account to the extent cash or cash 9 10 equivalent matching contributions are actually received by the 11 state in an amount equal to one dollar (\$1.00) of appropriated 12 funds from the strategic investments and projects account to 13 two dollars (\$2.00) of nonstate matching funds. At any time accumulated contributions total at least one hundred thousand 14 15 dollars (\$100,000.00) or when this strategic investments and 16 projects account appropriation is fully matched, the state 17 treasurer shall distribute matching contributions to the account. 18 Wyoming veterans' memorial museum There is 19 appropriated up to nine million dollars (\$9,000,000.00) or as 20 much thereof as is available from the Wyoming veterans' memorial museum account to the state construction department 21 22 for purposes of constructing and expanding the Wyoming 23 veterans' memorial museum.

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6	(a) The chairman of the management council of the
7	legislature shall appoint three (3) members of the management
8	council and the governor shall appoint three (3) members of

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16 (d) There is appropriated four million two hundred fifty 17 thousand dollars (\$4,250,000.00) from the capitol square preservation account to the state construction department. 18 19 The state construction department shall be the fiscal and 20 contracting agent for expenditure of this appropriation. After consultation with the subcommittee created under this 21 section, the state construction department shall expend this 22 23 appropriation for the purposes of:

The grant shall be conditioned upon receiving matching funds in an amount equal to one dollar 18 19 (\$1.00) of funds appropriated under this subsection to one 20 dollar (\$1.00) of nonstate matching funds.

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(b) The department of transportation and the highwaycommission shall prioritize funding for the construction of
