         (a) The definitions contained in this chapter apply
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    to words and phrases used in this Election Code and govern

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    specifically modified by the context in which they appear.

    As used in this Election Code:
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              (xxxix) "Acceptable identification" means:
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                  (A) For purposes of voter registration, one
    (1) of the identification documents or other proof of
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1	identity as specified by rule of the secretary of state as
2	adequate proof of the identity of a voter;

5	identification immediately before voting at a polling place
6	or absentee polling place, any of the following:

12	issued by the governing body of the Eastern Shoshone tribe

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19	(IV) A valid United States passport;

13	22-2-119. Qualified elector may vote; acceptable
14	identification requirement; provisional ballots.
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16	Except as specifically provided otherwise, a person may
17	vote only if <u>he the person</u> is a qualified elector, and only
18	in the precinct in which <u>he the person</u> resides <u>and, if</u>
19	voting in person, only if the person presents acceptable
20	identification immediately before voting at the polling
21	place or absentee polling place. If a person is unable to
22	present acceptable identification immediately before voting

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1	at the polling place or absentee polling place, the person
2	may vote by provisional ballot pursuant to W.S. 22-15-105.

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6	(a) Unless a voter is challenged pursuant to W.S.
7	22-15-101 through 22-15-109, no identification shall be
8	required when:
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10	(i) Voting in person or by mail <u>absentee ballot</u>
11	after having registered in person; or

13	(ii) Voting in person or by mail <u>absentee ballot</u>
14	after having registered by mail and having submitted a copy
15	of the person's acceptable identification, as set forth in

20	(a) A person offering to vote may be challenged for
21	the following reasons:

1 (vi) For in person voting, failure to present 2 acceptable identification immediately before voting at the 3 polling place or absentee polling place. 4 5 31-8-103. Expiration; records; new cards. б (d) The division shall send a notification for an 7 8 identification card to the last known address of every 9 eligible registrant, or notify by electronic means if the 10 eligible registrant has consented to receive notices 11 electronically, within one hundred twenty (120) days prior 12 to expiration of the registrant's identification card. The notification shall conspicuously advise registrants of the 13 requirement that in person voters present acceptable 14 identification immediately before voting at the polling 15 16 place or absentee polling place and that an identification 17 card is a form of acceptable identification. Every 18 identification card is renewable upon application and 19 payment of the required fee. As used in this section, "last 20 known address" means the address, email address or other electronic contact information, as applicable according to 21 the sending method, on file with the division. 22

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1	31-8-104. Fees.
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3	Every applicant for an identification card shall pay
4	ten dollars (\$10.00) to the department plus an additional
5	ten dollars (\$10.00) for a digital identification card if
6	applicable. <u>This fee shall be waived if the applicant</u>
7	requests an identification card that shall be used only for
8	voter identification purposes. The state treasurer shall
9	credit identification card fees to the highway fund.
10	Identification cards, including digital identification
11	cards, issued as a result of the cancellation of a license
12	under W.S. 31-7-122(a)(i) shall be issued without payment
13	of any fee.

15	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2021.
