1	(h) An account within the game and fish fund is
2	created. The portion of the revenues collected as specified
3	under W.S. 23-2-306(e) shall be deposited into the account.
4	Revenues deposited in the account created under this
5	subsection are continuously appropriated to the commission
6	and all earnings on funds in the account shall remain in
7	the account. The commission shall use revenues in the
8	account only as specified in this subsection and subject to
9	the following requirements:
10	
11	(i) Of the revenues collected, not less than
12	eighty-five percent (85%) shall be used by the commission
13	for the purchase of access easements or for other
14	agreements to provide public access to federal and state
15	and school trust lands within the state that are difficult
16	to access or inaccessible by the public for hunting and
17	fishing purposes. The commission shall notify the
18	appropriate boards of county commissioners in writing
19	before purchasing any access easements or entering into any
20	agreements under this paragraph and shall hold public
21	hearings at the request of any board of county commissions;

1	(ii) Of the revenues collected, not greater than
2	fifteen percent (15%) shall be used to provide for wildlife
3	conservation efforts related to the transportation system,
4	including signage, wildlife corridors, wildlife crossings,
5	fish passages and game fences;

7	(iii) As part of the annual report required
8	under subsection (e) of this section, the commission shall
9	report to the legislature on all expenditures pursuant to
10	this subsection during the preceding fiscal year.

12	23-2-306. Conservation stamp; exemptions.
13	
14	(a) Subject to subsections (b), (c) and (d) of this
15	section and the applicable fee under W.S. 23-1-701, each
16	sportsman licensed under W.S. 23-2-101, 23-2-107 or
17	23-2-201 shall purchase a single conservation stamp for
18	twelve dollars (\$12.00) twenty-one dollars (\$21.00) which
19	shall be valid for the time period specified in commission
20	rules not to exceed twelve (12) months. The stamp or an
21	authorization signifying purchase of the stamp shall be in
22	the possession of any person exercising rights under any
23	fishing or hunting license issued pursuant to W.S.

1	23-2-101, 23-2-107 or 23-2-201. Holders of special limited
2	fishing permits issued under W.S. 23-2-207 and holders of
3	licenses only under W.S. $23-1-302(q)$ , $23-2-101(j)(v)$ and
4	(vi), 23-2-201(d)(vi), (vii) and (ix), 23-2-201(f) and
5	23-2-201(g) are exempt from the provisions of this section
6	when exercising hunting or fishing privileges provided
7	under those specific licenses. <u>Except as provided in</u>
8	subsection (e) of this section, revenues collected from the
9	sale of each stamp under this subsection shall be deposited
10	as follows:

12	(e) Of the twenty-one dollars (\$21.00) collected
13	under subsection (a) of this section, nine dollars (\$9.00)
14	collected from the sale of each stamp shall be deposited
15	into the account created under W.S. 23-1-501(h).
