Source of revenue increase:

This bill increases fees for motor vehicle registration and drivers' licenses by \$5.00 each and distributes increases to the proposed Transportation Information Systems Account (TISA).

Assumptions:

The Department of Transportation (Department) indicated that pro-rate registration from trucks in 2020 was about one-half of motor vehicle registrations. The Department estimates that motor vehicle registrations would increase revenue by a total of \$4.2 million and that pro-rate registrations would increase revenue by a total of \$2.1 million.

The revenue increase from drivers' license fees is based on FY 2020 drivers' license fee revenues.

Source of expenditure increase:

The Department will begin working with the Department of Enterprise Technology Services (ETS) to put together the software requirements to replace the Revenue Information System (RIS). A request for purchases (RFP) will be done to find a vendor to replace the system.

Assumptions:

It is unknown how much funding will be spent each year, but the Department will award and pay the vendor as required through the replacement. The total cost of the new system is estimated at \$80 million.
