- 1 AN ACT relating to public health orders; limiting public
- 2 health orders as specified; requiring legislative
- 3 ratification of state health orders as specified; requiring
- 4 county ratification of local health orders as specified;
- 5 specifying applicability; and providing for an effective
- 6 date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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10 **Section 1**. W.S. 35-1-245 is created to read:

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12 35-1-245. Public health orders limitations;

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13 ratification.

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1 (a) No public health order issued pursuant to W.S.

 $2 \quad 35-1-240(a)(ii)$ or (iv), 35-4-103 or 35-4-112 that requires

3 the closure of public or private buildings, facilities or

4 other places or limits or forbids gatherings, shall be

5 effective for a period exceeding fifteen (15) days unless

6 the order is ratified by the legislature through

7 legislative order, each house voting separately. Any order

8 ratified by legislative order shall be effective for a

9 maximum of fifteen (15) days after the ratification. Public

10 health orders subject to this subsection may be ratified

11 more than one (1) time.

No public health order of a local health officer 13 issued pursuant to W.S. 35-4-103 that requires the closure 14 of public or private buildings, facilities or other places 15 16 limits or forbids gatherings and that exceeds the requirements of any state health order shall be effective 17 for a period exceeding fifteen (15) days unless the order 18 19 is ratified by a resolution of the governing body that 20 directly supervises the local health officer. Any order ratified shall be effective for a maximum of fifteen (15) 21 days after the ratification. Public health orders subject 22

to this subsection may be ratified more than one (1) time.

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2 (c) For purposes of this section, a public health

3 order is considered to be effective for a period exceeding

4 fifteen (15) days if the public health order includes an

5 effective period that exceeds fifteen (15) days or if the

6 material requirements of the order are contained in

7 multiple orders whose combined effective period exceeds

8 fifteen (15) days within any twelve (12) month period.

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16 (a) The department of health, through the state

23 diseases and afflictions, and physical disabilities

4 The department of health shall, immediately after the receipt of information that there is any smallpox, cholera, 5 scarlet fever, diphtheria or other infectious or contagious 6 disease, which is a menace to the public health, in any 7 8 portion of this state, order the county health officer to 9 immediately investigate the case and report to the state 10 health officer the results of the investigation. The state health officer shall, subject to W.S. 35-4-112 and if in 11 12 his judgment the occasion requires, direct the county health officer to declare the infected place to be in 13 quarantine. The county health officer shall place any 14 15 restrictions upon ingress and egress at this location as in 16 his judgment or in the judgment of the state health officer 17 are necessary to prevent the spread of the disease from the infected locality. The county health officer shall upon 18 19 declaring any city, town or other place to 20 quarantine, control the population of the city, town or 21 other place as in his judgment best protects the people and at the same time prevents the spread of the disease. If 22 23 necessary for the protection of the public health and

1 subject to W.S. 35-4-112, the state health officer shall 2 establish and maintain a state quarantine and shall enforce 3 practical regulations regarding railroads or other lines of 4 travel into and out of the state of Wyoming as necessary for the protection of the public health. The expenses 5 incurred in maintaining the state quarantine shall be paid 6 out of the funds of the state treasury appropriated for 7 8 this purpose and in the manner in which other expenses of 9 the department are audited and paid. The county health 10 officer or the department may employ a sufficient number of police officers who shall be under the control of the 11 12 county health officer, to enforce and carry out quarantine regulations the department may prescribe. 13 regulations shall be made public in the most practicable 14 manner in the several counties, cities, towns or other 15 16 where the quarantine is established. 17 quarantine is established by the county health officer, he shall immediately report his actions to the state health 18 19 officer. The county health officer shall furnish all 20 supplies and other resources necessary for maintaining the 21 quarantine. Upon certificate of the county health officer approved by the director of the state department of health, 22 the county commissioners of any county where a quarantine 23

- 1 has been established shall issue warrants to the proper
- 2 parties for the payment of all expenses, together with the
- 3 expense of employing sufficient police force, to maintain
- 4 and enforce the quarantine. Any order imposed under this
- 5 section that requires the closure of public or private
- 6 buildings, facilities or other places or limits or forbids
- 7 gatherings is subject to the limitations imposed by W.S.
- 8 <u>35-1-245.</u> For purposes of this act, "state health officer"
- 9 means as defined in W.S. 9-2-103(e).

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23 (a) As used in this article:

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1 2 (ii) "Quarantine" means: 3 4 (A) The physical separation and confinement from nonquarantined individuals of an individual or group 5 of individuals that has been, or may have been, exposed to, 6 or is reasonably believed to be infected with, a contagious 7 possibly contagious disease, from nonquarantined 8 individuals, to prevent or limit the transmission of the 9 10 disease to nonquarantined individuals; 11 12 (B) The isolation of a geographic area individuals are located who have been or are 13 14 reasonably believed to have been exposed to or infected by a contagious or possibly contagious disease. ; or 15 16 17 **Section 3.** W.S. 35-4-115(a)(ii)(C) is repealed. 18 19 Section 4. This act shall only apply to public health 20 orders issued on or after the effective date of this act. 21 No public health order issued before the effective date of 22 this act shall be subject to this act during any period for which the public health order is effective. 23
