6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8	Section 1. W.S. 21-4-302.1 is created to read:

10	21-4-302.1. Advance enrollment for children of
11	transferred military personnel.

13	(a) For purposes of registration with a school
14	district, a pupil shall be considered a resident of this
15	state if the pupil's parent or guardian is transferred to

or is pending transfer to a military installation within
the state while on active military duty pursuant to an
official military order.

5 (b) For pupils qualifying under subsection (a) of 6 this section, school districts shall accept enrollment 7 requests electronically. If a school district allows 8 enrollment requests for a pupil to attend a specific school 9 or program, the school district shall allow such an 10 enrollment request to be submitted electronically for a 11 pupil qualifying under subsection (a) of this section.

13 (c) For pupils qualifying under subsection (a) of 14 this section, a parent or guardian shall provide proof of 15 residence to the pupil's school district within ten (10) 16 days after the pupil first attends the school district.

18 (d) As used in this section:

20 (i) "Active military duty" means full-time duty 21 status in the active uniformed service of the United 22 States, including members of the national guard and reserve

3	(ii) "Military installation" means a base, camp,
4	post, station, yard, center or other activity under the
5	jurisdiction of the United States department of defense.
