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1 (a) No public health order issued pursuant to W.S. 2 35-1-240(a)(ii), (iii) or (iv), 35-4-103 or 35-4-112(c) 3 shall be effective unless the governor has: 4 5 (i) Signed the public health order; and б 7 (ii) Declared a public health emergency pursuant 8 to W.S. 35-4-115(a)(i). 9 10 (b) No public health order issued pursuant to W.S. 11 35-1-240(a)(ii), (iii) or (iv), 35-4-103 or 35-4-112(c) 12 shall be effective for a period exceeding thirty (30) days within an unincorporated area of a county or within a city 13 or town unless the order is ratified in accordance with 14 this subsection. Any order ratified by the applicable 15 16 governing body shall be effective for a maximum of thirty 17 (30) days after the ratification. Public health orders subject to this subsection may be ratified more than one 18 19 (1) time. For purposes of this subsection: 20 21 (i) An order issued to apply to a person or 22 location within an unincorporated area of a county shall be

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4 (ii) An order issued to apply to a person or 5 location within a city or town shall be ratified by the 6 governing body of that municipality.

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8 (c) For purposes of this section, a public health 9 order is considered to be effective for a period exceeding 10 thirty (30) days if the public health order includes an 11 effective period that exceeds thirty (30) days or if the 12 material requirements of the order are contained in 13 multiple orders whose combined effective period exceeds 14 thirty (30) days within any twelve (12) month period.

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16 Section 2. W.S. 35-1-240(a)(ii) through (iv), 17 35-4-103, 35-4-112(c) and 35-4-115(a)(ii)(A) and (B) are 18 amended to read:

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20 **35-1-240.** Powers and duties.

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(a) The department of health, through the statehealth officer, or under his direction and supervision,

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1 through the other employees of the department, shall have 2 and exercise the following powers and duties: 3 4 (ii) To investigate and control the causes of epidemic, endemic, communicable, occupational and other 5 and afflictions, and physical disabilities 6 diseases resulting therefrom, affecting the public health. Orders 7 8 imposed under this paragraph are subject to the limitations imposed by W.S. 35-1-245; 9 10 11 (iii) To establish, maintain and enforce 12 isolation and quarantine of persons reasonably believed to 13 be or known to be infected with a contagious disease, and in pursuance thereof, and for such purpose only, to 14 exercise such physical control over property and over the 15 persons of the people within this state as the state health 16 17 officer may find necessary for the protection of the public health. Orders imposed under this paragraph are subject to 18 the limitations imposed by W.S. 35-1-245; 19 20

(iv) To close theaters, schools and other public
places, and to forbid gatherings of people when necessary
to protect the public health. Orders imposed under this

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1 paragraph are subject to the limitations imposed by W.S. 2 <u>35-1-245;</u>

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9 The department of health shall, immediately after the 10 receipt of information that there is any smallpox, cholera, scarlet fever, diphtheria or other infectious or contagious 11 12 disease, which is a menace to the public health, in any portion of this state, order the county health officer to 13 immediately investigate the case and report to the state 14 health officer the results of the investigation. The state 15 16 health officer shall, subject to W.S. 35-4-112 and if in 17 his judgment the occasion requires, direct the county health officer to declare the infected place to be in 18 19 quarantine. The county health officer shall place any 20 restrictions upon ingress and egress at this location as in 21 his judgment or in the judgment of the state health officer are necessary to prevent the spread of the disease from the 22 23 infected locality. The county health officer shall upon

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1 declaring any city, town or other place to be in 2 quarantine, control the population of the city, town or 3 other place as in his judgment best protects the people and 4 at the same time prevents the spread of the disease. If 5 necessary for the protection of the public health and subject to W.S. 35-4-112, the state health officer shall 6 establish and maintain a state quarantine and shall enforce 7 8 practical regulations regarding railroads or other lines of 9 travel into and out of the state of Wyoming as necessary 10 for the protection of the public health. The expenses 11 incurred in maintaining the state quarantine shall be paid 12 out of the funds of the state treasury appropriated for 13 this purpose and in the manner in which other expenses of the department are audited and paid. The county health 14 officer or the department may employ a sufficient number of 15 16 police officers who shall be under the control of the 17 county health officer, to enforce and carry out any 18 quarantine regulations the department may prescribe. The 19 regulations shall be made public in the most practicable 20 manner in the several counties, cities, towns or other 21 places where the quarantine is established. Ιf the 22 quarantine is established by the county health officer, he shall immediately report his actions to the state health 23

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1 The county health officer shall furnish all officer. 2 supplies and other resources necessary for maintaining the 3 quarantine. Upon certificate of the county health officer 4 approved by the director of the state department of health, the county commissioners of any county where a quarantine 5 has been established shall issue warrants to the proper 6 parties for the payment of all expenses, together with the 7 8 expense of employing sufficient police force, to maintain and enforce the quarantine. Any order imposed under this 9 10 section is subject to the limitations imposed by W.S. 11 35-1-245. For purposes of this act, "state health officer" 12 means as defined in W.S. 9-2-103(e). 13 35-4-112. Right of appeal of quarantine. 14 15 16 (C) In the event of a public health emergency of 17 unknown effect, the state health officer may impose a temporary quarantine until there is sufficient information 18 19 to determine what actions, if any, are reasonably needed to 20 protect the public health. Any order imposed under this subsection is subject to the limitations imposed by W.S. 21 35-1-245. 22 23
