Commercial filing system update.

Sponsored by: Select Committee on Blockchain, Financial Technology and Digital Innovation Technology

A BILL

for

1 ACT relating corporations, partnerships ΑN to 2 associations; authorizing the secretary of state to develop 3 and implement a blockchain or other distributed ledger 4 system; providing requirements for the 5 system; providing definitions; authorizing the supreme 6 court to develop a similar filing system for the chancery 7 court; authorizing the promulgation of rules; repealing the previous enabling legislation; creating an account; 8 providing appropriations for the updating of filing systems 9 10 by the secretary of state and the chancery court and for 11 advertising; providing for retention of a consultant and a 12 report; and providing for an effective date.

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14 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

1 Section 1.

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3 (a) Not later than December 31, 2021, the secretary 4 of state may develop and implement a filing system through 5 which all required filings, as defined in paragraph (c)(iii) of this section, may be submitted. The secretary 6 of state shall endeavor to use blockchain technology or 7 other distributed ledger technology as the technological 8 9 framework for the filing system. The filing system shall 10 also include an application programming interface, security 11 measures, authenticated digital corporate identity and 12 other components determined by the secretary of state to be 13 best practices or likely to increase the effective and efficient administration of the laws of this state. The 14 15 secretary of state may create a blockchain or other distributed ledger technology for the purposes of this 16 17 section or contract for the use of a privately created blockchain or other distributed ledger technology. 18

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20 (b) The secretary of state may:

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22 (i) Consult with interested parties before 23 developing the filing system specified by subsection (a) of

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- 1 this section, including businesses, registered agents,
- 2 attorneys, law enforcement and other interested persons;

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- 4 (ii) If possible, partner with technology
- 5 innovators and private companies to develop necessary
- 6 components of the system.

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8 (c) As used in this section:

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- 10 (i) "Application programming interface" means a
- 11 computer software intermediary or protocol which allows two
- 12 (2) or more distinct software applications to interact;

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- 14 (ii) "Blockchain" means a digital ledger or
- 15 database that is chronological, consensus based,
- 16 decentralized and mathematically verified in nature;

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- 18 (iii) "Required filings" means all documents,
- 19 reports, data and other information required by law to be
- 20 filed with the secretary of state.

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- 22 (d) The supreme court may develop and implement a
- 23 similar filing system to that required by subsection (a) of

- 1 this section for the chancery court. The supreme court
- 2 shall report quarterly to the select committee on
- 3 blockchain, financial technology and digital innovation
- 4 technology updates on the status of the filing system.

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- 6 **Section 2.** The secretary of state may adopt rules to
- 7 implement this act.

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- 9 **Section 3.** 2019 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 94 is
- 10 repealed.

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- 14 (a) On and after April 1, 2021 the state treasurer
- 15 shall deposit the first four million five hundred thousand
- 16 dollars (\$4,500,000.00) collected under W.S. 17-16-1630
- 17 into the corporate filing computer system account which is
- 18 hereby created. Upon depositing the four million five
- 19 hundred thousand dollars (\$4,500,000.00) into the account
- 20 all further funds collected under W.S. 17-16-1630 shall be
- 21 distributed as otherwise provided by law.

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1 (b) There is appropriated two hundred fifty thousand 2 dollars (\$250,000.00) from the corporate filing computer 3 system account created by this act to the office of 4 secretary of state for the purposes of contracting for services to conduct a study regarding the feasibility of 5 the filing system authorized by section 1 of this act, 6 including potential financial and commercial demand for the 7 8 filing system and technology requirements. The request for 9 proposal and retention of a consultant to perform the study 10 shall be conducted by the authority of the office of the secretary of state 11 in consultation with the select 12 committee on blockchain, financial technology and digital innovation technology. The results of the study shall be 13 reported to the select committee on blockchain, financial 14 technology and digital innovation technology during the 15 16 2021 legislative interim. This appropriation shall be for 17 the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2022. This appropriation shall not be 18 19 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any 20 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this 21 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 2022. 22

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1 There is appropriated two million two hundred 2 fifty thousand dollars (\$2,250,000.00) from the corporate 3 filing computer system account created by this act to the 4 office of secretary of state to be used in accordance with 5 the recommendations of the study conducted pursuant to subsection (b) of this section and in consultation with the 6 select committee on blockchain, financial technology and 7 innovation technology, for 8 the digital purposes οf 9 developing and implementing the filing system described in 10 this act. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending 11 12 June 30, 2022. This appropriation shall not be transferred 13 or expended for any other purpose and, notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008, 9-2-1012(e) and 9-4-207, any unexpended, 14 unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall 15 revert as provided by law on June 30, 2022. 16

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18 (d) There is appropriated million dollars one 19 (\$1,000,000.00) from the corporate filing computer system 20 account to the office of the secretary of state to be used for targeted nationwide advertising promoting business 21 registration in the state of Wyoming. This appropriation 22 shall be for the period beginning with the effective date 23

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1 of this act and ending June 30, 2022. This appropriation

2 shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose

3 and, notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008, 9-2-1012(e) and

4 9-4-207, any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from

5 this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June

6 30, 2022.

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8 (e) There is appropriated one million dollars
9 (\$1,000,000.00) from the corporate filing computer system
10 account to the supreme court to be used for the purposes of

11 developing and implementing a similar filing system to that

12 described in this act for the chancery court. This

13 appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the

14 effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2022. This

15 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any

16 other purpose and, notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008,

9-2-1012(e) and 9-4-207, any unexpended, unobligated funds

18 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided

19 by law on June 30, 2022.

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2 Section 5. This act is effective immediately upon

3 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

4 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

5 Constitution.
