- 1 AN ACT relating to occupations and professions; providing
- 2 exemptions from the Wyoming Cosmetology Act and from barber
- 3 licensing requirements for the rendering of specified
- 4 services; providing definitions; and providing for an

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14 33-7-101. Definitions.

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2 (a) As used in this act:

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4 (i) "Barbering" means the practice upon person or persons of any of the following acts (when done 5 for cosmetic purposes, and not for the treatment of disease 6 or physical or mental ailments, and when done for payment, 7 8 either directly or indirectly, or without payment except 9 for the immediate family); provided, that the practice of 10 blow dry styling as defined by W.S. 33-12-120(a)(xxi) and 11 the practice of natural hair braiding as defined by W.S. 12 33-12-120(a)(xxiv) and any person or persons operating a 13 beauty salon or practicing cosmetology and its related fields exclusively shall be exempt from the provisions of 14 15 this act: shaving or treating the beard or cutting the 16 hair, singeing, shampooing or dyeing the hair, permanent 17 waving or applying hair tonics, massaging, applying cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, powder, oil, clay or 18

lotions, to the scalp, face or neck;

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23 (a) As used in this act:

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(xx) "Practice of blow dry styling" means the 3 practice of cleaning, drying, arranging, curling, 4 straightening or styling a person's hair, hair extensions, hair pieces or wigs using only styling devices, hair sprays 5 6 and topical agents including balms, oils and serums. The practice of blow dry styling shall not include cutting hair 7 8 or the application of dyes, bleach, reactive chemicals, keratin treatments or other preparations to color or alter 9 10 the structure of hair. The practice of blow dry styling is separate and distinct from the practice of hair styling and 11 12 the practice of cosmetology; 13 (xxi) "Practice of eyelash extension 14 application" means the application, removal or trimming of 15 threadlike natural or synthetic fibers of a person's 16 eyelash and includes the cleansing of the eye area and 17 lashes. The practice of eyelash extension application shall 18 19 not include the application of color agents, straightening

agents, permanent wave solutions or bleaching agents to the

eyelash or eyebrow, or any other cosmetology service. The

practice of eyelash extension application is separate and

distinct from the practice of esthetics and practice of

2 cosmetology; 3 4 (xxii) "Practice of makeup application" means 5 the application of a cosmetic by hand, using an airbrush or through other means, to enhance the appearance of a 6 person's face or skin including the application of powder, 7 8 foundation, rouge, eyeshadow, eyeliner, mascara or lipstick. The practice of makeup application shall not 9 10 include the application of permanent makeup or tattooing. The practice of makeup application is separate and distinct 11 12 from the practice of esthetics and practice of cosmetology; 13 (xxiii) "Practice of natural hair braiding" 14 means the service of twisting, wrapping, weaving, 15 extending, locking or braiding a person's hair by hand or 16 with styling devices, including through the use of natural 17 or synthetic hair extensions or fibers, decorative beads or 18 19 other hair accessories, the minor trimming of natural hair 20 or hair extensions incidental to twisting, wrapping, weaving, extending, locking or braiding hair or the making 21 of wigs from natural hair, natural fibers, synthetic fibers 22 or hair extensions. The practice of natural hair braiding 23

1	includes the use of topical agents such as conditioners,
2	gels, moisturizers, oils, pomades or shampoos. The practice
3	of natural hair braiding shall not include the application
4	of dyes, reactive chemicals or other preparations to alter
5	the color of a person's hair or to straighten, curl or
б	alter the structure of a person's hair, or the use of
7	chemical hair joining agents including synthetic tape,
8	keratin bonds or fusion bonds. The practice of natural hair
9	braiding is separate and distinct from the practice of hair
10	styling and practice of cosmetology;
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12	(xxiv) "Practice of threading" means a method of
13	removing hair from a person's eyebrows, upper lip or other
14	body parts by using a cotton thread to pull hair from
15	follicles. The practice of threading includes the use of
16	over-the-counter astringents, gels, powders, tweezers or
17	scissors incidental to threading. The practice of threading
18	is separate and distinct from the practice of esthetics and
19	practice of cosmetology;
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21	(xxv) "Styling device" means brushes, clips,
22	combs, curlers, curling irons, flat irons, hairpins,
23	rollers, blunt tipped needles, thread or hair binders;
