Capitol square preservation council.

## A BILL

## for

1 AN ACT relating to state property and buildings; specifying 2 boundaries of the state capitol square; providing for management and operation of state property and facilities 3 within the state capitol square and state capitol complex; 4 creating a Wyoming capitol square preservation council; 5 specifying membership of the council; providing duties and 6 7 powers; transferring duties and powers of the state 8 building commission to the capitol square preservation 9 council; amending contract provisions for the capitol 10 oversight project; reallocating funding; providing for an 11 appropriation; reducing an appropriation; and providing for an effective date. 12

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14 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 15

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1 Section 1. W.S. 9-5-114 and 9-5-115 are created to 2 read: 3 4 9-5-114. Wyoming capitol square preservation council; creation; authority; rules; staffing. 5 6 7 (a) There is created a Wyoming capitol square 8 preservation council comprised of: 9 (i) The five (5) state elected officials; 10 11 12 (ii) The president of the senate and a member of 13 the senate selected by the president; 14 15 (iii) The speaker of the house of 16 representatives and a member of the house selected by the 17 speaker; 18 19 (iv) A member of the legislature selected 20 jointly by the senate president and speaker of the house. At least one (1) legislative member of the council shall be 21 a member of a minority party. 22 23

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1 (b) The presiding officer of the house opposite of 2 the legislative member selected pursuant to paragraph (a)(iv) of this section and the governor shall serve as 3 4 cochairmen. A quorum of the council shall consist of a majority of the members of the council. The council shall 5 meet at the call of both cochairmen or by a call of a 6 majority of the members of the council. Actions of the 7 8 council shall be taken by a majority vote of the quorum in attendance. No member shall authorize a designee to act as 9 10 their personal representative to the council.

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12 (C) The council may adopt rules and regulations to 13 implement the functions assigned to the council. Any rule adopted by the council shall be submitted to the management 14 15 council of the legislature in accordance with W.S. 28-9-101 16 through 28-9-108, approved by the governor as provided in 17 W.S. 16-3-103(d) and filed with the secretary of state, but is not otherwise subject to the Wyoming Administrative 18 19 Procedure The council shall promulgate rules Act. 20 specifying procedures under which public comment may be 21 received regarding any actions of the council. The council shall be an agency for purposes of the provisions of W.S. 22 9-5-107(e) and 16-4-401 through 16-4-408 when at a meeting 23

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called to execute a power or duty of the council under this 1 2 section. 3 4 (d) Staff and support for the council shall be provided by the legislative service office. 5 6 7 9-5-115. Wyoming capitol square preservation council 8 duties; staffing; jurisdiction limited. 9 10 (a) The Wyoming capitol square preservation council 11 shall: 12 13 (i) Develop plans and recommendations for the maintenance, preservation, restoration, rehabilitation, 14 construction and enhancement of the capitol square; 15 16 17 (ii) Review and approve or disapprove requests to architecturally or structurally alter buildings and 18 19 grounds within the capitol square; 20 21 (iii) Manage common spaces and oversee visitor services within the capitol square; 22 23

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1 (iv) Oversee the development of and updates to a 2 master plan for maintenance preservation, restoration, 3 rehabilitation construction and enhancement within the 4 capitol complex. The council shall review all proposals to 5 remodel construct a building, monument or or other improvement within the capitol complex for conformance with 6 the master plan. The council's review of proposals shall be 7 8 conducted in coordination with level 1 reconnaissance and level 2 feasibility studies for development of building 9 10 projects under W.S. 9-5-108.

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12 (b) Within the capitol square, the council shall be 13 responsible for:

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(i) Meeting room management. Legislative use shall be provided as a first priority in the scheduling and management of meeting rooms and areas which are also available to the executive department and to the public. Subject to legislative prioritization, these spaces shall be managed with the goal of maximizing compatible uses by all authorized users;

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1 (ii) Development and management of visitor 2 services and exhibit programs; 3 4 (iii) Management of a student civic and education center, visitor's center and media center; 5 6 7 (iv) Oversight of installation of temporary and 8 permanent exhibits, artwork, statuary and furniture that have been approved by the council; 9 10 11 (v) Development and implementation of an art 12 collections policy and an art program designed to purchase or accept by donation or permanent loan artwork for display 13 within the capitol square; 14 15 16 (vi) Oversight of maintenance. Building and 17 grounds maintenance and cleaning shall be provided by the division of the 18 general service department of 19 administration and information pursuant to a memorandum of 20 understanding between the legislative service office and the department of administration and information. 21 22

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1 (c) The council shall not have jurisdiction over 2 day-to-day management: 3 4 (i) Of areas occupied solely by either the legislative department or executive official or executive 5 department within the capitol square; 6 7 8 (ii) Other buildings in the capitol complex outside of the capitol square, other than master planning 9 10 responsibilities specified in this section. 11

12 (d) The council shall not modify space allocations 13 within the capitol square but may recommend that the 14 legislative management council develop legislation to 15 effectuate space allocation amendments.

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Section 2. W.S. 9-1-103, 9-5-101(b), (e) and by creating new paragraphs (iii) and (iv), 9-5-102(a), 9-5-104(a) and (b)(intro), 9-5-105(b) and by creating a new subsection (c), 9-5-106(d) and by creating a new subsection (h), 9-5-107(a) through (c) and (e), 9-5-112(f) and 9-5-113 by creating a new subsection (b) are amended to read:

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9-1-103. State elected officials representation on
 boards and commissions; designees; limitations.

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4 A state elected official may authorize a designee to act as 5 the official's personal representative to any board or commission of which the official is a member. б The designee shall have the right to speak on behalf of the official and 7 8 to vote and take other lawful action on behalf of the official as a member of the board or commission. 9 The 10 provisions of this section shall not apply to the Wyoming 11 capitol square preservation council, nor to any board or 12 commission to which the state elected official is appointed 13 by the Wyoming constitution or which is comprised solely of state elected officials. 14

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16 9-5-101. State building commission; composition; 17 general powers and duties; conflicts of interest.

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(b) The state building commission shall promulgate rules under which the general services division has charge and control of the capitol <u>building square</u> with respect to its <u>repair and maintenance and shall collect all rents</u> arising from the occupancy of the capitol building. The

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1	state building commission may also promulgate rules
2	governing occupancy of the capitol building for executive
3	department officials day to day management within areas
4	occupied solely by an executive official or department.
5	Rules of the commission affecting the capitol square shall
6	apply to the extent the Wyoming capitol square preservation
7	council has not adopted a rule in conflict with the
8	commission rule.
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10	(e) As used in this article:
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12	(iii) "Capitol square" means the state capitol
13	building, the extension to the state capitol building
14	extending underground to the Herschler building, those
15	areas of shared use by the legislative department and
16	executive department within the Herschler building, the
17	Idelman Mansion, the Kendrick House and all grounds owned
18	by the state of Wyoming within the boundaries south of $26^{th}$
19	Street, east of Carey Avenue, north of 24 <sup>th</sup> Street and west
20	of Central Avenue all within Cheyenne, Wyoming;
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22	(iv) "Council" means the Wyoming capitol square
23	preservation council.

9-5-102. State building commission; authority to buy
and lease property; acceptance of donations, grants and
devises.

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In order to obtain building sites for additional 6 (a) office space and state uses and to insure the proper 7 8 keeping of valuable state records and provide for the expansion of functions of the state, the general services 9 10 with the approval of the state division, building 11 commission, may buy, take options to buy and lease property 12 to be used for building sites for future state office 13 buildings. The general services division, with the approval of the commission may lease acquired property until it is 14 needed. The general services division, with the approval of 15 16 the state building commission, in cooperation with the 17 department of workforce services, may acquire lands and buildings in the name of the state of Wyoming by purchase, 18 19 lease agreement, gift or devise to provide suitable 20 quarters for the administration of the Wyoming Employment 21 Security Law and to develop improvements, maintain and repair the lands and buildings. The commission shall not 22 approve the exercise of any authority under this section 23

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1	for any property which is or would be within the boundaries
2	of the capitol complex which is inconsistent with the
3	master plan for the capitol complex without providing at
4	least sixty (60) days' notice of the proposed action to the
5	management council of the legislature or rule of the
6	Wyoming capitol square preservation council governing the
7	capitol square without approval of the council.
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9	9-5-104. State building commission; state office
10	buildings; authority to maintain; rental; use of proceeds.
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12	(a) The general services division, in accordance with
13	rules of the state building commission, may maintain,
14	operate, lease, manage and equip state office buildings in
15	Wyoming. The authority of the general services division
16	under this subsection for the capitol square is subject to
17	the provisions of W.S. 9-5-114 and 9-5-115 and shall be
18	exercised pursuant to a memorandum of understanding in
19	accordance with the provisions of W.S. 9-5-115.
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21	(b) Every department occupying space in a building
21	(b) Every department occupying space in a building authorized under subsection (a) of this section, if

1	accordance with rules of the state building commission,
2	shall pay to the general services division an annual rental
3	plus a pro rata share of maintenance, janitorial services,
4	utilities and other overhead costs necessary to maintain
5	the building in as good a condition as reasonable and
6	proper use will permit. <u>With regard to the capitol square,</u>
7	the provisions of this section shall be implemented
8	pursuant to a memorandum of understanding between the
9	commission and the Wyoming capitol square preservation

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12 (h) For purposes of this section, the Wyoming capitol 13 square preservation council is authorized to adopt rules 14 relative to the operation, management and use of the 15 capitol square as provided by W.S. 9-5-114 and 9-5-115.

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9-5-107. Duties and responsibilities with respect to
 state buildings; state capital construction needs
 assessment and priorities.

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(a) The state construction department shall, subject
to the direction of the state building commission and with
the assistance of other state agencies as necessary,

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1 conduct and maintain a comprehensive needs assessment of 2 existing state buildings and of future space requirements 3 for state agencies. The assessment shall be conducted in 4 accordance with rules of the state building commission adopted pursuant to subsection (d) of this section and be 5 designed to provide uniform statewide data describing the 6 condition of state buildings and projecting building 7 8 longevity and space requirements. The needs assessment for state buildings and space requirements for the capitol 9 10 complex shall be segregated from other state building and 11 space needs and subject to separate rules adopted by the 12 state building commission in congruity with the provisions 13 of the capitol complex master plan adopted pursuant to W.S. 9-5-115. Through the identification of building conditions 14 15 and needs, the assessment assessments shall enable the 16 evaluation of capital construction and renovation 17 requirements for all state buildings. The needs assessment assessments shall be revised annually on or before October 18 19 1 of each year. The needs assessment assessments shall 20 specify construction and renovation requirements for the 21 remainder of the current fiscal year and the succeeding 22 four (4) fiscal years.

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1 (b) On or before November 1 of each year and based 2 upon the statewide needs assessment assessments of state 3 buildings performed under subsection (a) of this section, 4 the state building commission shall establish and 5 prioritize construction and renovation needs for state listing shall specifically identify and б buildings. The prioritize those buildings in need of building construction 7 8 renovation and the estimated costs of or required 9 construction or renovation during the current fiscal year 10 and during the succeeding four (4) fiscal years. The 11 prioritization for construction and renovation needs for 12 the capitol square shall be developed by the Wyoming 13 capitol square preservation council and in congruity with the provisions of the capitol complex master plan. 14 15 16 (c) On or before December 1 of each year, the 17 commission shall provide copies of the needs assessment 18 assessments and statewide construction and renovation 19 priorities established under this section to members of the

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legislature.

(e) Rules and procedures adopted under this sectionby the state building commission shall be applicable to all

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state owned buildings unless the operation, management and 1 2 use of the building has been assigned by statute to a 3 specific state agency. The agency responsible for the 4 operation and management of a state building exempted by 5 the provisions of this subsection, shall provide the assessment required by subsections (a) through (c) of this 6 section to the state building commission for inclusion in 7 8 the commission's report to the legislature. The rules adopted by the commission under subsection (d) of this 9 10 section shall be used as guidelines for the management of 11 state buildings assigned by statute to other state agencies 12 including the University of Wyoming, community college 13 districts, department of transportation, game and fish commission and state institutions. For purposes of this 14 subsection, the Wyoming capitol square preservation council 15 16 is authorized to adopt rules and regulations relative to 17 the operation, management and use of the capitol square as provided by W.S. 9-5-114 and 9-5-115. 18

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9-5-112. Capitol building rehabilitation and
 restoration project; components; oversight.

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1 (f) The department may expend funds appropriated by 2 the legislature for the project to implement the design, 3 renovation, restoration, rehabilitation, construction and 4 other project components which have been included in the final design plans approved under subsection (e) of this 5 section. Any change order to the approved final design 6 plans in excess of one hundred thousand 7 dollars 8 (\$100,000.00) or in a cumulative amount in excess of one 9 million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall require the approval 10 of the governor and a majority of the other voting members 11 of the oversight group which consist of the legislator 12 members and the state treasurer Wyoming capitol square 13 preservation council. 14

159-5-113. Capitolbuildingrehabilitationand16restoration project; design and construction execution.

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18 (b) Nothing in W.S. 9-5-110 through 9-5-113 shall be 19 construed to limit the authority of the governor or the 20 treasurer under article 3, section 31 of the Wyoming 21 constitution.

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1 Section 3. W.S. 9-5-101(d) and 9-5-106(e) through (g)
2 are repealed.

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4 Section 4. There is appropriated one hundred thousand 5 dollars (\$100,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative service office. This appropriation shall be 6 for the period beginning with the effective date of this 7 8 act and ending June 30, 2022. The legislative service office shall include this additional funding, together with 9 any additional requests for staff or funding for duties 10 under this act, within its 2022 budget request to the 11 12 legislative management council.

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Section 5. The duties and powers of the state 14 building commission under W.S. 9-5-109 through 9-5-113 as 15 16 to the state capitol building and Herschler state office 17 rehabilitation, restoration and renovation project described in W.S. 9-5-112, as transferred from the state 18 19 capitol building oversight group by 2019 Wyoming Session 20 Laws, Chapter 197, Section 3, shall be assumed by the 21 Wyoming capitol square preservation council. Upon the effective date of this act all appropriations, property, 22 contracts, agreements, obligations and authority of the 23

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1 state building commission shall be transferred to the preservation council. To the extent a power or duty 2 3 previously within the authority of the state building 4 commission is required to be exercised after the effective date of this act, the power or duty shall be exercised by 5 Wyoming capitol square preservation council 6 the in 7 accordance with provisions of law governing the project. 8 9 Section 6. Nothing in this act shall be construed to limit the authority of the governor and treasurer under 10 11 article 3, section 31 of the Wyoming constitution. 12 13 Section 7. This act is effective July 1, 2021. 14 15 (END)

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
