## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to K-12 school facilities; amending 2 provisions governing school facility adequacy standards; 3 amending provisions governing school facility needs

4 assessments; amending provisions governing the

5 prioritization of remedies for school facilities by the

6 school facilities commission; conforming provisions; and

7 providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section** 1. W.S. 9-4-1001(b)(i),

12 21-3-110(a)(x)(intro), 21-15-114(a)(ii), 21-15-115(a)(v)

13 and (c), 21-15-117(a)(intro), (i), (iii), by creating new

14 paragraphs (vi) and (vii), (d) and (e)(intro),

15 21-15-119(a)(intro), (c) and by creating a new subsection

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16 (d) and 21-15-121(a)(i) and (iii) are amended to read:

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2	9-4-1001. Guarantee program for school district
3	bonds.
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5	(b) A school district that seeks the guarantee of
6	bonds under this program shall apply to the board on forms
7	prescribed by the board. The board shall review the
8	application, investigate the applicant district and
9	determine whether to approve the application based upon:

11	(i) The purpose of the bond issue, the
12	district's need for it, including information from the any
13	needs assessment under W.S. $\frac{21-15-115}{21-15-117}$ , whether
14	the district would likely remain within constitutional debt
15	limits after the issue and whether a guarantee under this
16	section would likely result in reduced costs;
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18	21-3-110. Duties of boards of trustees.
19	
20	(a) The board of trustees in each school district
21	shall:

(x) Subject to review by the state construction

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2 department under W.S.  $\frac{21-15-115}{21-15-117}$  for any project 3 involving state capital construction assistance, fix the 4 site of each school building and facility considering the needs of the people of each portion of the district. 5 Ιf the district enters into an agreement to lease buildings 6 and facilities owned by the district and the buildings and 7 8 facilities are included within the statewide database 9 maintained by the state construction department under W.S. 10 21-15-123(f)(iv), the district shall, except as provided 11 under W.S. 21-15-109(c)(i)(A)(II) and (III) and (B), ensure 12 the lease agreement requires sufficient payment from the 13 lessee to cover expenses necessary to adequately maintain the facility or building in accordance with statewide 14 15 adequacy standards prescribed by the commission. If the 16 district or a charter school operating pursuant to a 17 contract with the district enters into an agreement to lease buildings and facilities under which the district or 18 19 the charter school is the lessee and the building is to be 20 used for the provision of the required educational program 21 within the district, the lease agreement shall require the 22 lessor to adequately maintain the buildings and facilities in accordance with standards prescribed by the commission. 23

8 to make any modification to the building as a condition of

9 using the building for the purpose of educating students.

19 (a) of this section. Review and evaluation of the standards

20 shall include the identification of local enhancements to

21 buildings and facilities during this review and evaluation

22 period, and based upon criteria and procedures developed by

23 the commission, a determination as to whether and how any

21-15-117. Annual evaluation of school buildings and 18 facilities; remediation schedules; needs prioritization; 19 combining facilities; implementation of remedy.

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21 (a) Through the identification of school building and
22 facility conditions and needs provided by the assessment
23 conducted and maintained under W.S. 21-15-115, and a

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1	(vi) of this subsection. Under each of the three (3)
2	schedules the commission shall prioritize educational
3	building and facility needs that impede the delivery of the
4	prescribed statewide educational program. Additionally,
5	the commission shall establish one (1) consolidated
6	remediation schedule as described in paragraph (vii) of
7	this subsection. The commission shall by rule and
8	regulation establish a process to prioritize all school
9	building and facility needs from the most critical to the
10	least critical with the most critical need prioritized
11	first. Remediation undertaken under these schedules shall
12	over time bring all buildings and facilities to conditions
13	such that over time, only routine maintenance is required
14	to maintain building adequacy. The schedule shall identify
15	and prioritize building and facility remedies on a
16	statewide basis, based upon a building condition score
17	developed by the commission subject to the following the
18	levels set by the statewide adequacy standards promulgated
19	under W.S. 21-15-115(a). The commission shall annually
20	develop:
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22 (i) One (1) schedule to remedy building 23 condition needs, which shall be based on appropriate

1 criteria and measures for building condition, which 2 incorporate educational suitability and technology readiness, specifically taking into consideration 3 4 appropriate and up-to-date standards for air quality, illumination and appropriateness of the student 5 environment, as established by commission rule 6 regulation, and compiled under the building systems 7 8 condition reference guide, which over time bring statewide 9 buildings and facilities to targeted adequate levels 10 prescribed by the commission, reviewed annually, based upon 11 assessment results and findings, broken down for building 12 condition. The schedule shall be categorized by educational 13 and noneducational building; category; 14 (iii) One (1) schedule to remedy building 15 capacity needs. The commission shall base the schedule on 16 17 an analysis of student enrollment changes, as based upon performed in accordance with a commission approved 18 19 enrollment projection methodology, to determine the need 20 for changes in building capacities for compliance with 21 statewide adequacy standards over a five (5) year projection period commencing on the date of anticipated 22 completion of project construction. The commission may 23

2	necessary to reflect more precise analysis and evaluation
3	of historical, economic, social and other data impacting
4	the community in which the building is or is to be
5	located: Analysis under this paragraph shall prioritize
6	remediation for those buildings requiring additional space
7	to comply with statewide adequacy standards;
8	
9	(vi) One (1) schedule to remedy educational
10	suitability needs for educational buildings. The schedule
11	shall be based on criteria and measures as established by
12	commission rule and regulation, which shall include
13	appropriate and up-to-date criteria and measures for
14	technology readiness, air quality, illumination and
15	appropriateness of the student environment;
16	
17	(vii) One (1) consolidated remediation schedule
18	of all needs identified under the three (3) schedules
19	developed pursuant to paragraphs (i), (iii) and (vi) of
20	this subsection.
21	
22	(d) In determining building and facility remedies
23	under subsection (b) of this section, in developing

1 criteria and procedures for site analysis under W.S. 2 21-15-114(a)(xii) and in approving district facility plans 3 under W.S. 21-15-116 and otherwise administering this act, 4 the commission shall adopt the remedy that is in the best financial and educational interests of the state, taking 5 into consideration the recommendations of the department 6 and the most efficient and cost effective approach in order 7 8 deliver quality educational services and address to 9 building and facility need. Expenditures from the school 10 capital construction account shall be for necessary and 11 related costs to implement efficient and cost effective 12 building and facility remedies required to deliver quality educational services. In making determinations under this 13 paragraph subsection, the commission shall take 14 15 consideration the effects of the proposed activity on the 16 local community. The commission shall implement this 17 subsection in carrying out building and facility remedies and shall, giving proper consideration to the prevention of 18 19 unnecessary delays in proceeding with a remedy, establish a 20 process to work with other political subdivisions of the 21 state in implementing this subsection.

1 (e) For any building subject to paragraph (a)(iii) of

2 this section, and when prioritizing buildings and

5 consider criteria for building capacity established by

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4 (c) Budgets submitted by the commission under subsection (a) of this section and recommended by the 5 select committee on school facilities under W.S. 28-11-301 6 shall be attached to specified projects for the applicable 7 8 budget period, which projects shall be referred to as 9 planning and design phase projects and construction phase 10 With the approval of the governor, the projects. 11 department may transfer up to fifteen percent (15%) of the 12 total funds appropriated between project phases. modification of appropriation expenditures between project 13 phases shall be reported to the select committee 14 15 accordance with W.S. 28-11-301(c)(iv). Additionally, the 16 commission may for any budget period specify amounts within 17 its budget which are recommended to cover inflation, unanticipated costs, off-site infrastructure costs 18 19 other such contingency or special project costs provided 20 additional costs are reported and approved 21 accordance with W.S. 28-11-301(c)(iv).

1 (d) Amounts appropriated by the legislature shall not 2 be construed to be an entitlement or guaranteed amount and 3 shall be expended by the department in accordance with 4 facility <u>design standards and</u> guidelines to 5 adequate, efficient and cost effective school buildings and facilities as required by W.S. 21-15-114(a)(vii). 6 commission shall adopt facility design standards and 7 8 guidelines that are sufficiently specific to ensure that 9 all projects constructed using state funds, excluding major 10 building and facility repair replacement projects, are subject to value engineering and are reasonably uniform 11 12 across the state.

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17 (a) Not later than September 1 of each year, the commission shall submit a report to the select committee on 18 19 school facilities on progress being made under the school 20 capital facilities system established under this act. The 21 report shall be incorporated into the proposed budget submitted to the select committee under W.S. 21-15-119 and 22 shall include:

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2	(i) Building and facility needs determined under
3	W.S. $\frac{21-15-115}{21-15-117}$ , identifying progress made in the
4	year reported;

6	(iii) Use of major building and facility repair
7	and replacement funds which have addressed buildings and
8	facilities identified under W.S. $\frac{21-15-115}{21-15-117(a)}$ ,
9	including the impact of expenditures of these funds, as
10	quantified pursuant to the statewide any needs assessment
11	rating scores undertaken in accordance with W.S. 21-15-115
12	under W.S. 21-15-117(a), on building condition as reported
13	under paragraph (i) of this subsection and on the capacity,
14	educational suitability and technology readiness of these
15	buildings and facilities;

17	<b>Section 2.</b> W.S. 21-15-115(b) and 21-15-117(a)(iv) and
18	(v) are repealed.
