Catch Title: COVID-19 large business relief program.

Subject: Wyoming large business relief emergency expenses and programs.

Summary/Major Elements:

• In the federal Coronavirus, Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, states were allocated relief funds to cover costs that are necessary expenditures incurred due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Wyoming received one billion two hundred fifty million dollars (\$1,250,000,000.00) in relief funds.

- This act creates the Coronavirus Large Business Relief Program, which is designed to provide financial relief to large businesses based in Wyoming impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and the state and local orders that closed businesses or that interrupted or impacted businesses.
- Eligible businesses (those that have at least one hundred (100) full-time employees in Wyoming, have principal operations in Wyoming, and that meet certain tax or payroll thresholds) can seek up to one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000.00) to address actual losses of sales or production or reimbursement of COVID-19 related expenses incurred due to the pandemic.
- The Wyoming Business Council is tasked with establishing and operating the program, including accepting applications from eligible businesses and disbursing funds.
- An amount of CARES Act funds, to be determined by the Legislature, are appropriated for this program.
- The program terminates on December 31, 2021 or the last day on which CARES Act funds may be expended pursuant to federal law, whichever is later.

Comments:

• This act creates the Coronavirus Large Business Relief Program, which the Wyoming Business Council will operate to disburse CARES Act funds to eligible large businesses.
