Catch Title: **Alcoholic beverage regulation.**
Subject: Regulation of malt beverages, wine, liquor and other alcoholic beverages.

Summary/Major Elements:

- This act makes a variety of amendments to statutes governing the sale of alcoholic beverages. The amendments:
 - Separate statutory requirements specific to wineries and microbreweries into two sections. The act increases the amount of wine that in-state wineries and out-of-state wine shippers may ship directly to Wyoming households from thirty-six (36) liters in a (twelve) 12 month period to one hundred eight (108) liters in a twelve (12) month period. It also authorizes retail liquor licensees to ship up to that same amount of wine to a Wyoming household in a twelve (12) month period;
 - Authorize certain liquor licensees to deliver alcoholic beverages to customers outside of the licensee's establishment;
 - Remove certain requirements for restaurant liquor licensees;
 - Eliminate the limit on county malt beverage permits that may be issued for establishments within five (5) miles of an incorporated town or city;
 - Modify twenty-four (24) hour and catering permits so that they could not be used to operate a continuing business;
 - Repeal several statutes, including those governing beer keg regulation and one that limits a liquor licensee from being issued more than one type of liquor license.
