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1 (a) Criminal history record information shall be disseminated by criminal justice agencies in this state, 2 3 whether directly or through any intermediary, only to: 4 The military department for purposes 5 οf criminal history 6 obtaining record information on prospective employees, or volunteers or military members 7 8 serving in active duty or in the Wyoming national quard. The dissemination of criminal history record information 9 10 authorized by this paragraph shall only occur if required by the department as a condition for employment with the 11 12 department, for training, deployment or mobilization 13 decisions or for security clearance matters. Consistent with the requirements for obtaining criminal history record 14 information under this paragraph the military department 15 16 may obtain the records of any completed investigation from the local law enforcement entity conducting the 17 investigation and the custodian of that information shall 18 19 grant the right of inspection to the military department; 20 21 7-19-201.
