A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to boards and commissions; repealing the palliative care advisory council, the governor's food 2 safety council, the division advisory committees on 3 4 underground water, the health benefits plan committee, the state employee compensation commission and the Wyoming 5 public television council; making optional the division 6 7 advisory committee on underground water; providing 8 conforming amendments; providing for rulemaking; providing 9 for the reversion of funds; and providing for an effective 10 date.

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7 (b) The state compensation plan shall, to the extent 8 not otherwise provided by law, apply to all state executive branch employees except those employees of the University 9 10 of Wyoming and community colleges. The compensation and 11 classification plan shall be designed to attract and retain 12 a sufficient quantity of quality employees with competitive compensation based on relevant labor markets for each class 13 of employment. The plan shall be based upon principles of 14 fairness and equity and be administered with sound fiscal 15 16 discipline. The plan shall utilize both fixed and variable 17 compensation as well as noncash reward and recognition programs. All variable compensation benefits under the 18 19 plan, except as otherwise provided by law, 20 administered by the department as a separately designated

and appropriated budget item. The plan shall consist of:

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1	(ii) Job content and classification. This
2	process shall formally assign positions to classifications
3	and determine pay grades in one (1) or more pay systems
4	based on an evaluation of the content of jobs using
5	quantitative point factors. At a minimum, these factors
6	shall include knowledge, experience, skill problem solving,
7	accountability and working conditions. These factors and
8	their weights shall be established by the human resources
9	division and reflect the relative importance of job content
10	to the state and to the appropriate local, regional,
11	national market or a combination of these markets as
12	determined by the division. Establishing the value of
13	compensation shall be primarily based on establishing the
14	appropriate market value of the job. For positions for
15	which a market value cannot readily be identified, the
16	value of compensation shall be based on a fair and
17	defensible method. Total compensation, including base
18	salary, benefits, lump sum payments, allowances and other
19	variable elements of compensation shall be targeted at a
20	competitive level when compared to the appropriate labor
21	markets to allow the state to attract and retain the
22	quality and quantity of employees needed to fulfill service
23	commitments to its citizens. The human resources division

- 2 that it reflects current labor market conditions and at the
- 3 request of the state employee compensation commission shall
- 4 review applicable department rules and regulations, or
- 5 through assessing employee complaints analyze hiring

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The department shall provide the legislature and the 6 legislature's joint labor, health and social services 7 8 interim committee with a report by July 1, 2022. on the success or failure of the council. The report should 9 10 contain recommendations to abolish, continue or modify the 11 council and any other recommendations as are appropriate 12 concerning further palliative care initiatives. The department and council shall provide information necessary 13 the preparation of this report, provided 14 for information requested is reasonable, economical and not 15 16 otherwise protected by law. 2 removal; duties; expense allowances. 3 4 (a) In each of the water divisions of the state, as defined in W.S. 41-3-501, there shall may be established a 5 division advisory committee on underground water at the 6 discretion of the board of control. Each committee shall 7 consist of three (3) persons, appointed by the governor, 8 9 who shall in making such appointments, select persons who, 10 in his opinion, will adequately represent the landowners 11 and water users of the division, the geographical areas of 12 the division and the public interest. The first committee 13 in each division shall consist of one (1) member appointed for a term of two (2) years, one (1) member appointed for a 14 15 term of four (4) years, and one (1) member appointed for a 16 term of six (6) years. Their successors shall each be 17 appointed for a term of six (6) years. The governor may 18 remove any member of any advisory committee as provided in 19 W.S. 9-1-202. 20 21 41-3-909. State engineer; powers generally.

1 In the administration and enforcement of this act 2 and in the effectuation of the policy of the state to 3 conserve its underground water resources, the 4 engineer is authorized and empowered on advice and consent 5 of the board of control: 6 7 (vi) To establish standards for the construction 8 of wells, to work with the division advisory board, governmental subdivisions, and water user organizations to 9 10 encourage the adoption of local standards of beneficial use 11 and methods of conveyance and application of water designed 12 to conserve and prevent waste of supplies; 13 41-3-913. Control areas; election of control area 14 advisory board; mileage and expense allowances. 15 16 17 (b) The state engineer shall notify the division advisory committee of the division in which the control 18 19 area is located, of the designation or redesignation of the 20 control area. Within twenty (20) days of notification, the 21 division advisory committee or the state engineer's 22 designee shall select a nominating committee of not less

than three (3) persons entitled to vote in the election of

1 the control area advisory board. The nominating committee 2 shall nominate not less than five (5) persons for election 3 to the control area advisory board or, if board member 4 districts have been established, it shall nominate at least 5 one (1) person for election in each district. Within thirty (30) days of its selection, the nominating committee shall 6 report its nominations to the division advisory committee 7 8 state engineer or the state engineer's designee. The division advisory committee state engineer or the state 9 10 engineer's designee shall call an election of members of 11 the control area advisory board, to be held within forty 12 (40) days from the date of the report. The call of the 13 election shall state the time, the place within the control area, the purpose of the election, and the names of persons 14 nominated for election. It shall be published for two (2) 15 16 consecutive weeks at least twenty (20) days prior to the election in a newspaper of general circulation in each 17 county in which a part of the control area or board member 18 19 district lies.

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21 (d) At the hour and place of the election the
22 division advisory committee state engineer or the state
23 engineer's designee shall call the roll of those entitled

to vote, and the number of votes each is entitled to. They 1 2 shall make a record of the qualified voters present, 3 receive all proxies and prescribe the method of canvassing 4 the votes. All proxies shall be in writing and signed by 5 the person entitled to vote. The five (5) persons receiving the highest number of votes, or the person receiving the 6 highest number of votes within each board member district, 7 8 shall be declared to be elected, regardless of whether or not they have received a majority of votes cast. No 9 10 election shall be invalid because a majority of the acreage of the control area or board member district was not 11 12 represented at the election. Two (2) of the members so 13 elected shall serve until one (1) year from the third Tuesday in July of the year following the election, and 14 three (3) of the members so elected shall serve until two 15 16 (2) years following such date. The division advisory 17 committee state engineer or the state engineer's designee shall decide by lot which members shall serve for these 18 19 terms.
