WYOMING SIXTY-SIXTH LEGISLATURE
2021 SPECIAL SESSION
PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Article 3, Section 7 of the Constitution of the State of Wyoming authorizes the Wyoming Legislature, upon written request to the presiding officers of each house by the majority of the elected members of each house to convene a special session not to exceed twenty days; and

WHEREAS, a critical situation exists relating to COVID-19 vaccine mandates which requires legislative action and cannot be deferred until the convening of the 2022 budget session of the Wyoming Legislature; and

WHEREAS, the requirements of Article 3, Section 7 of the Constitution of the State of Wyoming relating to the Legislature convening a special session have been fulfilled.

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, DAN DOCKSTADER AND ERIC BARLOW, President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives, respectively, of the Wyoming Legislature, do hereby proclaim the necessity for a special session of the Wyoming Legislature to address the matters identified herein, and summon the members thereof to convene in special session, to be conducted in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, Section 7 of the Constitution of Wyoming applicable to legislative sessions, at the State Capitol in the City of Cheyenne, County of Laramie, on the 26th day of October, 2021 at the hour of ten o'clock (10:00) in the morning of said day.

IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH, we set our hands hereto and caused the Seal of the Legislature of the State of Wyoming to be affixed this nineteenth day of October, 2021.

**MESSAGE FROM
GOVERNOR MARK GORDEN
SIXTY-SIXTH LEGISLAURE 2021 SPECIAL SESSION
OCTOBER 26, 2021**

Pursuant to Article 4, Section 4: the Governor is obliged to communicate to the Legislature, at the beginning of each session, the condition of the state. This Special Session comes about in the middle of preparing the next biennium budget. That work is not yet complete. Since this Special Session does not concern itself with the regular business of the State, a routine state of the state seems unwarranted. For the record, Wyoming has done well over this past year. We are coming back. Companies are looking favorably to Wyoming as a friendly place to do business. News from several sectors has been encouraging, but our progress is precarious and we should be mindful about how best to nurture this recovery. This Special Session, though, is not about the regular business of the State.

It has been hard to stomach the increasingly aggressive license the Biden Administration has taken over the past few months to extend the federal government's overreach into our lives. This temerity is offensive to me, to you, to Wyoming citizens, and to the Constitution that enumerates our rights. It must be stopped. In Wyoming, we believe in small government closest to those it governs. One that is limited by the checks and balances enshrined in our Constitution and embodied in the very nature of our country as a republic. Regardless of whether overreach emanates from Washington or Cheyenne, we are opposed to its interference in our lives.

Wyoming citizens have not been shy in expressing their objections to government mandates. We value personal responsibility much higher than we do government edict. And we agree that Wyoming cannot let these federal transgressions stand.

From the start, my Administration has been active in defending our citizens' rights. You all know that I banned vaccine passports by Directive as soon as that notion surfaced and, you know that I have directed my staff and cabinet to spare no effort in forcefully opposing government mandates. I firmly believe that COVID-19 vaccination must be a personal choice.

As a conservative and a Republican, I believe in the individual rights every citizen is afforded under both our national Constitution and our state Constitution. That includes the right of any citizen to run their business as they see fit. Therefore, I am incensed that the Biden Administration would have the audacity to mandate that private employers require their employees be vaccinated against COVID-19, and find it unconscionable to threaten to withhold Medicare and Medicaid reimbursements unless mandates are enforced. Using taxpayer dollars in an attempt to coerce compliance is nothing more than blackmail.

Our Constitution was written and fought for to protect our liberties as Americans; not to become an instrument of oppression. The Biden Administration's pronouncements on these matters demonstrate its complete disregard for the rule of law and the freedoms that both individuals and private companies enjoy under our Constitution. Our founders recognized what we here in Wyoming hold dear -that government must be held in check and be limited in its authority.

These are heady times and it is clear we are all frustrated by the nonsense coming out of Washington, DC as well as the continuing disrespect this Administration shows for states' and citizens' rights. I empathize with this body's impatience to do something about it. In addition, as you know, my Administration has not been idle. So, as the work of this special session commences, I want to offer you an update on some of what the executive branch

has been up to as it prosecutes its responsibilities to protect Wyoming citizens from federal overreach.

As soon as President Biden threatened vaccine mandates, I instructed the Attorney General to be prepared to take all legal actions to oppose this unconstitutional overreach of federal executive power. Accordingly, General Hill has been busy strengthening alliances, refining potential arguments, and considering appropriate legal strategies to stop whatever harm comes from Washington on these points. She has already partnered 'with a coalition of Republican Attorneys General who are working together to craft effective legal action for when the time is right and a target presents itself. She and many of her colleagues have already penned a letter jointly to the President outlining their objections to mandates on private employers. That letter is attached. While General Hill has been working with her peers, I have also been in regular contact with other Republican Governors discussing strategies and preparing other responses to confront this federal menace.

We believe federal vaccine regulations are imminent, and -- just to be clear -- as I had indicated before, I stand ready to call you all back into special session should that need arise. We are a conservative state with a Republican majority in the Legislature, and a Republican Governor. We strive always to work for the best interests of the citizens of our state. I swore an oath to uphold and defend the Constitutions of the United States and that of Wyoming. I have done that to the best of my ability. I believe in liberty for individuals and that those liberties extend to how individuals choose to run their businesses. These principles cannot be decoupled for political expediency. To do so, as Hamilton and Madison argued in Federalist Papers #9 and #10, would risk the populist demise that has doomed earlier republics. We have seen the same "vibration between elsewhere in the world. Our Constitution is truly original and remarkable in the way its checks and balances have saved us from the worst excesses of power and ambition. We have been blessed since our inception with leaders such as George Washington, who rejected calls to replace one form of tyranny with another.

I appreciate the challenges you have ahead of you to be both thoughtful and to act urgently with purpose and merit. I look forward to seeing the fruits of your labor and will review them carefully and without prejudice, as is customary. I imagine many of you are also keenly aware of the other pressing work of the State -- to craft a budget in these distressing times and to finalize the Constitutionally-mandated redistricting. We have a lot to do in the few months before the budget session.

Wyoming's is a citizen Legislature made up of committed people who in addition to personal lives have other full-time jobs and businesses. It is because our legislators are not professional politicians that they bring the practical experience to bear on lawmaking which has eluded so many other states. Indeed, our U.S. Congress sometimes seems to have forgotten what it means to legislate and falling instead into the temptation to grandstand. I thank you for taking the time away from families, jobs, and businesses to address all of the important issues, which confront our state and her people in these troubling times.

Majority Floor Leader Sommers moved to amend the Joint Rules of the House of Representatives and the Senate for the 66th Wyoming State Legislature by creating new Joint Rule 24, Special Session Rules.

JR0001/FAILED

Amend the Joint Rules of the House and Senate by creating new Joint Rule 24 to read:

24. SPECIAL SESSION RULES

- 24-1 (a) During a special session of the 66th Legislature held in October or November of 2021, bills on a list first proposed by the respective majority floor leaders and receiving a majority vote of the elected members of the Senate and House voting separately shall be introduced as identical or "mirror" bills in the Senate and the House. Subject to paragraph (e)(ii) of this rule, the list of bills first proposed by the majority floor leader is debatable and may be amended. **Any bill placed on the list under this subsection shall be published on the legislative website by 5:00 p.m. of the day no less than five (5) days prior to introduction of the bill.** Following introduction:
- (i) Mirror bills on the list receiving a majority vote of the elected members of the Senate and House voting separately shall be referred to standing committees by the respective presiding officers of the Senate and House;
 - (ii) Any other bill shall be referred to the respective Senate or House rules committee.
- (b) As to each pair of mirror bills identified in subsection (a) of this rule, only one (1) of the introduced mirror bills shall be enacted into law.
- (c) Except for an amendment from a standing committee to which a mirror bill was referred, it shall be out of order to propose an amendment to a mirror bill identified in subsection (a) of this rule during committee of the whole consideration in the first house.
- (d) Following committee of the whole consideration in the house of origin of a mirror bill identified in subsection (a) of this rule, the mirror bill shall be immediately accelerated for consideration on second reading and third reading and final passage. Second and third reading will be conducted on the same legislative day as committee of the whole consideration of the mirror bill unless the second or third reading is extended to a subsequent legislative day. Second and third reading on the mirror bill shall commence at least ninety (90) minutes after the conclusion of committee of the whole and second reading on the mirror bills, respectively.
- (e) The following shall govern speaking during a special session held in October or November of 2021:
- (i) No member shall speak more than twice on the same question or amendment on the same day without leave of the Senate or House;
 - (ii) No member shall occupy the floor more than five (5) minutes each time the member speaks and there shall be no extensions of time under this rule. This limitation shall not apply to:
 - (A) Explanation of a mirror bill identified in subsection (a) of this rule during committee of the whole in the first house or explanation of amendments to a mirror bill under subsections (c) or paragraph (g)(ii) of this rule;
 - (B) Explanation of the report of a conference committee under subsection (h) of this rule.
- (f) Notwithstanding House Rule 7-11 or Joint Rule 4-1, upon passage by the house of origin, a mirror bill identified in subsection (a) of this rule shall be delivered directly to the second house for action without engrossing but shall be accompanied by amendments adopted

- by the first house. A bill so delivered to, and in the possession of, the second house shall not be recalled for further action by the first house without the consent of the second house.
- (g) Notwithstanding Senate Rule 6-1 and House Rule 6-1 and any other rule to the contrary:
- (i) Upon introduction in the second house, a mirror bill identified in subsection (a) of this rule passed by the house of origin shall be placed and considered by the second house on third reading;
 - (ii) During third reading debate in the second house on a mirror bill identified in subsection (a) of this rule, each amendment adopted by the house of origin to its mirror bill which is not identical to an amendment adopted by the second house on its own corresponding mirror bill shall be explained on the floor by a member of the standing committee to which the mirror bill was referred.
- (h) After explanation of amendments adopted by the house of origin as provided in paragraph (g)(ii) of this rule, no third reading vote will be taken on a mirror bill in the second house, and the bill shall not be sent back to the house of origin for concurrence. Rather, both mirror bills will be immediately referred to the same joint conference committee appointed by the presiding officers of both houses.
- (j) Notwithstanding Senate Rule 2-9, House Rule 2-5 and Joint Rules 2-1 through 2-3, the following rules shall govern joint conference committee action on mirror bills identified in subsection (a) of this rule:
- (i) Both mirror bills shall be referred to a single joint conference committee as soon as third reading in the second house is completed;
 - (ii) The presiding officers of each house shall, in accordance with these rules and "Mason's Manual of Legislative Procedure," appoint a conference committee of three (3) to confer on the two mirror bills. A majority of each conference committee shall be appointed from the prevailing side on the vote for third reading and final passage of the mirror bill originating in that house;
 - (iii) The chairmanship for conference committees on mirror bills shall alternate as follows:
 - (A) The Senate shall have the chairmanship on the first meeting day for the first mirror bill referred to joint conference under this rule. The House shall have the chairmanship on the first meeting day for the second mirror bill referred to joint conference under this rule. The initial chairmanship for each additional mirror bill referred to joint conference shall continue to alternate in the same manner.
 - (B) After the first day a conference committee meets on a mirror bill assigned to joint conference under this rule the chairmanship shall alternate between the Senate and House for each additional day the joint conference committee meets.
 - (iv) The first joint conference committee appointed is not a free committee, however, Joint Rule 2-1(b) shall apply and in addition, the conference committee may propose amendments to make language changes in the mirror bill necessary to incorporate amendments adopted by either house. Each successive committee appointed thereafter shall be a free conference committee as defined in Section 773 of "Mason's Manual of Legislative Procedure";

- (v) The joint conference committee shall consider and dispose of each adopted Senate amendment to the Senate mirror bill and each adopted House amendment to the House mirror bill. Only one (1) report shall be submitted for both mirror bills and only one (1) of the two (2) mirror bills referred to the committee shall be reported back to both houses. The mirror bill not reported back to both houses shall be regarded as automatically tabled;
- (vi) The signed joint conference committee report shall be simultaneously referred to both houses for concurrence.
- (k) Notwithstanding Senate Rule 12-10, House Rule 12-11 or Part II (3) of the Wyoming Manual of Legislative Procedures, a motion for reconsideration of a vote on a mirror bill identified in subsection (a) of this rule shall be in order only on the same day that the original vote was taken and only if the bill is still in the possession of that house. The vote on the motion to reconsider shall be taken no later than the last item of business on the day of the original vote. If a vote to reconsider has passed or failed on a motion under this subsection, it shall not be in order to move to rescind the vote on that motion.
- (m) The following rules shall not apply to a mirror bill identified in subsection (a) of this rule: Senate Rules 4-8, 5-2(b), 6-5(c), 7-1, 7-3, 7-4, 7-8 and House Rules 4-8, 5-2, 6-6(a), 7-1, 7-3, 7-4, 7-7 and 7-9. A requirement to distribute or sign under any Senate, House or Joint Rule is satisfied by electronic means.
- (n) Members who attend a special session remotely with the prior approval of their respective presiding officer shall be considered present in person and within the bar of the respective Senate or House, shall be permitted to vote and shall be counted for purposes of determining whether a quorum is present. All actions heretofore undertaken and performed by the Senate and House for members to attend a special session remotely and be considered present are hereby ratified and approved. The presiding officers and chairmen while in committee of the whole or standing committee meetings may determine the appropriate means of voting for remote participants, including but not limited to the showing of hands or roll call. During a special session held in October or November of 2021, a requirement to print, distribute, deliver or sign under any Senate, House or joint rule may be satisfied by electronic means.
- (o) To the extent this rule is inconsistent with the Wyoming Manual of Legislative Procedures, the Legislative Handbook, Management Council Policies or other like authority, this rule shall supersede all such inconsistent provisions and shall govern during a special session held in October or November of 2021.

HR0001/ADOPTED

House Rule 16 is created to read:

16.0 Rules for a Special Session

16-1 Concurrent Referral.

- (a) Notwithstanding House Rule 6-1, during a special session of the 66th Legislature held in October or November of 2021, a bill containing an appropriation, or which requires an appropriation or change in funds, may be assigned to a standing committee other than appropriations, but if so, it shall be concurrently referred to the appropriations committee. The appropriations committee shall consider and may recommend:
 - (i) Modifications to any appropriation contained in the bill, or the addition or deletion of an appropriation, and any necessary related conforming amendments;
 - (ii) That a delayed effective date or other limiting condition be added to any bill that requires, but does not provide, an appropriation;
 - (iii) That the bill do not pass, provided that the committee report may include a "do not pass" recommendation as an alternative to any other recommendation made under this subsection.
- (b) A concurrently referred bill under subsection (a) of this rule shall be given priority consideration by the appropriations committee.
- (c) If the standing committee other than the appropriations committee to which a bill is concurrently referred under subsection (a) of this section fails to dispose of the bill by a motion of "do pass", "amend and do pass", "do not pass" or "no recommendation", the report of the appropriations committee shall not be read to the body and the bill shall be returned together with a record of the committees' consideration on the day after the last day scheduled for consideration of House bills placed on general file but not later than the last day of the session pursuant to House Rule 5-4(b) and (c).
- (d) Notwithstanding House Rule 6-2, appropriations committee amendments shall be considered after any amendments reported by the other standing committee to which a bill was concurrently referred under subsection (a) of this rule. SOMMERS

For this reason, the United States Constitution has never been understood to confer upon Congress nor the federal executive branch the ability to require the states to govern according to their instructions. Otherwise, the two (2) government system established by the framers would give way to a system that vests power in one (1) central government, and individual liberty would suffer; and

(xix) The directive issued by the federal executive branch and the forthcoming rules by federal agencies regarding COVID-19 vaccination mandates cannot be a more direct affront to state sovereignty. The state of Wyoming rejects these devices by the federal government under the anti-commandeering doctrine. This doctrine is simply that of a fundamental structural decision incorporated into the United States Constitution, the decision to withhold from the federal government the power to issue orders directly to the states. Conspicuously absent from the list of powers given to Congress is the power to issue direct orders to the governments of the states. The anti-commandeering doctrine simply represents the recognition of this limit on federal authority.

(b) The legislature resolves that:

(i) The legislature strongly condemns the promulgation of any federal COVID-19 vaccination requirement or mandate as an infringement on the rights of the citizens of Wyoming to make their own healthcare decisions without governmental coercion, intrusion or dictate. The federal government does not have the right to impose such mandates on the states, and doing so violates the tenth amendment to the United States Constitution and article 1, section 38 of the Wyoming Constitution;

(ii) The states are laboratories of good policy. Each individual state should be granted the freedom to determine its own policies regarding how the COVID-19 pandemic is managed within its borders without interference from the federal government;

(iii) No public entity in Wyoming should be coerced into enforcing any mandate, requirement or standard of the federal government, whether emergency, temporary or permanent, that requires an employer to ensure or mandate that an employee shall receive a COVID-19 vaccination;

(iv) No public entity should be required to enforce any federal law, regulation, rule, standard or order relating to a COVID-19 vaccine requirement or mandate;

(v) No public entity should be coerced into requiring a person to receive or show proof of a COVID-19 vaccination for the person to receive or qualify for any public benefit to which the person is entitled;

(vi) The attorney general is empowered to initiate or participate in litigation and to take any other appropriate action to challenge and resist federal COVID-19 vaccine mandates or requirements that are contrary to federal and state law and that infringe on the rights of Wyoming citizens."

President Dockstader, Speaker Barlow, members of the 67th Legislature, thank you for your welcome this morning.

It is with a heavy heart that I begin by remembering some friends of Wyoming that we lost this past year: US Senator Mike Enzi and Senator Leland Christensen. They both have a history in this body and continued to serve Wyoming long after they made their impressions here. They will both be sorely missed. There are others we will miss as well— friends and family, but I also want to share that Bobbi Barrasso had significant surgery and is recovering well with her husband Senator John Barrasso at her side. They ask for best wishes and prayers and are thankful to live in Wyoming.

Jennie, I love you and want you and everyone to know Wyoming is a better place because of your work on the Wyoming Hunger Initiative. Programs like Food from the Field, Food from the Farm and Ranch and one of my favorites that we will talk about a little later, Grow a Little Extra, have made the lives of so many of our citizens better. You have shown how Wyoming takes care of our own.

It is an honor to be here with Chief Justice Fox, Justices Kautz, Boomgaarden, Gray, and newly robed Justice Fenn. I am also joined by Secretary of State Ed Buchanan, Auditor Kristi Racines, Treasurer Curt Meier, and Superintendent of Public Instruction Brian Schroeder who is just beginning his second week on the job.

Distinguished guests, friends, family and most importantly you, the people of Wyoming; thank you for this opportunity to address you here in this remarkable chamber. Over the past couple of years, Wyoming has faced down many challenges. Together we have emerged stronger, more engaged, and better equipped to tackle new challenges and seize fresh opportunities.

As I was thinking of this State of the State, I was remembering the June mornings in my youth, when my family drove our cattle to the mountain. The hardest and longest days always came midway through the drive, when we were already tired from a week's worth of 2 AM risings. Regardless of whether it was snowing, raining, or clear, dusty or muddy, that day we rode the 9 miles from our bam, gathered, mothered, and started our cattle up the "Slip," a steep, rocky, and densely timbered trail. Beyond the elements, there were always challenges that came up: a bull might duck off into a canyon, or a calf might break back.

The day was always brutal for the horses and exhausting for us. The drive had to be completed before the day could become too hot. That meant most of the drive happened before sunrise. It was a hard pull, and at times it seemed like it was never going to end.

Here in Wyoming, we have had a hard pull too over the past couple of years, and folks are wondering if the end will ever come into view. But I believe we are beginning to see the first rays of our sunrise. Over the past couple of years, Wyoming's people kept working. Our students kept learning. Instead of rolling over when DC mandates came our way, we countered and led coalitions of states to test the constitutionality of federal vaccine mandates, leasing moratoriums, and we offered aid to secure our borders.

Despite tremendous challenges, Wyoming is strong and getting stronger. We are strong because of our character, resilient because of our nature, and optimistic because Wyoming people are doers. We respect folks who get things done, not the critics and naysayers. I believe there is an undeniable momentum in Wyoming these days. We can feel that momentum as businesses rebound and unemployment falls away to the lowest level since 2008.

Part of the reason we can feel good about our future is the work of our National Guard. I want to take a moment to recognize these folks, represented today by Adjutant General Greg Porter and Major Jacque Morey. General Porter calls our Guard the sword and the shield of Wyoming and they have earned it. These men and women are essential to our national security. But they have also

pulled shifts in Wyoming's hospitals and long-term care facilities, delivered supplies, fought fires across the West, and generally made our lives more secure. I am proud of our airmen, and women, our soldiers, and our civilians. General Porter and Major Morey, would you stand so that we can show our appreciation for our Guard and all they have done. Thank you.

You know, the world has become a decidedly scarier place with China and Russia rattling sabers. Bear in mind, what is happening in the Ukraine is as much about energy as it is about geopolitics and security. The old adage of peace through strength remains true.

That is why our nation's nuclear arsenal remains essential. We can be proud that Wyoming will remain a critical component of our nuclear triad. F.E. Warren Air Force Base - just up the street - will remain a central element of the new Ground Based Strategic Deterrent. Wyoming has always welcomed members of our Armed Forces as family. There is a relationship here in Cheyenne that is historic and, accordingly, I would like to recognize Colonel Catherine Barrington, Commander of the 90th Missile Wing, and 90th Missile Wing Command Chief Master Sergeant Nicholas Taylor. Colonel and Command Chief Master Sergeant, please stand so we can express our appreciation to you and to what the Air Force means to our nation and our state.

Wyoming is a patriotic state, and that is why I remind everyone of the words of Article 1, Sections 2 and 3 of our Wyoming Constitution which speak clearly and emphatically about civil rights and equality for "all members of the human race." And that's why I remind the world that we always stand for our national anthem in Wyoming.

This patriotism is found in one of the most amazing museums anywhere in the world, the National Museum of Military Vehicles. It is the brainchild of Dan Stark who is here with us today.

Dan built this museum in Dubois and laid it out in a very educational way. It tells a story about America's involvement in the world. I saw there the same vintage Army Ambulance that my dad drove during World War II, as well as the kind of river boat from the Mekong that my business partner, friend, River Rat and former Senate President John Schiffer served on in Vietnam. There are lessons in that collection that every American needs to know. Thank you, Dan for putting Dubois on the list of must-visit places in Wyoming. You have helped us to remember who we are and how we got here. Dan, would you stand so that we may recognize you.

Across this state, we are stepping up our efforts to remember our Veterans. In a little over a month, we will be recognizing the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War. That war, perhaps more than most, reminds us of how important it is that our nation stands together and behind the men and women who fought to keep us free.

There are more than thanks needed as we appreciate those who have fought for our freedom. Far too many have suffered PTSD and other war-related injuries. Suicide sadly remains an all too frequent event, especially for our veterans.

I ask you to consider using American Rescue Plan dollars to do more in our fight against suicide. My budget also staffs and opens the new Veterans' Skilled Nursing Facility in Buffalo.

Particularly poignant this summer was the honor of attending the dedication of the new Path of Honor Veterans Memorial in Ethete, Wyoming. It was too long in coming, but it is absolutely worth the wait.

I want to recognize our neighbors and fellow Wyoming citizens, the Eastern Shoshone and Northern Arapaho tribes. We have always been able to enjoy direct, respectful, and committed dialogue that allows us to work through difficult issues and find a path that is beneficial to all of us.

I am pleased to recognize Chairman Jordan Dresser of the Northern Arapaho Business Council and Wyoming Liaison to the Eastern Shoshone, Marine veteran Lee Tendore.

I am particularly grateful for our work with the Business Councils of both tribes in raising the issue of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons and improving enforcement procedures and victim services. Chairman Dresser is working on a documentary that will highlight this important issue to a wider

audience. We are proud to lead with you and Chairman St. Clair in stopping this devastating inhumanity.

DUTIES

There are two constitutional duties that need to be addressed in the coming days: preparing a balanced budget for the upcoming biennium and making sure that legislative districts are properly reapportioned after the last census. Last year you passed and I signed into law a strong voter ID law. Election integrity is critical. Wyoming is proud of its citizen legislators -- and the way we select them.

BUDGET

Wyoming's Constitution obliges me to present a balanced budget. The one you have before you this session is well-planned, transparent, and forward-looking. And appropriately, it is a frugal one.

We all recognize the challenges we have faced over the last couple of years and it is encouraging that we have seen an uptick in revenues. But even these have come in the teeth of the highest inflation rate we've seen in 40 years. Those of us building businesses at that time remember how devastating the cure to high inflation was too many of our farms and ranches. It crippled energy businesses, and it changed Wyoming.

That is why the budget I have submitted to you reflects a dual commitment -- to keep our state government operating effectively and efficiently, and to ensure Wyoming continues to live within her means. We have not seen the end to the assault on our state's core industries perpetrated by this Administration. Therefore, my focus must remain on the long-term fiscal viability of Wyoming and our ability to fight back.

That is why I have proposed placing an additional \$400 million in savings. I have also proposed several other actions to deal with inflation.

My top priority is a market adjustment for state employees. I regard this as critical to the functioning of our state enterprise. From our troopers, snow plow drivers, social workers and others, Wyoming is struggling to staff the very agencies that provide the services the people of Wyoming need. 90 percent of Wyoming state employees are earning less than their peers were -- five years ago. And 30 percent of our workforce need a second job to make ends meet.

We cannot ignore these sobering facts. We must do better. Our towns and counties can. They are by hiring our staff away. Neighboring states can and do hire our folks away. This market adjustment is absolutely essential. It cannot be put off any longer.

ENERGY

The actions of the Biden Administration regarding public lands and energy, are deeply flawed and clearly miss the mark. Instead, they hit Wyoming squarely in our breadbasket. Stopping the exploration and production of federal oil, gas and coal means that our state bears a disproportionate burden of reduced royalties, reduced severance taxes, and reduced economic benefit. And, for what? These actions won't reduce global warming or benefit consumers. Instead it has caused inflation to soar.

As a matter of fact, during 2021, while the Biden Administration limited oil production in Wyoming, it increased Russian oil imports and called for more production from OPEC. So, I ask you, does anyone in this room think there is an iota of common sense in that policy?

Mr. Biden, tear up your energy policy! Let Wyoming power the country!

Give us the tools and the chance to make this nation energy independent again. Wyoming has it all: the best wind, solar, gas, coal, nuclear and the ability to store 50 years' worth of our nation's total carbon emissions.

Innovation, not regulation is our way forward to give our nation the energy it requires and simultaneously solve the world's climate concerns. We do not need to choose between fossil fuels or new types of energy, to quote the old baseball sage Yogi Berra, "When you come to a fork in the road, take it." And that's what we should do, because we need an all-of-the-above energy strategy.

One company took Yogi's advice. L&H Industrial is from Gillette. It still maintains a strong commitment to coal mining, but they have also taken their expertise to expand to alternatives like wind energy and even aerospace. Today, we are joined by Jason Percifield. He is the third generation of his family to help lead L&H and shows vision about where our state can go while respecting its core industries. Jason, will you stand so that we might recognize you and the industrial spirit of Wyoming.

We have a plethora of opportunities coming our way: advanced nuclear; carbon capture utilization and sequestration; bio-energy CCUS; hydrogen; better, cleaner ways to buy and use coal. Wyoming is leading the research on ways to keep our legacy industries viable and take up new ones as well. We must seize these opportunities. And we will, by fighting ridiculous regulation, promoting sensible development, and embracing new opportunities.

In this budget I have asked for the ability to access \$100 million so we can be ready to — and I say this again — seize the opportunities that match federal and private investments in large-scale energy projects that will help us innovate and grow our mineral and energy economies.

Wyoming is committed to remaining an energy exporter. However, to export energy, we must have reliable, secure sources of transmission. Years ago, Wyoming was a leader in identifying transmission corridors. I remain supportive and committed to ensuring that transmission lines to energy consumer states, particularly to our south and west, are established.

AGRICULTURE AND TOURISM

Just the other day, Jennie was at the Fremont County Farm and Ranch Days. You all know her passion has been to end food insecurity in Wyoming. She reminded me of a story about Bobby Lane who works at the Honor Farm. Bobby knows how to grow hay. But when we had to cut budgets last year, Bobby was given a new task—grow vegetables for the Honor Farm. He was so successful he donated the excess produce to Jennie's Grow a Little Extra program. So, Bobby raises food, but more importantly he raises self-esteem.

The inmates that tended to the garden have come away with an interest in farming and a chance to lead productive lives. This is just another example of what state employees do— they go above and beyond. Bobby is here today. Would you stand and be recognized.

The First Lady and I have not been idle with regard to agriculture. We are engaged across the sector to promote our industry. And we look forward to doing even more in the years to come.

As ranchers, Jennie and I know how critical water is to our lives. Water in Wyoming is sacred, and we need the ability to stand our ground when it comes to protecting it. The ongoing drought in the West has raised the stakes over water rights in the Colorado, Snake, Platte, and Yellowstone drainages. When drought or the federal government threatens Wyoming water users, our agricultural producers, our industry, our communities; we cannot afford to be short-handed or unprepared. That is why you will see that I have asked for additional resources for both our State Engineer and our Attorney General.

One continued bright spot for Wyoming is our tourism industry. More people continue to come here to visit and enjoy what we love about this state. Revenue from lodging is now saving the general fund money and creating opportunities for new investments in outdoor recreation. People love Wyoming. We need more camping spots, boat ramps and trails so we can continue to provide more access to Wyoming's great outdoors— Wyoming people love the great outdoors.

We love our wildlife and we love our open space. That is why now is the time to use one-time revenues to fill the Wyoming Wildlife and Natural Resource

Trust. This investment will bring returns many times over for Wyoming, our ranches, our businesses, and our way of life.

HEALTHCARE

The pandemic has revealed that the demands on Wyoming's healthcare system and the accompanying costs require a focused approach. That's why I established the Health Task Force as a way for stakeholders to improve accessibility and affordability. We began by focusing on Wyoming's fragile Emergency Medical System. We need stability in emergency medical response in Wyoming, and the Task Force is recommending funding to standardize emergency medical dispatch. The Wyoming EMS system will be a top priority for me and the Task Force in 2022.

Remember, our state's healthcare system is only as effective as the people who work in it.

With us today is Will Deans, a Critical Care Nurse at Cody Regional Health. Will and his colleagues have been dependably providing care for patients with COVID-19, along with the other ailments that require medical attention, regardless of pandemic waves. Will, we salute you and all healthcare workers.

EDUCATION

One of our state's top priorities must be our education system. Wyoming schools were reported as having educated more kids in-person for more days during the pandemic than any other school system in the country. That is amazing stuff, and when I report this to my colleagues they ask how we did it. I have to answer it has been our school boards, school staff, students, parents, teachers and communities that made it happen and deserve our gratitude.

I want to take this opportunity to recognize Anne Ochs, an educator for more than 30 years. Mrs. Ochs was elected to the Campbell County Board of Trustees in 2010 and has served as the Board Chair since 2017. She is a great example of how many Wyoming citizens are willing to serve their community on behalf of Wyoming students and families. Anne, thank you for your courage and your leadership in this truly remarkable time. Please join me in a round of applause for Anne and those she represents who serve on local school boards around the state.

There are two other individuals I would like to recognize. The Wyoming Teacher of the Year from 2021, Alexis Barney, and the 2022 Teacher of the Year Brittney Montgomery. You two are absolutely amazing and your students know it. Alexis, who was unable to join us today, is a fourth- and fifth-grade teacher at Evansville Elementary and Brittney teaches first grade at Harrison Elementary in Green River. Your commitment to our children is critical to our state's future. Let's give them a hand.

The future of our state depends on a quality education system that helps students stay competitive in a changing world and continues to make Wyoming an attractive place to raise a family. There is more to that equation than just cost. To that end, I have launched the Reimagining and Innovating the Delivery of Education Advisory Group, or RIDE, to examine Wyoming's primary and secondary education system and make recommendations to elevate it into a position of national leadership. We cannot do that without understanding what those closest to education expect from their schools, and that starts with parents, businesses, and community members.

WIP

We rightfully invest a lot in the education and development of our kids. But data show what we all know-- they are leaving. The crux of this issue is a catch 22: our children leave because they don't see long-term opportunities

for employment or careers, and businesses are hesitant to relocate or expand because they are uncertain about their future workforce. But this is changing. Our focus on economic diversification has broken this Catch 22. Wyoming kids have a work ethic that is second-to-none, and already new enterprises are coming: Ranging from advanced nuclear, to digital assets and outdoor recreation because they are seeing what Wyoming is doing to change the game. We are investing in new ways of looking at career, technical and higher education. It's essential that we always stay ahead of the curve. We have to keep this momentum going, and that is what the Wyoming Innovation Partnership or WIP is all about.

WIP was born of communication across community colleges, and the University; but it quickly has evolved to include the Business Council and Workforce Services, and shortly, it will expand to include community economic development organizations, and industry. All of these entities will be important in identifying opportunities and local needs, building curriculum, and importantly measuring performance. More than a set of programs, it is a way of envisioning how Wyoming can use her unique strengths to attract, build, refine, and engage our entire capacities to advance Wyoming and diversify our economy. If you are not at the table in this new time, then you are on the menu.

Wyoming is actually bursting with opportunity across all of our sectors. We want our education system to be part of the way we grow. WIP is all about more people who do, and more people who can. I want to thank the presidents of our community colleges and UW, and the others who have nurtured this effort for their vision.

CLOSING

Let me close by finishing the story of our cattle drive.

When we got to the top of the Slip, we knew the drive would be easier. And to be there, just as the sun came up, I could look out over the red hills of my home, and make out the shadow of the Pumpkin Buttes to the east and the Big Horns to the North. I could smell the pine and hear the meadowlark. Being there on a Wyoming morning, with a good horse, a sense of accomplishment, and a clearer path forward was a feeling I will never forget. Things were right in the world and our job would become easier. It made all the struggle of the earlier darkness worth it.

And so it is with our state these past few years.

As Governor, I am always asked why am I so optimistic? It's simple. To paraphrase a wise man, what lies behind us are small matters compared to what lies ahead, and that depends on what lies within us.

Members of the 66th Legislature, thank you for your service to the State. Thanks to your families that are here or at home supporting you. I especially want to thank President Dockstader and Speaker Barlow for their leadership through these trying times and for their friendship. I know for some of you this could be your last session, while others are just starting, but together we can and must do much for Wyoming. Let us move forward with courage, confidence, and conviction.

There are a lot of things that come to mind when the term "cowboy" comes up. To me it is not a big hat, angora chaps, or tough talk. A cowboy is a decent, practical, hard-working, sort of person, whose humility is infectious, whose ability knows no bounds, and who would do anything for a buddy, knows horses, and is not afraid to admit mistakes.

Right now, the world needs more cowboys.

Thank you. God bless America and God bless Wyoming.

President Dockstader: Governor Gordon, on behalf of the members of the Legislature, I thank you for attending this Joint Session and for your message to us.

President Dockstader: Members of the 66th Legislature, Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen, I now present the Honorable Kate Fox, Chief Justice of the Wyoming Supreme Court.

**STATE OF THE JUDICIARY
KATE FOX, CHIEF JUSTICE**

Mr. President, Mr. Speaker, Governor Gordon and Madame First Lady, members of the 66th Legislature, elected officials, members of the judiciary, guests, and citizens of the Great State of Wyoming. It is an honor for me to speak with you today on behalf of the Wyoming Judicial Branch. Thank you, President Dockstader and Speaker Barlow for the invitation to do so.

A couple was returning home from walking their two dogs when one of the dogs, Rocky, broke loose, ran across the street, and attacked the neighbors' dogs on their front porch. Some kids playing basketball nearby gave chase, and one young man grabbed Rocky and dragged him into the street, while the dogfight continued. The neighbor came out of the house and shot Rocky, who went limp in the young man's hands.

The neighbor was charged with the crimes of cruelty to animals and reckless endangerment. He went to trial and a jury of his peers, guided by the judge, decided the outcome of the case.

What courts do

The courts are there so that people have a place to solve their differences when other avenues aren't available. That's how we do it in America.

Our Wyoming courts are there for a criminal cases, when the State must prove the defendant's guilt beyond a reasonable doubt; for neglect and abuse cases, when the court oversees the reasonable efforts to reunify children with their families; for divorces, when couples can no longer continue their marriages; for multimillion dollar business disputes between corporations. Our courts manage collection and eviction cases, protection orders, probates and guardianships. They handle traffic tickets.

Courts are where you go to establish and defend your constitutional rights.

There are 24 circuit court judges, 24 district court judges, 5 Supreme Court justices, and a few magistrates in the Wyoming judicial branch. There are at least a couple of judges in each one of your districts. I hope you know them, and if you don't, I invite you to make their acquaintance.

Employee pay

We have only about 265 employees who support the work of those judges. They work incredibly hard, and I must tell you - we are struggling to retain our good people. There are various reasons for that, but one primary reason is that they are underpaid. I speak for the judicial branch employees when I say, they are significantly underpaid.

We have about 120 circuit court clerks across the State. Our court clerks are the workhorses of the judicial branch. They work in the highest-volume courts, where small claims and misdemeanors are filed, often by people who are not represented by lawyers. The clerks are there to help your constituents, the citizens of Wyoming; and to support the work of the judges so the people's legal matters can be addressed timely. That breaks down when we can't keep our good people, and we can't keep them because they can make more money at McDonald's, or even in the same building working for the country.

In our administrative staff, we have a small but powerful team of skilled people who maintain our court IT and who are working on the critical efilings project, which I will tell you more about. We keep losing those talented people to higher-paying jobs in the private sector. What it means is we are challenged to complete our projects with one leg tied up.

We must pay our people a fair wage if the courts are to continue to perform their constitutional functions - that is, to provide the just, speedy, and inexpensive resolution of our citizens' disputes. For that reason we support the Governor's proposal for State employee pay increases.

I've talked to you about the effect of low pay on our ability to serve the people of Wyoming. We have not asked for new positions in this budget, except in our ARPA requests. But the truth is budget cuts have also reduced positions to such an extent that our good people simply cannot perform all the functions that we ought to. In the most recent budget cuts we eliminated 3 positions. We need them back. These positions would be distributed to the admin staff which supports all the courts, and to circuit courts which have critical staffing shortages. I know that you are reluctant to use short-term money for positions, and I understand that. But if ARPA funds can give us even temporary relief, we'll take it and put it to good use. You've cut them before and you can cut them again, if necessary. We need those 3 positions back to adequately serve the people of Wyoming, and to retain the good people we have who, frankly, are burning out.

We have also requested three temporary time-limited trainers so that we can train our clerks to get the maximum benefit from the new case management system.

We have ever-increasing demands for accurate data from the judicial branch - many of those come from this legislature - and we agree that accurate data is critical to many decisions all three branches make. Sound data starts with reliable and consistent input. We need trained people to do that.

State employee pay

I must add that from what I see, the executive branch agencies we work closely with are suffering from the same dire lack of resources.

For example, the Department of Family Services is involved in most cases that come before our juvenile courts. But it is not unusual to see, in the abuse and neglect cases that are appealed to the Supreme Court, multiple DFS caseworkers testifying. It's never a good thing to have multiple caseworkers in the life of a case that requires establishing rapport with the family and determining what their specific needs are, but that's one of the ways that low pay for State workers impacts the work of the courts and the people of Wyoming.

For another example, we work closely with the Department of Corrections in our treatment court programs - which have been very successful - our judges depend on each member of the treatment court team, not least of which is the probation officer. But because of budget cuts and reduced staffing, probation officers are no longer always able to devote all the time that some of our treatment court judges would prefer.

I do not say this to criticize these agencies. The judicial branch has a very good working relationship with its justice partners in DFS, Corrections, Health, and law enforcement. I think they are doing their utmost with the resources they have -- but as then Chief Justice Davis told you last year, you can't keep cutting the soldiers' rations and expect them to keep fighting a great battle.

Cutting government sounds good until you are reducing services to the citizens of Wyoming to such an extent that basic structures fall apart. Left untended the costs down the road will only be greater.

Three new DJs

While I am talking about investment in the people of Wyoming, I want to address a top priority for the judicial branch, that is the matter of additional district court judges. According to our workload studies, we have been short a district court judge in the 3rd, the 6th and the 7th judicial districts for many years.

We must ensure that the people in those three districts - that's Natrona, Campbell, Crook, Weston, Sweetwater, Lincoln, and Uinta counties -

continue to receive the just, speedy, and inexpensive resolution of their legal disputes. And we need to make sure that our judges have a workload that is sustainable.

I am extremely proud of the overall quality of our Wyoming judges, but I see a problem looming. We are getting fewer and fewer applicants for judicial vacancies. I think they are not applying because they see what a difficult and unrelenting grind that job is. To attract and retain good judges, we must ease that grind.

The Joint Judiciary Committee passed a bill to add a district court judge in each of those three districts. For each district court judge with their staff of 3 we budget \$1.2 million per biennium. I wouldn't ask if I didn't think it was critical to our ability to continue to deliver justice to the citizens of Wyoming.

What we've accomplished since the last state of the judiciary:

Even though Dave Barry said the only positive thing we can say about 2021 is that it was marginally better than 2020, I can report some impressive accomplishments in the judicial branch since the last state of the judiciary.

- First and foremost our courts continued to dispense justice last year, when many courts throughout the nation were barely limping along. Our Wyoming judges and court staff have done an extraordinary job of keeping the courts open and taking care of the citizen's needs in the face of some very daunting challenges. With the foresight of the legislature and the Governor's office, and the help of CARES money, we made some giant leaps in technology use in all the courts. And now, looking beyond the pandemic, we will embrace a new normal that saves time, travel, and money for litigants as well as for the courts.

But there was more than technology that made it possible to keep cases moving and trials happening - it was hard work and an attitude of finding creative solutions by the folks who work for the courts. If our courtrooms weren't big enough to accommodate social distancing, hey improvised, like Judge Bluemel does by using the Historic Round House in Evanston for jury selection. If it was difficult or unsafe for people to come to the courts to file their papers, the clerks accepted email filing, even though it meant extra steps of printing and scanning for them. Our clerks and judicial assistants and court reporters and law clerks and judges had the attitude that they would get it done, and they did.

The Wyoming judiciary was ahead of most of the nation in conducting its work remotely, and it has been ahead of most of the nation in resuming in-person proceedings.

- Our circuit courts now have a full year with an updated electronic case management system. (It's important to note the difference between case management, which is the system of filing and docketing cases, and efilng, which allows people outside the courts to file electronically. Circuit courts do not have efilng. Our top priority ARPA request, which JAC has approved, is for circuit court efilng.)
- We have begun the rollout of the updated electronic case management system in the district courts. Today, three district courts are on the new case management system. That's a big deal because once we have the case management in place, we can add the efilng piece.
- Chancery Court opened for business December 1st, 2021. It is fully electronic. We anticipate it will take some time for the case volume to pick up enough to justify a full time judge and chamber staff. In the meantime two district court judges are filling in, and the Chancery Court courtroom is being completed in the Casper office building. You will see our budget exception request of \$814,000 for furnishing and equipment, and salary and benefits for judge and chamber staff.

I also report some changes in the judges' ranks:

- Judge **Robert Denhardt**, Circuit Judge in the Ninth Judicial District in Lander, retired in October. He is replaced by Judge **Jefferson Coombs**.

- Judge **Bruce Waters**, Circuit Judge in the Fifth Judicial District in Cody, retired in December. He is replaced by Judge **Joey Darrah**.
- Judge **John Perry**, District Judge in the Sixth Judicial District in Gillette, retired in January. He is replaced by Judge **Mike Causey**.
- Judge **Timothy Day**, District Judge in the Ninth Judicial District in Jackson, also retired in January. He is replaced by Judge **Melissa Owens**.
- Justice **Michael Davis**, who served as Chief for the last three years and who will be sorely missed by the people of Wyoming, and by me in particular, also retired in January. Justice **John Fenn**, who was the District Court Judge in Sheridan, has now joined us on the Supreme Court.
- Judge **Thomas Rumpke**, District Court Judge in the Sixth Judicial District in Gillette, is returning to private practice. He will be replaced by Circuit Court judge **Matt Castano**.
- Judge Fenn's district court seat is now open and Governor Gordon will be announcing the name of the new Sheridan judge soon.

As you can see our Judicial Nominating Commission has been very busy. It's been an honor and a pleasure for me to chair that committee of thoughtful and conscientious people, and to be part of Wyoming's merit selection system. There is no better system for selecting qualified people to serve as judges with their eye on the ball - that is to apply the rule of law.

We have an important transition in the Judicial Branch administrative staff. Deputy Court Administrator Ronda Munger, who many of you know because she has been an essential part of almost every aspect of court administration for 20 years, will be taking a different job with the Supreme Court, as judicial assistant to Justice Fenn.

We thank Ronda, and all of the judges who have served, for their many years of faithful service, and we thank those who have stepped up to take over these important roles.

What we'll accomplish in the coming year:

In the coming year we will be accomplishing more great things.

We will have Efiling in our first district court this summer! That rollout will continue until all district courts are efiling in 2025. Here I must thank all the judges and lawyers who do the work of our committees to sort out the complicated procedures, rules, and protocols that go into the shift to efiling. It's a lot of work, and we depend very much on these volunteer committees to get it done.

I hope that we will have an upgrade to our appellate case management system for the Supreme Court. That electronic system has passed end of life. You authorized the funds for the upgrade two years ago, and then took them away in last year's budget cuts. We can't go on with duct tape any longer, so I hope you will approve our exception request, as the JAC has done.

I also hope that we can get a new baseline workload study done for the circuit courts. This is how we determine the right number of judges and circuit court clerks to handle their caseloads. Because of the new case management system, the old baseline study is no longer valid. We are requesting \$250,000 to complete that study for the circuit courts. And yes, when the district courts are all on the new system we will come back to ask for the funds to conduct a workload study on the district courts.

Our Access to Justice Commission and Equal Justice Wyoming will continue their work to find more opportunities for self-represented litigants - people who can't afford a lawyer but still must try to navigate the courts in civil cases. Thanks to the funds the legislature provided from filing fees in the 2010 Civil Legal Services Act, and grants, including a significant grant last year from the Hughes Foundation, Equal Justice Wyoming has been able to enhance its support of civil legal services toward the goal of "liberty and justice for all."

We have made it a judicial branch priority to support, enhance, and build on the State's treatment courts this year. Treatment courts are the most

successful intervention for leading people with substance use and mental health disorders out of the justice system and into lives of recovery and stability. We're working closely with the Department of Health and Department of Corrections, and we're focusing on training and taking stock so that we can see what works, and do more of that in Wyoming.

I want to mention a new project, lead by former Attorney General Pat Crank, to evaluate Wyoming's Juvenile Justice system and find better ways to address juvenile delinquency, mental health, and substance abuse. That initiative is just getting off the ground - I'm excited to see what the work group can accomplish, with your help, for juvenile justice.

Talking about treatment courts and juvenile justice, it is apparent that all roads lead to mental health and substance abuse. That's true of the criminal cases as well. Our trial judges across the State will tell you that we need more mental health resources, and local resources are better than out-of-town resources.

And of course our courts will continue to be open to the citizens of Wyoming so that their legal disputes - from dog fights to corporate dissolution - can be timely and fairly resolved. But we are constantly looking for ways to continue to deliver on fulfilling our constitutional promises as effectively as possible. Toward that end, our Board of Judicial Policy and Administration has just embarked this month on a project to look at reform and modernization of the judicial branch.

Our combined budget request for the 23-24 biennium is about \$91.9 million dollars, constituting about 3% of the State's General Fund budget.

You may have noticed this state of the judiciary does not include many facts and figures. That's because, although I know you rely on accurate information, I do not think the place for facts and figures is in this speech after you've been listening patiently for so long. I want to paint the big picture of the judicial branch for you, and to address our most pressing issues.

We do have a great deal of information on the Wyoming Judicial Branch website. There you will find updates on efilings, the chancery court, past workload reports, the operating plans of every district and circuit court, most of the Judicial Learning Center exhibits, and much more. We've also provided each of you with a fact sheet that is full of numbers.

Justice Keith Kautz has a continuing invitation to put on a law school for legislators.

And of course, our excellent administrative staff and I are available to answer any questions you may have.

At some point in the State of the Judiciary it's customary to say the State of Judiciary is strong. I say that this year with special conviction. In the past year or two, Wyoming's judiciary has demonstrated its strength, its resilience, and its determination to accomplish its mission - and it has done so with flying colors. That's because of our excellent people. And it's also thanks to the strong and steadfast support we've received from the legislature and the Governor. Thank you for your past support, and thank you in advance for your support of the judicial branch's critical needs in the coming session.

I look forward to our branch's continued collaboration with the legislative and executive branches. I know that we all share the same intentions - to act for the good of the people of Wyoming.

The founders of our republic and our State intended for there to be tension between our three branches of government, so that we can keep the balance necessary to maintain the rule of law and preserve our democracy.

I appreciate that despite that tension, relations between our branches continue to be cordial and respectful.

Thank you again for the opportunity to speak with you. And thank you for your service.

President Dockstader: Chief Justice Fox, on behalf of the members of the Legislature, I thank you for attending this Joint Session and for your message to us.

**LETTER FROM SPEAKER BARLOW

House Colleagues,

After consultation with the Floor Leaders, and discussing applicable legal issues with LSO staff, I am providing you a proposed course of action that I believe results in a timely and transparent process for the House to receive and consider information, and ultimately resolve the allegations against Representative Zwonitzer. The plan also takes into account when and how the Redistricting Bill will be initially considered when introduced in the House.

Attached you will find materials I have received including the initial complaint forwarded from the Secretary of State, additional complaints received by myself or LSO, Representative Zwonitzer's response, and a legal memo prepared by LSO at my request.

These materials are being provided for the purposes of the Houses' role under Article 3, Sections 10 and 12 of the Wyoming Constitution. They are being provided to you so that each of you is afforded ample time to review and consider them. They will be provided to the public on Monday.

Members may submit additional materials they believe are relevant to the allegations until 5 pm Monday. Please provide the materials to me electronically so they may be compiled and provided to the House and public as soon as practicable.

The House will be prepared to entertain motions on this matter Tuesday upon reconvening after noon recess. Any member planning to make a motion is requested to notify me and the Chief Clerk in advance, and provide the motion in writing to the members and the Chief Clerk for the record. Director Obrecht is available to assist in drafting a motion.

You will note this process does not include the appointment of a special committee. If the body wants to utilize a special committee, it certainly has that prerogative, but it will have implications on all other matters before the House. As for the allegations themselves, I identify four separate allegations within the complaints:

1. Whether Representative Zwonitzer is qualified to continue serving in the House based on his residence. This is squarely within the House's responsibility to determine.

2. Representative Zwonitzer's committee role in redistricting and whether that role resulted in "gerrymandering" by providing benefits for himself. As the redistricting process is inherently political any concern here can be remedied within the remaining legislative process.

3. Representative Zwonitzer's voting in a recent election held in Laramie County. This is a matter for civil authorities, including the County Clerk and District Attorney.

4. Whether Representative Zwonitzer's actions during his time in office after the residence question arises resulted in Representative Zwonitzer acting illegally in his legislative capacity. The election results of the 66th House of Representatives were reviewed by the House Credentials Committee and their report was approved by the entire House last January when all members were accepted as duly elected and qualified to serve. Since there has been no subsequent action taken by the House to discharge any of its members, all actions taken by Representative Zwonitzer during the intervening timeframe are presumed valid, just like the actions of all other representatives.

Also for consideration by the House during the first week of session will be the Redistricting Bill. As there is an obvious nexus between it and resolving the issue previously discussed, I have made the decision to refer the redistricting bill to the Education Committee for consideration Monday upon adjournment. The Committee will take public comment and work the bill in the same way any other

bill would be. It is my understanding the Majority Floor Leader will then consider bringing it up for Committee of the Whole on Wednesday subject to other considerations he may have.

Below is a calendar depiction of the proposed timeline for your reference. As you can see there are numerous considerations both in process and fact we will be responsible for in the coming days. I trust we will each give these matters the serious deliberation they require.

Dear Speaker Barlow,

I appreciate you giving me the opportunity to respond to a complaint submitted *'as to whether I am acting outside my district of representation.'*

I have proudly served House District 43 in Laramie County for seventeen years as their representative in the Wyoming Legislature. As a 5th generation resident of Laramie County, where my family homesteaded in 1880, my husband and I are grateful to be raising the 6th generation of Wyomingites. My family has been committed to public service throughout Laramie County's history, with the first political foray starting with my great-great grandmother running for the Wyoming State Legislature in 1932. Over a century-and-a-half, the lineage of postmasters, teachers, business owners, firefighters, and civil servants in every generation of my family has helped grow our community and make it into what we know and love today. I remain humbled to have been elected to serve in public office representing my hometown, and have won re-election eight times, (six of them in contested races now serving the people for my 9th term. I am as active as ever in my community, everything from attending community events, auctioneering large fundraisers, frequenting locally owned retail businesses, involving myself with my 8th grader's educational pursuits at Johnson Jr. High, and teaching political science and legislative law classes at Laramie County Community College in the heart of House District 43.

Undoubtedly, I represent my constituents well. The power of incumbency mixed with hard work and gained knowledge puts me at a significant advantage of representing my community's and my constituent's interests far above when I was a new member to the legislature. Each of our colleagues are aware of my work product in the Wyoming Legislature. For eight years now I've served as both a standing committee chairman and select committee chairman, formerly serving as vice-chairman of multiple standing committees; I've held multiple duties within our caucus, and am now overseeing the decennial process of reapportionment of the Wyoming Legislature. It remains the highest privilege of my life to give my all toward making a positive difference in the future of Wyoming.

I believe the complaint stems from happenings in my life over the past year. During my term an unexpected opportunity became available, requiring me to put the best interests of my family first. This caused serious decision-making on how I best continue giving my full energies to competing obligations as a spouse, a parent, a foster parent, teacher, and a part-time citizen legislator with a full-time job. Due to our family situation, I currently spend significant time staying east of town outside the House 43 District boundary. As this life change was unexpected and occurred after the onset of my term in 2021, I pursued options to both continue my legislative commitment and keep our youngest child in LCSD# 1 to finish junior high. I have always believed and continue to fully believe after discussing with multiple attorneys and legislators, that I am well-within the law to maintain multiple properties and divide my time as I see fit in order to manage the responsibilities and duties of my daily life.

I swore my oath to the State of Wyoming to serve my constituents in the 66th Wyoming Legislature, after receiving their vote to a 9th term in continuing to represent them. **MEMORANDUM FROM DIRECTOR OBRECHT

Subject: Legal Issues Surrounding Residency of a Wyoming Legislature and Qualifications to Serve in the House of Representatives

The Wyoming Secretary of State's Office forwarded a complaint filed by the Wyoming Republican Party against Representative Dan Zwonitzer to Speaker Eric Barlow and all of the members of the 66th Wyoming House of Representatives on January 27, 2022. The complaint alleges that Representative Zwonitzer may no longer reside within the legislative district from which he was elected.¹ The complaint further alleges that if Representative Zwonitzer no longer resides within the legislative district from which he was elected, he is no longer qualified to continue to represent that district in the 66th Wyoming House of Representatives.² Speaker Barlow asked the Legislative Service Office to produce this memorandum to assist members of the House of Representatives to understand the legal issues surrounding qualifications to serve in the Wyoming House of Representatives.

This memorandum addresses the question of what qualifications are required of a member of the Wyoming Legislature to serve the district from which the member was elected. It is not alleged in the complaint that Representative Zwonitzer was not qualified to be elected from House District 43 during the 2020 general election. The complaint alleges that Representative Zwonitzer may have failed to reside in the district from which he was elected at some point after the 2020 election and after being sworn in on January 12, 2021, as a member of the 66th Wyoming House of Representatives. Additionally, this memorandum does not address eligibility for office in a future election.

The analysis below is provided with the caveat that these are simply the views of the Legislative Service Office and are not binding on any individual legislator or committee, nor upon either house, the entire legislature or any court. The House of Representatives is the appropriate body to make the determination of whether Representative Zwonitzer is qualified to continue to serve as a member of the House of Representatives.

Who Determines the Qualification of a Member to Serve in the House of Representatives?

The Wyoming Constitution, Article 3, Sections 10 and 12 provide that each house of the Wyoming legislature shall be the sole judge of the qualification of its members to serve in that house, to determine the rules of its proceedings and to expel a member:

Article 3, Section 10 Presiding officers; other officers; each house to judge of election and qualifications of its members.

The senate shall, at the beginning and close of each regular session and at such other times as may be necessary, elect one of its members president; the house of representatives shall elect one of its members speaker; each house shall choose its other officers, and shall judge of the election returns and qualifications of its members. (emphasis added)

Article 3, Section 12 Rules, punishment and protection.

Each house shall have power to determine the rules of its proceedings, and [to] punish its members or other persons for contempt or disorderly behavior in its presence; to protect its members against violence or offers of bribes or private solicitation, and with the concurrence of two-thirds, to expel a member, and shall have all other powers necessary to the legislature of a free state. A member expelled for corruption shall not thereafter be eligible to either house of the legislature, and punishment for contempt or disorderly behavior shall not bar a criminal prosecution for the same offense. (emphasis added)

All fifty states provide that the house to which a legislator is elected is the sole judge of that legislator's qualifications to serve.³ Indeed, since 1908 the Wyoming Supreme Court has recognized that "The last and final arbiter of such question [of the qualification or right to a legislative seat] is the legislature itself and each house is the sole and exclusive judge of the election and qualification of its own members."⁴ More recently, the Wyoming Supreme Court in a divided opinion of four justices held that it had no authority to hear an election contest against Representative Dean Prosser concerning whether Representative Prosser met the residence requirements of Art. 3, Section 10.⁵ The Supreme Court based its holding on the separation of powers doctrine enshrined in Article 2, Section 1 of the Wyoming Constitution:

This law review article also cites "three historical and theoretical reasons" that state constitutions provide a house of the legislature with the authority to judge the election contests of its members:

[T]he conceptual relationship between legislative independence and legislative privilege, the connection between control of a legislature's membership and its independence among the branches of government, and tradition in allowing legislatures to seat members whom the voters choose even if the members do not meet the precise qualifications for service.

Article 2, Section 1 Powers of government divided into three departments.

The powers of the government of this state are divided into three distinct departments: The legislative, executive and judicial, and no person or collection of persons charged with the exercise of powers properly belonging to one of these departments shall exercise any powers properly belonging to either of the others, except as in this constitution expressly directed or permitted.

While holding that the House of Representatives was the proper constitutional entity to determine the qualifications of its members to serve, the Court left open the possibility, based on United States Supreme Court precedent, that the Wyoming Supreme Court could review action of the House of Representatives in determining qualifications of its membership if that determination was contrary to the requirements of the constitution.⁶

What are the Constitutional Requirements to Serve as a Member of the Wyoming House of Representatives?

There are three constitutional provisions which contain the qualifications to serve as a member of the Wyoming House of Representatives:

Article 3, Section 2 Members' terms and qualifications.

... No person shall be a senator who has not attained the age of twenty-five years, or a representative who has not attained the age of twenty-one years, and who is not a citizen of the United States and of this state and who has not, for at least twelve months next preceding his election resided within the county or district in which he was elected.

Article 6, Section 5 Electors must be citizens of United States.

No person shall be deemed a qualified elector of this state, unless such person be a citizen of the United States.

Article 6, Section 15 Qualifications for office

No person except a qualified elector shall be elected or appointed to any civil or military office in the state. "Military office" shall be limited to the offices of adjutant general, assistant adjutant general for the army national guard and assistant adjutant general for the air national guard.

Article 3 § 2, quoted above, speaks of residing in a district as a qualification for election. It does not speak to maintaining residency through a member's term of office. The Constitution also addresses vacancies in legislative offices, in Article 3, § 51, but neither that provision nor its predecessor, give an indication as to whether moving from a legislative district creates

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state or federal) attempts to disqualify a member for a qualification which is not contained in the constitution:

[T]he important constitutional question is whether the Congress has the power to deviate from or alter the qualifications for membership as a Representative contained in Art. I, § 2, cl. 2, of the Constitution. Up to now the understanding has been quite clear to the effect that such authority does not exist. To be sure, Art. I, § 5, provides that: 'Each House shall be the Judge of the Elections, Returns and Qualifications of its own Members * * * *.' Contests may arise over whether an elected official meets the 'qualifications' of the Constitution, *in which event the House is the sole judge*. But the House is not the sole judge when 'qualifications' are added which are not specified in the Constitution."

Schieck, 493 P.2d at 763, quoting Powell, 89 S.Ct. at 1979-80 (Douglas, J. concurring).

Article 3 § 51, speaks to vacancies occurring in legislative offices, through death, resignation or other cause.

What are the Statutory Requirements for Vacancies for Members of the Wyoming House of Representatives?

W.S. 22-18-101(a) contains provisions of when there is a "vacancy" in an elected office:

(a) A vacancy shall occur in an elective office if during his term the incumbent either:

(i) Dies;

(ii) Resigns;

(iii) Is determined by a court having jurisdiction to be mentally incompetent;

(iv) Is disqualified from holding office for any reason specified by law;

(v) Is convicted of a felony or constituting a breach of his oath of office;

(vi) Refuses to take the oath of office or to give or renew an official bond if required by law; or

(vii) Has his election voided by court decision.

For state legislators, subsection (f) was added to W.S. 22-18-101 in 2003 (2003 Wyo. Sess. Laws, Ch. 94). It reads:

(f) In addition to subsections (a) through (c) of this section, a vacancy shall occur in the office of a member of the state legislature when the person fails to reside in the legislative district from which he is elected.⁸

When vacancies shall occur in the membership of either house of the legislature of the State of Wyoming through death, resignation or other cause, such vacancies shall be filled in such manner as may be prescribed by law, notwithstanding the provisions of section 4 of article III of the constitution which is by this section repealed.

What does "Reside" Mean for Purposes of W.S. 22-18-101(f) and Article 3, Section 2 of the Constitution?

The term "reside" is not defined in the Constitution or in the election code (Title 22 of the Wyoming Statutes). "Residence" is defined for purposes of the election code at W.S. 22-1-102(a) (xxx), as:

(xxx) "Residence" is the place of a person's actual habitation. The construction of this term shall be governed by the following rules:

(A) Residence is the place where a person has a current habitation and to which, whenever he is absent, he has the intention of returning;

(C) A person shall not lose his residence by leaving his home to go to another state, another district of this state, or to another country for temporary purposes, with the intent of returning, if he has not registered in the other state, district or country;

(F) A person who takes up or continues his abode at a place other than where his family resides, shall be a resident of the place where he actually abides. (emphasis supplied).

In rendering an informal opinion issued in late 2010 related to the facts resulting in the election contest involving Representative Matt Greene, the Attorney General determined the above definition was appropriate to use in determining the meaning of "reside" for purposes of the election code.⁹ The Attorney General further stated:

The touchstone of the Code's definition of "residence" is "actual habitation." Since these two words are not also defined within the Code, we turn again to the dictionary:

Actual...existing in reality or in fact; not merely possible but real; as it really is...existing at present or at the time[.]

Habitation...the act of inhabiting; occupancy ... a place in which to life; dwelling; home[.]

Webster's New World College Dictionary 14, 637 (4th ed. 2005). Thus, the term "residence" when used within the Code means a person's dwelling or home which he actually occupied (i.e., in which he physically resided). This definition is consistent with the plain meaning of the term "resided" as used in the Wyoming Constitution noted above.

The question of residency as a qualification for membership in the state Legislature is thus actually quite unambiguous and straight-forward. The first step is to identify the person's place of "actual habitation." W.S. 22-1-102(a)(xxx). Then, if, for whatever reason, a person is absent for that place for any period of time then the question becomes, under subsections (B) through (F) of W.S. 22-1-102(a)(xxx), whether the person possessed the subjective intent to return to his place of residence—i.e., a person's place of actual habitation.

If, for example, a person resides in a home in Laramie County, Wyoming but then goes off to college in another state, the person's place of "actual habitation" is that home in Laramie County and, despite his absence; it remains so as long as the person has the intent to return to that home. W.S. 22-1-102(a)(xxx)(C).

Since the statute defines "residence" as "actual habitation," if a person temporarily leaves the state with the intent to return but to a different location within the state, his "residence," for purposes of qualification as a member of the legislature, must be the place he last actually resided. If not, then "residence" would mean "actual habitation" and the statute's plain and unambiguous meaning would be negated.

It should be noted that the Special Investigative Committee reviewing Representative Matt Greene's qualifications for election in 2011 and ultimately the entire House of Representatives disagreed with substantial portions of the 2010 Informal Attorney General Opinion, including whether a "residence" is an "actual habitation" for purposes of determining a legislator's qualifications under Article 3, Section 2 of the Constitution.

Who Decides if a Vacancy Exists?

Under general law, a vacancy is not automatically created until declared by an appropriate governing body or a court. In Wyoming, W.S. 22-18-102 provides:

The officer or governmental body having the power to fill a vacancy in the office shall determine whether a vacancy exists in the office.

Prior Legislative Service Office memoranda on the issue have cited a Wyoming Attorney General advisory letter of February 18, 2002, stating this provision is not applicable to legislator vacancies. In answering the question of whether redrawn district boundaries require resignations following redistricting, the Attorney General stated the above statute cannot be applied to legislators because the Wyoming Constitution addresses who determines when there is a vacancy in the Senate or House even though there has been no resignation. The Attorney General was of the opinion that if there had been no resignation, it is each house which must declare the existence of vacancies in membership.

If this view is correct, without a resignation, there can be no declaration of a vacancy in a House District seat absent action by the House. This memorandum noted previously that the Wyoming Supreme Court also relied upon Article 3, § 2, to disclaim the authority to determine the residence of a legislator in Schieck, supra. The question of a representative's residency qualification was for the Legislature to decide.

If the House were to declare a vacancy in a House district, then the Laramie County Board of Commissioners would need to follow the provisions of W.S. 22-18-111(a)(iii) to fill the vacancy.¹⁰

Are There Potential Constitutional Concerns with the Application of W.S. 22-18-101(f) to a Sitting Member of the Wyoming House of Representatives?

W.S. 22-18-101(f) was added in 2003. By that time, the Legislative Service Office had provided advice on at least two occasions that moving from a legislative district did not create a vacancy in office.¹¹ In 2004 the Wyoming Supreme Court decided the term limits case. In that case, the Court held statutorily imposed legislative term limits unconstitutional, stating:

Rather, the precise question is whether the constitutional qualifications are unambiguously meant to be exclusive. The general rule, and the better-reasoned rule, is that constitutionally prescribed qualifications for holding a constitutional office are exclusive. Even without the assistance of that rule, however, the conclusion is unavoidable that Wyo. Const. art. 1, § 3-one of the earliest sections in the Declaration of Rights forbids the passage of any law making the exercise of Wyoming citizens' political rights dependent upon a circumstance or condition otherwise than as provided.¹²

W.S. 22-18-101(f), like all enacted statutes, is presumed constitutional until held otherwise. The question of residency of the legislators was not at issue in the term limits case. One interpretation is that the requirement to continue to reside in a legislative district in W.S. 22-18-101(f) is the legislative enactment of the "other cause" language in Article 3 § 51 for vacancies in legislative office. Another interpretation is that the requirement to continue to reside in a legislative district is a logical extension in the requirement to have resided in the district at the time of election.

However, it is important to note the qualification to reside in a legislative district in Article 3, Section 2 is written in terms of where one resides prior to being elected to office. The Constitution does not speak to continuing to reside in the district thereafter.¹³ While some might consider such a reading overly restrictive, the Wyoming Supreme Court has adopted the view that statutory and constitutional provisions which tend to limit the candidacy of any person from public office must be construed in favor of the right of the voters to exercise their choice and should be construed strictly and not extended to cases not clearly covered.¹⁴

(D) If the legislative district is in more than one (1) county, the vacancy shall be filled by the combined vote of the boards of county commissioners for those counties. The vote of each county commissioner in attendance shall be weighted so that the total vote of the commissioners from each county shall be in proportion to the population of the legislative district within that county. For vacancies created other than by resignation, if the legislative district is in more than one (1) county, the determination of the vacancy shall be made in accordance with this subparagraph.

An extension of that holding would be to allow a person elected to continue to serve in office unless the prohibition was clear, not implied.¹⁵ The Court stated in the term limits case, "[t]he question is simply whether it was the framers' intent to allow the legislature to add qualifications to those established in the constitution. In reading the pertinent provisions *in pari materia*, and in light of the general spirit of the instrument, we have concluded there was no such intent."¹⁶

Are There Recent Occurrences in Which the House of Representatives Determined the Qualifications of One of Its Members?

Prosser - Election Contest

The election of Dean Prosser in 1970 was challenged by Laramie County voters alleging that Representative-Elect Prosser failed to meet the requirements of Article 3, Section 2 that he reside within the county or district from which he was elected for at least twelve months next preceding his election. The voters filed an action in the District Court in Laramie County challenging Prosser's qualifications. It was uncontroverted in evidence provided to the District Court and before the House of Representatives in 1971 that the home in which Representative-Elect Prosser had lived since 1940 was in Weld County, Colorado. However, the district court opinion listed seventeen items showing Representative-Elect Prosser's connections with Wyoming. On the other side the court stated, "is the single, small incident of his living in a house he does not own, a hop and a skip into Colorado, but even fastened to Wyoming by power and telephone lines to Cheyenne...."¹⁷

Based on these facts, the district court concluded that Representative-Elect Prosser had for over twelve months "resided in Laramie County." Despite this finding, the district court held the decision rested solely with the House of Representatives to determine whether Prosser was qualified to serve. Upon review the Wyoming Supreme Court determined that the district court had no jurisdiction as the Constitution vested the House with the sole power to judge the qualifications of its members.¹⁸ The Court noted that the parties had not placed

enough importance on the fact that Prosser had been elected by a large majority, and the will of the people should not be thwarted unnecessarily.

The House of Representatives took up the Prosser election contest on the first day of the 1971 session on January 12, 1971.²⁰ There does not appear to have been any investigation into the allegations in the complaint by a legislative committee prior to consideration of the contest by the entire House. The complaint, evidence and affidavit were submitted to the House and included in the Digest. Representative-Elect Prosser was allowed to provide an answer to the complaint. He submitted an affidavit and the district court decision to the House. Representative Ed Whitehead moved that the election contest be upheld and presented testimony as to why Prosser was not qualified to serve in the House of Representatives from Laramie County. Representative Alan Simpson provided the rebuttal to the motion to uphold the election contest.

Ultimately, the House voted 43-16 to reject the election contest against Mr. Prosser. Representative-Elect Prosser was then immediately sworn in as a member of the 41st House of Representatives.

Greene - Election Contest

Following the 2010 General Election, the election of Matt Greene was challenged by voters from House District 45. It was undisputed that Representative-Elect Greene previously resided in House District 13. He had searched for an apartment in House District 45, but was called into military service prior to ever physically residing in an abode in House District 45. He rented a storage unit in House District 45 and while in military service out-of-state changed his address to a friend's house and registered to vote in House District 45. He returned approximately four months before the election to rent an apartment in House District 45.²¹

At the beginning of the session, a Special Investigative Committee was assigned to review the merits of the election contest and report back their findings to the House pursuant to Joint Rule 15-1.²¹ The Special Investigative Committee on the election contest reported its findings back to the House on the fourth day of session, January 16, 2011. The majority of the Committee, and ultimately the House, rejected the election contest assertion that Representative-Elect Greene had not met the constitutional twelve months residency requirement for election from House District 45. In doing so the Committee found unpersuasive significant portions of the Attorney General's opinion requested by the Special Investigative Committee Chairman. The Committee found a difference between the definition of "residence" as that term is defined in the statute, referencing "habitation" and noted the term is not used to define a person's eligibility for election. Instead, the Committee noted, the legislature chose a different word "resident" to describe the eligibility requirement. The Committee further noted that even if it were to rely upon the definition of "residence" instead of "resident," the definition spoke clearly of an "intention of returning."

The Committee majority specifically rejected the conclusion that without taking actual habitation in House District 45, Representative-Elect Greene's residence had to be his last place of actual habitation in House District 13. The Committee noted the Attorney General's conclusion defied the law and common sense as the record showed he had zero intent on returning to House District 13. The committee concluded that "when there are two applicable interpretations of a provision within the Wyoming Constitution and one application undermines the will of the people while one supports the will of the people, that which recognizes the power of the voters should be sustained."

Three of the nine members of the Committee dissented and relied upon and quoted heavily from the Attorney General opinion for their contrary conclusion.

Ultimately, Representative-Elect Greene was found by the House to be qualified to serve House District 45 by a vote of 42-16. The Legislative Service Office has advised consistently since the House decision in 2011 that the Greene case seems to stand for the following propositions:

1. It is not clear that the statutory definition of "residence" applies to the Constitutional requirement to "reside" in a district.²³ To the extent it does, a simple literal reading of a portion of the statutes is not sufficient, but the entire statute must be applied to the facts at hand;

2. Application of the "reside in" requirement is not a rigid, isolated point in time, but the totality of the circumstances must be considered in determining whether one resides in a district;

3. If contrary interpretations exist, the one which supports the vote of the people should prevail.

Is the House Bound by Statutory Provisions When Determining the Qualifications of Its Members?

In this instance, it is for the members of the House to first decide whether a statute as applied to a duty or procedure of the House is constitutional.²⁴ The 66th Wyoming House of Representatives solely has the power to determine the qualifications of its members. When determining those qualifications, the House of Representatives is guided by the following recognized authority listed in their order of precedence as follows:

- (a) Constitutional provisions and judicial decisions thereon.
- (b) Adopted rules.
- (c) Custom, usage and precedents.
- (d) Statutory provisions.
- (e) Adopted parliamentary authority.
- (f) Parliamentary law.²⁵

This memorandum has already discussed the constitutional provisions and judicial decisions relevant to this issue. There does not appear to be a rule of the House of Representatives in which to follow in this instance. This memorandum also discussed the House's recent past practice in determining election contests for members that involve residency. Finally, this memorandum discussed the statutory requirements in W.S. 28-18-101(f).

The precise question is whether the House of Representatives is bound by W.S. 28-18-101(f), which relates to the power of the House to determine the qualifications of its members. Other states have recognized that a statute passed by a prior legislature cannot bind the current legislature for matters that are solely within the power of the legislature.²⁶ The House of Representatives could determine that the statutory provision modifies or limits one of its constitutional duties and as such, is not controlling as one legislature cannot bind a future legislature.²⁷ In determining how to proceed, it would appear that the members of the 66th House of Representatives can be guided by the principle that they are the sole judges of the qualifications of one its members to continue to serve, limited only by the explicit requirements of the federal and Wyoming Constitutions.²⁸

What Procedures Could the House of Representatives Use to Address Complaint Regarding a Member's Qualifications to Serve?

There are no clear processes for handling a complaint challenging a sitting member's qualifications to serve in the House of Representatives. First, it should be noted that the complaint currently before the House is not self-executing. It stands to reason that because only the House can judge the qualifications of its members, only a member of the House can properly present such a challenge on the floor. And it then logically follows that the House of Representatives can only act on such a complaint when officially convened in session.

Mason's Manual of Legislative Procedures states that a house of the legislature may appoint a committee to investigate the allegations that a member is not qualified to be elected or to continue to serve but does not require the creation of such a committee.³⁰

Past practice of the House of Representatives could guide, but not control, the actions of the 66th Legislature when deciding what procedures to use to decide the complaint. In the Representative-Elect Greene election contest, a special investigative committee was formed. That process was not used in the election contest involving Representative-Elect Prosser. In the Prosser election contest, a motion was made on the floor of the House that Prosser did not have the necessary qualifications to serve in the House of Representatives under Article 3, Section 2. Evidence was presented on the floor by the bringer of the motion and also by the member offering rebuttal to the motion. The House then voted on the motion.

For election contests under Joint Rule 15-1, the burden of proof is on the contestant challenging the election of a member to prove the facts alleged by a preponderance of the evidence. The House may find a similar or more stringent burden of proof is appropriate to determine a member is not qualified to serve after the member's election. A vote to disqualify a member would have the effect of denying the voters of their chosen representative and the Wyoming Supreme Court has held that such a determination must be construed in favor of the right of the voter to exercise their choice.³¹

If a member of the House believes the complaint is an issue that should be brought to a decision of the body, it appears that the 66th House of Representatives could employ either a direct motion or an investigative committee to address a complaint against a House member's continuing qualifications to serve.

In this respect, it has been declared that it is the function of the legislature, and of the legislature alone, to change rules of law, that each subsequent legislature has equal power to legislate upon the same subject, and that one legislature cannot abridge the power of a succeeding legislature. It is a well-established principle that legislative power includes the power to amend existing laws, as well as the power to enact laws, *subject, of course, to constitutional restrictions and inhibitions*[.]

Conclusion

It is clear under the Wyoming Constitution and Wyoming Supreme Court precedent that the House of Representatives is the appropriate constitutional entity to determine a complaint alleging that a member of the House is no longer qualified to serve. The Wyoming Constitution does not require a member to continue to reside in his district after his election for purposes of being qualified to continue to serve in the House of Representatives. W.S. 22-18-101(f), by its plain language, requires that a vacancy be declared when a member no longer resides in the district from which he was elected. However, the Wyoming Supreme Court has held that a statute cannot add qualifications to hold a constitutional office. The 66th Wyoming House of Representatives is constitutionally authorized to determine the procedures to resolve the question of the qualifications of one of its members to serve and is not bound by past actions of a legislature when making those determinations. The only precedent which binds the House are the requirements of the federal and Wyoming constitutions.

Representative Hallinan moved for a Motion to Convene Special Committee.

Motion to Convene Special Committee

I move that the House of Representatives convene a special session to investigate the complaint concerning whether Representative Zwonitzer is qualified to continue serving in the Legislature based on his residence.

I further move that the special committee be subject to the following:

(a) Five (5) members of the House shall be appointed by the Speaker or chosen by lot, as determined by the Speaker;

(b) The special committee shall hear the complaint and evidence as expeditiously as possible;

(c) All proceedings of the special committee shall be conducted in executive session. All records, findings and proceedings of the committee shall be confidential;

(d) Representative Zwonitzer may be represented by counsel and shall be afforded reasonable opportunity to be heard and to present oral argument;

(e) The special committee shall provide Representative Zwonitzer advance notice of each meeting, hearing or other proceeding of the committee;

(f) The chairman of the special committee shall have the power to administer oaths and to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents relevant to the complaint, as authorized by W.S. 28-1-107 through 28-1-112. Any testimony made at any special committee hearing or before the House that purports to establish matters of fact shall be made under oath;

(g) Not later than the fourth legislative day following the date the special committee was convened, the committee shall report its findings and final recommendation to the House.

Today, the Wyoming House of Representatives took up the issue of the residency complaint against Rep. Dan Zwonitzer (HD43). The complaint, referred to the House of Representatives from the Secretary of State's Office, alleges Zwonitzer's current residence may render him unqualified to serve the remainder of his term.

Pursuant to Article 3, Section 10 of the Wyoming Constitution, only the House of Representatives is qualified to judge whether a member possesses the necessary qualifications to be elected to or continue to serve in the House of Representatives.

The complaint itself was not self-executing and required an affirmative action from the House to either further investigate the allegations or to find that Rep. Zwonitzer was no longer qualified to serve. I provided the members of the House of Representatives the opportunity to make any motions to address the complaint.

House members considered a motion for the creation of a five-member special committee to investigate the residency complaint against Rep. Zwonitzer. The committee would have been tasked with making recommendations to the Wyoming House of Representatives on the matter. This motion failed on a 24-36 vote.

I then provided the members of the House three separate opportunities to bring additional motions. No further motions were brought forth from the floor of the House.

Following this action of the House and as I stated on the floor, "I consider the question of Rep. Zwonitzer's qualifications to serve in the 66th House of Representatives to be resolved in, and before, and by the 66th House of Representatives."
