A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to school finance; implementing

2 modifications to the Wyoming education resource block grant

3 model; increasing the amount that can be computed for a

4 school district's operating balance and cash reserves;

5 prohibiting expenditures on capital construction during a

6 specified period; and providing for an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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10 **Section 1**. W.S. 21-13-313(e) is amended to read:

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12 21-13-313. Distribution of funds from foundation

13 account; property tax and cash reserve adjustment;

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14 regulations.

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1 (e) Not later than January 31 of each fiscal year, 2 and except where a different percentage is otherwise 3 specified in this subsection, the department shall compute 4 the amount by which each district's operating balance and cash reserves at the end of the preceding fiscal year 5 exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the total foundation 6 program amount computed under W.S. 21-13-309 for the 7 8 preceding fiscal year. In making this calculation, the 9 entire operating balance and cash reserves for each 10 district for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, as 11 computed by the department, shall be separately accounted 12 for and excluded, until it has been completely expended by the district. Revenues from settlements of protested 13 amounts attributable to levies assessed under 14 15 21-13-102(a)(i)(A) and (ii)(A) and 21-13-201, regardless of 16 the assessment year, shall be accounted for and excluded 17 from the calculation under this subsection for a period of 18 not more than one (1) year following that fiscal year in 19 which the revenue was received by a district, as verified 20 in writing by the district and certified by the county treasurer. Except as otherwise provided in 1997 Special 21 Session Laws, chapter 3, section 306(e), as amended, and 22 23 except as excluded under this subsection, that excess shall

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be deemed to be a state revenue under W.S. 21-13-310(a) for 1 2 purpose of determining distributions under the 21-13-311 and amounts to be rebated under W.S. 21-13-102. 3 4 The department shall promulgate rules, including reporting requirements and procedures for districts, to implement 5 this subsection. As used in this section, "operating 6 balance and cash reserves" means those financial resources 7 8 of the district which are not encumbered by the district 9 board of trustees for expenditure to meet an existing legal 10 obligation or otherwise restricted by law or regulation for expenditure on specific educational programs. For purposes 11 12 of this subsection, any balance within a district's 13 separate account established under W.S. 21-15-109(e) for major building and facility repair and replacement shall be 14 15 deemed restricted by law for expenditure as provided by 16 W.S. 21-15-109(e) and shall not be considered an operating 17 balance and cash reserve under this section. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022 through the fiscal year ending 18 19 June 30, 2026, the department shall compute the amount by 20 which each district's operating balance and cash reserves 21 at the end of the preceding fiscal year exceed thirty percent (30%) of the total foundation program amount 22 computed under W.S. 21-13-309 for the preceding fiscal 23

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1 year. During this period, the amount of a district's

2 operating balance and cash reserves that may be increased

3 from fifteen percent (15%) to thirty percent (30%) of the

4 total foundation program amount computed under W.S.

5 21-13-309 for the preceding fiscal year shall be accounted

6 for and reported separately and shall not be transferred or

7 expended for purposes of capital construction. For purposes

8 of this subsection, "capital construction" does not include

9 major building and facility repair and replacement as

10 defined under W.S. 21-15-109(a)(iii).

12 **Section 2**. This act is effective immediately upon

13 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

14 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

15 Constitution.
