## HOUSE BILL NO. HB0043

Trophy game, big game and wild bison license allocations.

Sponsored by: Joint Travel, Recreation, Wildlife & Cultural Resources Interim Committee

## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; modifying license

2 allocations for resident and non-resident hunters for

3 grizzly bears, mountain goats, bighorn sheep, wild bison

4 and moose; imposing lifetime harvest restrictions on

5 bighorn sheep, wild bison and moose; creating an exception;

6 making conforming amendments; striking obsolete language;

7 requiring rulemaking; and providing for effective dates.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-1-302(p), 23-1-703(a) through (c)

12 and (e), 23-1-705(a) and (k), 23-2-101(g) and (k) and

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13 23-2-107(f)(intro) are amended to read:

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15 23-1-302. Powers and duties.

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2 The commission may, by rule and regulation, (p) 3 establish a process by which big game licenses, trophy game 4 licenses and wild bison licenses may be issued by a 5 competitive raffle and prescribe the manner of payment for which raffle chances are sold and the amount of payment for 6 each raffle chance. No more than two (2) licenses for each 7 big game species and trophy game species and no more than 8 two (2) wild bison licenses shall be issued under this 9 10 subsection. Each license issued for bighorn sheep, moose, 11 mountain goat, or grizzly bear or wild bison through a 12 competitive raffle shall, when applicable, be counted 13 against any nonresident quota. The five (5) year restriction imposed on the receipt of a moose or big horn 14 15 bighorn sheep license by W.S. 23-1-703(b) or the lifetime 16 restriction imposed on the receipt of a grizzly bear, or 17 mountain goat, bighorn sheep, wild bison or moose license by W.S. 23-1-703(c), and any restriction imposed on the 18 19 receipt of a wild bison license by W.S. 23-2-107 shall not 20 be applicable in any manner apply to a license issued pursuant to this subsection. The commission shall issue 21 licenses upon receipt of the proper license fee by the 22 successful competitive raffle winner. Nothing 23 in this

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- 1 subsection shall authorize the issuance of a license to any
- 2 person whose privilege to procure, purchase or possess a
- 3 license has been suspended pursuant to this act or by
- 4 operation of law.

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- 6 23-1-703. Limitation of number of certain licenses;
- 7 reservation of certain licenses; reservation of certain
- 8 unused licenses.

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- 10 (a) The commission may limit the number of resident
- 11 or nonresident big or trophy game animal licenses or wild
- 12 <u>bison licenses</u> to be sold in any calendar year and may
- 13 designate dates after which one (1) or more classes of
- 14 licenses will not be sold except as authorized by the
- 15 commission.

- 17 (b) Except as specifically provided under this
- 18 subsection, subsection (f) of this section or W.S.
- 19 <del>23-1-705(a),</del> Subject to subsection (c) of this section, no
- 20 person may apply for and receive more than one (1) cow or
- 21 <u>calf</u> moose or one (1) <u>ram ewe or lamb</u> bighorn sheep license
- 22 in any consecutive five (5) year period. Effective for the
- 23 1995 hunting season and each hunting season thereafter,

1 licenses issued under this subsection shall be based upon 2 the number of points assigned to each applicant for a 3 particular species. Effective January 1, 2000, Licenses 4 issued under this subsection shall be issued partially 5 through a preference point drawing and partially through a random drawing of all remaining unsuccessful applicants for 6 that year. The department shall assign points to each 7 8 license applicant for a specific species by multiplying the 9 number of years the applicant has unsuccessfully applied 10 for a license times one (1). The calculation used to assign points to an applicant for a particular species under this 11 12 subsection shall include any year the applicant does not 13 apply for a big or trophy game animal hunting license for that species, provided in the case of a resident the 14 applicant pays the fee specified in W.S. 23-2-101(k), and 15 16 in the case of a nonresident, the applicant pays the appropriate fee established by the commission under W.S. 17 23-2-101(m). License applicants within each hunt area for a 18 19 species shall be grouped according to the number of 20 assigned points for that species. Not less 21 seventy-five percent (75%) of available licenses within any hunt area shall be randomly selected through a preference 22 23 point drawing from among the group of applicants with the

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1 largest number of assigned points and shall continue until 2 all applicants within that group have been exhausted or 3 until all available licenses have been issued, whichever 4 first occurs. If any applicant grouping has been exhausted 5 licenses remain available within that hunt and selection shall continue from among the group of applicants 6 with the next largest number of assigned points. After the 7 8 selections through the preference point drawing have been 9 completed within a hunt area, the remaining licenses 10 available from that drawing and the licenses available for 11 the random drawing for that hunt area will be issued 12 through a random selection from among all applicants in the hunt area who were not selected for issuance of a license 13 14 for the species through the preference point drawing in 15 that hunt area. For purposes of assigning points under this 16 subsection, any unsuccessful license applicant failing to apply for a license, or pay the applicable fee in lieu of 17 18 applying, during the second calendar shall year be 19 considered to be a first year applicant for any subsequent 20 calendar year in which the applicant submits license 21 application for that particular species.

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1 (c) For the 1995 hunting season and each hunting 2 season thereafter, Except as provided in this subsection 3 and subsection (f) of this section, W.S. 23-1-302(p) and 4 23-1-705(a) or by rule of the commission, no person who is 5 issued a hunting license for a grizzly bear, or for a 6 mountain goat, any moose or antlered moose, any bighorn sheep and any wild bison shall be eligible to apply for or 7 receive a hunting license for that particular species in 8 any future year. The commission may issue hunting licenses 9 10 to any person in future years when necessary for wildlife management purposes to harvest grizzly bear, mountain goat, 11 12 ewe or lamb bighorn sheep or cow or calf moose. The 13 commission may issue hunting licenses to any person to harvest cow or calf wild bison pursuant to W.S. 14 23-2-107(f). 15 16 17 (e) The commission shall reserve ninety percent (90%) of the ram bighorn sheep, wild bull bison, bull moose, 18 19 mountain goat and grizzly bear licenses to be issued in any 20 one (1) year for resident hunters and the remaining ten 21 percent (10%) of the ram bighorn sheep, wild bull bison, bull moose, mountain goat and grizzly bear licenses shall 22 be reserved for nonresident hunters. The commission shall 23

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reserve eighty percent (80%) ninety percent (90%) of the 1 2 cow moose licenses and seventy-five percent (75%) ninety 3 percent (90%) of the ram and ewe and lamb bighorn sheep, 4 mountain goat and grizzly bear licenses to be issued in any 5 one (1) year for resident hunters. The commission shall allocate hunting licenses for wild cow or calf bison 6 pursuant to W.S. 23-2-107. The commission shall determine 7 8 the allocation of resident and nonresident mountain lion 9 harvest. 10 23-1-705. Complimentary licenses; pioneer licenses; 11 12 antelope hunt licenses; gunpowder and buckskin 13 licenses; gratuitous licenses; donated licenses. 14 (a) At the request of the governor, the commission 15 16 shall annually issue up to twenty-five (25) complimentary 17 hunting and twenty-five (25) complimentary fishing licenses. Not more than five (5) big horn bighorn sheep, 18 five (5) moose and five (5) wild bison licenses shall be 19 20 issued under this subsection. The <u>lifetime and</u> five (5) 21 year restriction restrictions imposed on the receipt of a

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moose, or big horn bighorn sheep or wild bison license by

W.S. 23-1-703(b) and (c), and any restriction imposed on

1 taking of wild bison under commission rule and regulation

2 shall not be applicable in any manner apply to a license

3 issued pursuant to this subsection. Except as provided

4 under subsection (g) of this section, no complimentary

5 licenses may be issued at the request of the appointed

6 commissioners. Immediately upon issuance of any of these

7 licenses, the commission shall submit to the secretary of

8 state for maintenance as a public record, the name and

9 address of each licensee and the type of license issued.

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(k) The holder of any valid big game animal license, trophy game animal license, an any wild bison license or a female or calf wild bison license may surrender said license to the department for reissuance to a veteran with disabilities or a person with a permanent disability who uses a wheelchair as established by commission rule and regulation selected and sponsored by a nonprofit charitable organization providing hunting opportunities for disabled veterans or persons with permanent disabilities who use wheelchairs to a veteran with disabilities or a person with a permanent disability who uses a wheelchair. Any license reissued in accordance with the provisions of this subsection shall be for the same species, area and license

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type as the license donated. The license shall be reissued 1 by the department to a qualifying person at no fee. 2 3 license donated and reissued under the provisions of this 4 subsection shall not be sold, traded, auctioned or offered for any monetary value and shall not be issued to, or used 5 by, any person other than a qualifying person under the 6 provision of this section and in compliance with commission 7 rule and regulation. Licenses reissued to persons pursuant 8 9 to this subsection shall not be subject to residency, 10 drawing or fee requirements under W.S. 23-2-101 or 23-2-107. The five (5) year restriction imposed on the 11 12 receipt of a moose or big horn bighorn sheep license by 13 W.S. 23-1-703(b), the lifetime restriction imposed on the 14 receipt of a grizzly bear, or mountain goat, bighorn sheep, 15 wild bison or moose license by W.S. 23-1-703(c) or the 16 restrictions imposed on the harvest of a wild bison under W.S. 23-2-107(f) shall not be applicable in any manner 17 apply to a license issued pursuant to this subsection. 18

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23-2-101. Fees; restrictions; nonresident application
21 fee; nonresident licenses; verification of residency
22 required.

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1 In promulgating rules and regulations for the (q) 2 taking of bighorn sheep and moose, the commission shall not 3 discriminate between residents and nonresidents regarding 4 the maturity, and horn size or sex of the animals which may 5 be taken. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed as prohibiting the commission from issuing a different number 6 of licenses for residents and nonresidents, from requiring 7 a preference point fee from nonresidents only pursuant to 8 subsection (m) of this section or from issuing reduced 9 10 price ewe and lamb bighorn sheep licenses as provided in subsection (d) of this section. 11

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13 (k) Any resident qualified to purchase a moose or ram big horn bighorn sheep hunting license under subsection (j) 14 of this section may pay a fee of seven dollars (\$7.00) in 15 16 lieu of applying for a moose or ram big horn bighorn sheep 17 hunting license. Payment of the fee for a particular species under this subsection shall authorize the person to 18 19 accumulate points under W.S. 23-1-703(b) for that year in 20 the same manner as if he had unsuccessfully applied for a 21 hunting license for that species. Payment of the fee shall 22 be made in compliance with application dates.

1 23-2-107. Wild bison licenses.

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3 (f) <u>In accordance with W.S. 23-1-703(c)</u>, <u>a</u>ny person

4 who is issued + a cow or calf wild bison license shall be

5 ineligible to apply for or receive a license for a female

6 or calf bison in the immediately following five (5) years.

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8 **Section 2.** W.S. 23-2-107(f)(i) and (ii) is repealed.

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10 **Section 3.** The game and fish commission shall

11 promulgate all rules necessary to implement the provisions

12 of this act by January 1, 2023.

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3 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this

4 section, this act is effective July 1, 2022.

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6 (b) Sections 3 and 4 of this act are effective

7 immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a

8 bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of

9 the Wyoming Constitution.
