1 (c) The counting board in a paper ballot polling 2 place has no authority to act until polls are declared 3 closed as provided in W.S. 22-13-117, except as provided in 4 W.S. 22-9-125(d). A counting board in an electronic voting system counting center may commence preparing absentee 5 6 ballots for counting at any time on the day of the election day, or before election day as provided in W.S. 7 8 22-9-125(d). 9 10 22-9-125. Alternate procedures for collecting 11 counting absentee ballots. 12 (b) In the case of electronic voting systems using 13 either alternate procedure provided in subsection (a) of 14 15 this section, the ballots may be tabulated automatically on 16 election day and the ballot counts shall be entered at the designated counting center at the time the polls close on 17 18 election day.

(d) Notwithstanding subsection (b) of this section,
the county clerk may choose to prepare and process absentee
ballots the Thursday or Friday immediately preceding

2	(i) Any county clerk electing to use this method
3	of preparing and processing absentee ballots shall first
4	notify the secretary of state;

6	(ii) The county clerk shall notify each
7	political party of the date, time and place that absentee
8	ballot preparation and processing will occur. The notice
9	shall include information on in-person observation of the
10	process, including any procedures regarding the
11	observation;

13	(iii) No candidate or candidate's committee
14	chairperson or treasurer, unless the person is also a
15	precinct committeeman or committeewoman, shall be allowed
16	to observe the preparation and processing of absentee
17	ballots under paragraph (ii) of this subsection;

19	(iv) No results of absentee ballots prepared and
20	processed under this subsection shall be known, printed,
21	released or provided to any person and the results shall
22	not be incorporated into the final vote count in any manner

2	(v) The secretary of state shall adopt rules for

8	(a) Unless a different penalty is specifically
9	provided in this code, the following acts, if knowingly and
10	willfully committed, are misdemeanor offenses punishable by
11	not more than six (6) months in a county jail or a fine of
12	not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or both:

14	(xi) Violating W.S. 22-9-125(d)(iv).
