9 **Section 1.** W.S. 31-7-134(c) is amended to read:

11 31-7-134. Driving while license cancelled, suspended

14 (c) A person convicted of a subsequent violation of

15 subsection (a) of this section or other substantially

similar law of any other jurisdiction for driving during 1 the same period of cancellation, suspension or revocation 2 giving rise to the previous conviction, or a person 3 4 convicted of driving during a period of cancellation, suspension or revocation arising from a previous conviction 5 under W.S. 31-5-229 or 31-5-233 or other substantially 6 similar law of any other jurisdiction, is guilty of a 7 8 misdemeanor and shall be imprisoned for not less than seven 9 (7) days nor more than six (6) months and shall not be 10 eligible for probation or suspension of sentence or release 11 on any other basis until he has served at least seven (7) 12 days in jail. In addition, the person shall be fined not 13 less than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) nor more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00). Notwithstanding any other 14 15 provision of law, any person under the age of twenty-one 16 (21) years convicted of being in control of a vehicle in 17 this state with an alcohol concentration of between two 18 one-hundredths of one percent (0.02%) and the 19 specified in W.S. 31-5-233(b)(i) shall not be punished by 20 imprisonment of at least seven (7) days in jail as 21 otherwise provided under this section, but shall have his 22 license administratively suspended for thirty (30) days.
