- 2 clarifying the definition of embalming; revising education
- 3 requirements for funeral service practitioners; revising
- 4 requirements for reciprocal licenses; providing
- 5 applicability; and providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 **Section 1.** W.S. 33-16-502(a)(xiv), 33-16-517(a)(iii)

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10 and 33-16-522(a)(intro) and (ii)(B) are amended to read:

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12 **33-16-502.** Definitions.

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14 (a) As used in this act:

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1 (xiv) "Embalming" means the disinfecting, 2 preparing or preserving for final disposition of dead human 3 bodies, in whole or in part, or any attempt to do so, by 4 the use or application of chemical substances, fluids or 5 gases on the body, or by the introduction of the same into the body by vascular or hypodermic injection or by direct 6 introduction into organs or cavities, or by any other 7 method or process. "Embalming" does not include setting 8 9 features for the purpose of identification of an unembalmed 10 dead human body or disinfecting a dead human body through non-arterial methods; 11 12 13 33-16-517. Funeral service practitioner; license 14 required; qualifications.

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16 (a) Persons employed by a funeral establishment may
17 assist funeral directors and funeral service practitioners
18 in the area of funeral directing, under the supervision of
19 a licensed funeral service practitioner. To be licensed as
20 a funeral service practitioner within the state of Wyoming,
21 an applicant shall apply to the board for a funeral service
22 practitioner license, upon a form and in the manner

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prescribed by the board, accompanied by the appropriate fee 1 2 and satisfactory evidence of the following: 3 4 (iii) The applicant has: completed sixty (60) credit hours at an accredited college or university in the 5 6 United States, and has separately obtained 7 8 (A) Obtained an associates' or higher 9 degree in funeral service practice or mortuary science from an American board of funeral service education accredited 10 mortuary science program or an equivalent accredited 11 12 program of funeral service education; or, in the alternative, the applicant has received a bachelor degree 13 in funeral service practice or mortuary science. The board 14 15 may accept education obtained outside the United States on 16 a case by case basis; 17 (B) Obtained a mortuary science diploma 18 19 from an institution accredited by the American board of 20 funeral service education or an equivalent accreditation and can show evidence of five (5) years of experience in 21 practicing funeral service in another jurisdiction, 22 regardless of whether that jurisdiction has a formal 23
