8 **Section 1.** W.S. 41-3-932(c) is amended to read:

10 41-3-932. Public notice of application or petition;

11 hearing before state engineer and control area advisory

12 board; cost.

14 (c) The application or petition shall be granted and

15 the permit issued only if the state engineer finds, after

16 receiving the advice of the control area advisory board,

| 3 | construction is adequate, that the location of the proposed |
| 4 | well or other work does not conflict with any well spacing |

| 7 | contested case hearing conducted under this section, the |

Section 2. This act shall apply to any petition to 15 16 amend an existing water right or an application to 17 appropriate underground water filed in W.S. 41-3-932 on and 18 after the effective date of this act.
