Fossils and non-fossilized animal remains 9 distinguished from minerals. 10 (a) The ownership of When used in any instrument, any 11 12 fossil, artifact or non-fossilized animal remains discovered in the strata below the surface lands and waters 13 of the state is vested in the owner of the surface estate, 14 unless otherwise governed by W.S. 7-4-106. 15 16 (b) When used in any instrument, the term "minerals" 17 does not include fossils, artifacts or non-fossilized 18 19 animal remains and are exempt from the provisions of title 20 30 of the Wyoming statutes relating to ownership of the mineral estate as provided by W.S. 30-1-134. 21 22 (c) As used in this section: 23

1 (iii) "Fossilized" means preserved by natural 2 3 processes, excluding human remains and funerary objects as 4 governed by W.S. 7-4-106, and including: 5 (A) Burial in accumulated sediment; б 7 8 (B) Preservation in ice or amber; 9 10 (C) Replacement by minerals or alteration by chemical processes such as permineralization in which 11 minerals replace all or part of an organism's remains, 12 13 which may or may not alter the original organic content. 14 (d) This section applies prospectively and 15 retroactively to instruments governed by Wyoming law to the 16 17 maximum extent possible under the constitutions of the United States and the state of Wyoming. 18 19 20 Section 3. W.S. 34-1-157(c)(ii) is repealed. 21
