## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to fire protection and electrical safety;
- 2 amending requirements for the delegation of authority to
- 3 municipalities and counties to enforce and interpret local
- 4 or state fire building and electrical safety standards as
- 5 specified; and providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1**. W.S. 35-9-121(a)(iii) through (v) and (b)
- 10 is amended to read:

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12 35-9-121. Local enforcement.

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- 14 (a) The state fire marshal shall delegate complete
- 15 authority to municipalities and counties which apply to

enforce and interpret local or state fire, building,

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existing building standards or electrical safety standards
which meet the requirements of this section. The state fire
marshal shall notify the governing body of the municipality

5 or county of the minimum standards and requirements of this

6 act and W.S. 16-6-501 and 16-6-502 and transfer

7 jurisdiction and authority by letter. Except as provided in

8 W.S. 35-9-119(a)(i) and subsection (b) of this section,

9 nothing in this section affects the authority of the state

10 fire marshal or chief electrical inspector regarding state

11 owned or leased buildings. Local enforcement authority

12 under this subsection shall be subject to the following

13 requirements and certification of inspectors:

codes for the municipality or county;

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(iii) If code enforcement authority for fire and building codes is requested, certification of a fire inspector or building inspector, as applicable, by the International Code Council or the International Conference of Building Officials is required for any inspector employed or contracted after July 1, 2010 to enforce those

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1 (iv) If code enforcement authority for the 2 electrical code is requested, certification of an 3 electrical inspector by either the International Code 4 Council or the International Association of Electrical 5 Inspectors and or licensing by the state as a journeyman or master electrician is required. Code enforcement authority 6 for individual categories of residential electrical code 7 8 provisions and commercial electrical code provisions may be individually requested and granted under this paragraph 9 10 based on the corresponding type of certification held; 11 (v) If a municipality or county that has been 12 granted local enforcement authority under this subsection 13 fails to maintain employment of an inspector holding any 14 the appropriate certification required by this subsection, 15 16 enforcement authority previously granted under this 17 subsection shall revert to the department one hundred twenty (120) days after the last day the properly certified 18 19 inspector has left the employment of the municipality or 20 county, except that the chief electrical inspector may delay the reversion of enforcement authority to the 21 department for a specified time period not to exceed an 22 additional one hundred twenty (120) days upon a showing of 23

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1 good cause by the municipality or county. It shall be the

2 responsibility of the municipality or county to notify the

3 department upon the termination of employment of any

4 certified inspector required by this subsection.

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6 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a)

7 of this section a local governmental entity is authorized

8 to assume sole plan review authority, and, in accordance

9 with W.S. 35-9-107(a)(iv), that entity has sole

10 construction inspection authority on the approved plans and

11 sole authority for periodic fire and life safety

12 inspections on state owned or leased buildings. For the

13 purpose of this section, school buildings shall be

14 construed to be state buildings. If local code provisions

15 are more stringent than adopted state codes, the local code

16 prevails. The authority granted to local governmental

17 entities under this subsection is subject to certification

18 of local <u>plan reviewers and</u> inspectors as follows:

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20 (i) If sole plan review authority is requested,

21 certification of a plan reviewer building plans examiner by

22 the international conference of building officials or the

23 International Code Council;

2 (ii) If code enforcement authority for the fire 3 and <u>code</u> or the building <del>codes</del> <u>code</u> is requested, 4 certification of a fire inspector or building inspector, as applicable, by the International Code Council; or the 5 International Conference of Building Officials; 6 7 8 (iii) If code enforcement authority for the electrical code is requested, certification of  $\frac{an}{a}$ 9 10 commercial electrical inspector by the International Code 11 Council, or certification of a master electrical inspector 12 by the International Association of Electrical Inspectors and or licensing by the state as a master electrician.

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Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2022. 15
