1 AN ACT relating to medical assistance and services; 2 temporarily extending Medicaid medical assistance to 3 qualifying pregnant women for twelve (12) months postpartum; making a conforming amendment; providing an 4 5 appropriation; requiring rulemaking; and providing for б effective dates. 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 42-4-122(b) by creating a new 11 paragraph (iii) is amended to read: 12 13 42-4-122. Cooperation with paternity determination. 14

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1 (b) The following persons are not required to 2 cooperate with the department pursuant to subsection (a) of 3 this section:

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5 (iii) A woman who has been pregnant within the
6 preceding twelve (12) months. This paragraph is repealed
7 effective March 31, 2027.

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9 **Section 2.** Pursuant to the authority granted by 10 Sections 9812 and 9822 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (P.L. 117-2), the department of health shall apply for 11 12 state plan amendments to provide extended postpartum coverage to pregnant individuals enrolled in Medicaid 13 pursuant to the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services Act 14 15 enrolled the Child Health or in Insurance Plan. Authorization for extended postpartum coverage under this 16 17 section shall end on March 31, 2027.

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19 Section 3. There is appropriated one million nine 20 hundred thousand dollars (\$1,900,000.00) from the general 21 fund and one million nine hundred thousand dollars 22 (\$1,900,000.00) from federal funds to the department of 23 health for purposes of providing temporary medical

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assistance to pregnant women in accordance with this act 1 2 for the period beginning July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 3 2024. This appropriation shall not be transferred or 4 expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, 5 unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation on June 30, 2024 shall revert as provided by law. The department of 6 health shall include funding for this program in their next 7 8 biennial budget request. 9 10 Section 4. The department of health shall promulgate any rules necessary to implement this act. 11 12 Section 5. 13 14 15 (a) Except as otherwise provided by subsection (b) of 16 this section, this act is effective July 1, 2023. 17 (b) Sections 4 and 5 of this act are effective 18 19 immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a 20 bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of 21 the Wyoming Constitution. 22 23 (END)

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
