Missing person alert systems.

## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to missing person alert systems; amending

- 2 duties for the office of homeland security and highway
- 3 patrol for emergency alert communications networks;
- 4 amending state cooperation with federal, tribal and local
- 5 law enforcement for alert systems; providing a definition;
- 6 and providing for an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 19-13-105(c)(vii) and 24-12-102(c)
- 11 and by creating a new subsection (d) are amended to read:

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13 **19-13-105.** Homeland security program.

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1 (c) The director is the administrative head of the 2 Wyoming office of homeland security. In addition to the 3 duties described in W.S. 19-13-104(d) the director:

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(vii) Shall assist and coordinate with local, state, tribal and federal law enforcement agencies to 6 7 employ the integrated public alert and warning system or 8 successor system to notify residents of imminent threat by natural disaster or manmade event or to aid in the safe 9 10 recovery of missing or endangered persons, which adheres to 11 United States department of justice criteria. The director 12 shall also assist local, state, tribal and federal law 13 enforcement agencies integrate additional missing persons alert communications networks that enable and help 14 facilitate search efforts for an adult at risk or other 15 16 missing person of an age, needs or circumstances that may 17 fall outside the scope of the America's missing: broadcast 18 emergency response alert criteria. As used in this 19 paragraph "adult at risk" means an adult who has a 20 developmental disability, who suffers from Alzheimer's 21 disease or dementia, or who suffers from or could, without access to medication, suffer from cognitive impairment if 22

- 2 getting to a familiar location without assistance.

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7 (c) The state highway patrol shall coordinate with 8 local, tribal, state and federal law enforcement agencies, the Wyoming office of homeland security and any other 9 10 appropriate entity to operate an alert system under the 11 integrated public alert and warning system or successor 12 system, adhering to the United States department of justice criteria. The state highway patrol shall operate and 13 integrate additional missing persons alert communications 14 15 networks that enable and help facilitate search efforts for 16 an adult at risk or other missing person of an age, needs 17 or circumstances that may fall outside the scope of the 18 America's missing: broadcast emergency response alert 19 criteria. The state highway patrol shall report annually to 20 the division of criminal investigation the number of times 21 and dates that the alert system was systems were used, the age, race and gender of the abducted person, whether the 22

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1 abduction was thwarted and whether the an alert system 2 assisted in resolving the abduction. In addition: 3 4 (i) If the Eastern Shoshone Tribe, the Northern Arapaho and Eastern Shoshone Tribe, both tribes or the 5 6 cooperative tribal governing body: 7 8 Operate or seek to operate an alert (A) system under the integrated public alert and warning system 9 10 or successor system on the Wind River Indian Reservation, 11 adhering to the United States department of justice 12 criteria, or operate or seek to operate an additional 13 missing persons alert communications network also operated by the state, the Wyoming office of homeland security and 14 state highway patrol shall assist and coordinate with any 15 16 tribal agency in establishing, integrating or operating 17 that system; 18 19 (B) Report missing or endangered persons to

20 the state highway patrol in conformance with applicable alert criteria, the state highway patrol shall employ the 21 applicable alert systems under this subsection to 22

1 aid in the protection of persons and safe recovery of the

2	reported missing or endangered persons.
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4	(ii) The state highway patrol may also use <u>,</u>
5	integrate or manage other alert systems to aid in the safe
6	recovery of missing or endangered persons.
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8	(d) As used in this section "adult at risk" means an
9	adult who has a developmental disability, who suffers from
10	Alzheimer's disease or dementia, or who suffers from or
11	could, without access to medication, suffer from cognitive
12	impairment if the impairment would likely render the adult
13	incapable of getting to a familiar location without
14	assistance.
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16	Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon
17	completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
18	as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
19	Constitution.
