18	student learner agreements and on-the-job training

2	Section 2. The department of workforce services shall
3	promulgate all rules necessary to implement this act.

5	Section 3. The information regarding student
6	apprenticeships, student learner agreements and on-the-job
7	training opportunities required under this act shall be
8	provided to each school district board of trustees
9	beginning with the 2022-2023 school year.

13	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this
14	section, this act is effective July 1, 2023.
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16	(b) Sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act are effective
17	immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a
18	bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of
19	the Wyoming Constitution.
