A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to marketing homemade foods; specifying that any person may sell eggs or dairy products pursuant to 2 3 the Wyoming Food Freedom Act; prohibiting a state standard 4 for food and health inspection for homemade foods that is 5 more stringent than any standard promulgated by the United б State department of agriculture; and providing for an effective date. 7 8 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 10 11 Section 1. W.S. 11-49-102(a) by creating a new paragraph (xii) and by renumbering (xii) as (xiii) and 12 13 11-49-103(c)(i), (vi), (d)(intro), (e), (k) and (m) are 14 amended to read:

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1 11-49-102. Definitions. 2 3 4 (a) As used in this act: 5 (xii) "Designated agent" means a person employed б 7 by the producer for the purposes of sales, marketing, 8 transport, storage and delivery of food or drink products. 9 A designated agent shall be named in writing by the producer and shall not take ownership of any food or drink 10 11 product. 12 13 (xiii) "This act" means W.S. 11-49-101 14 through 11-49-103-11-49-104. 15 16 11-49-103. Wyoming Food Freedom Act; purpose; 17 exemptions; assumption of risk. 18 19 (c) Transactions under this act shall: 20 (i) Be directly between the seller producer and 21 the informed end consumer, except as otherwise provided by 22 this act. A producer may employ a designated agent for the 23

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purposes of sales, marketing, transport, storage and 1 2 delivery of food or drink products. The seller of eggs, 3 dairy products or a homemade food product consisting of 4 non-potentially hazardous food may be the producer of the item, an agent of the producer or a third party vendor 5 including a retail shop or grocery store as long as the 6 sale is made in compliance with this act. The seller of a 7 8 homemade food item consisting of potentially hazardous food, except eggs and dairy products, shall be the producer 9 10 of the item;

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(vi) Only occur at farmers markets, farms, ranches, producer's homes or offices, the retail location of the third party seller of non-potentially hazardous foods, eggs and dairy products or any location the producer and the informed end consumer agree to.

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18 (d) Except for raw, unprocessed fruits and 19 vegetables, food shall not be sold or used in any 20 commercial food establishment unless the food has been 21 labeled, licensed, packaged, regulated or inspected as 22 required by law. Homemade or uninspected food shall not be served or utilized as an ingredient in a commercial food 23

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establishment. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the 1 2 sale of homemade food from a retail space located at the 3 ranch, farm or home where the food is produced or at the 4 retail location of a third party seller for non-potentially hazardous food, eggs and dairy products. A retail space 5 selling homemade food under this section shall inform the 6 end consumer that the homemade food has not been inspected 7 and shall display a sign indicating that the homemade food 8 9 not been inspected. If a retail has space selling 10 potentially hazardous food, except eggs and dairy products, 11 way associated with a commercial is in any food 12 establishment or offers for sale any inspected product, the retail space selling potentially hazardous homemade food 13 shall comply with rules adopted by the department of 14 agriculture which shall require: 15

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17 (e) The producer shall inform the end consumer that any food product or food sold at a farmers market or 18 19 through ranch, farm or home based sales pursuant to this 20 act is not certified, labeled, licensed, packaged, 21 regulated or inspected. A third party seller offering non-potentially hazardous food, eggs or dairy products for 22 sale pursuant to this act shall inform the end consumer 23

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that the homemade food is not certified, labeled, licensed,
packaged, regulated or inspected.

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4 (k) In addition to the requirements of this section, 5 for sales of non-potentially hazardous food and dairy products at a retail location or grocery store the food 6 shall not be displayed or offered for sale on the same 7 8 shelf display as food produced in a or licensed 9 establishment and shall be clearly and prominently labeled 10 with "this food was made in a home kitchen, is not regulated or inspected and may contain allergens". 11

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(m) In addition to the transactions permitted under 13 this act, homemade food producers may sell homemade food 14 and drink products, or eggs or dairy products to the 15 16 maximum extent permitted by federal law. The department of 17 agriculture shall not promulgate any standard for food and health inspection that is applicable to this act that is 18 19 more stringent than a standard established by the United 20 States department of agriculture and nothing in this 21 article shall be construed to be more restrictive than 22 applicable federal requirements.
