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13 **27-3-102.** Definitions generally.

1	(a) Except as otherwise provided, as used in this
2	act:
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4	(v) "Commission" means the unemployment
5	re-employment insurance commission of Wyoming within the
6	department of workforce services;
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8	27-3-304. Maximum payment.
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10	Except as provided by W.S. 27-3-316, the maximum amount of
11	benefits payable to any eligible individual in a benefit
12	year shall not exceed twenty six (26) twenty (20) times his

Re-employment insurance commission created; 12 composition; terms; vacancies; salary; chairman; quorum; 13 removal; office; seal. 14 unemployment re-employment insurance 15 (a) The 16 commission of Wyoming is created within the department of 17 workforce services and shall consist of three (3) members serving a term of six (6) years each. Appointments, 18 vacancies and expiration of terms shall be in accordance 19 20 with W.S. 28-12-101 through 28-12-103. A member shall not 21 hold any state office or serve as an officer or on a

committee of any political organization during the term of

- 1 membership. No more than seventy-five percent (75%) of the
- 2 members shall be of the same political party.

- 14 Section 2. This act shall only apply to unemployment
- 15 claims filed on or after January 1, 2024.

- 17 **Section 3.** There is appropriated eighteen thousand
- 18 dollars (\$18,000.00) from the general fund to the Wyoming
- 19 department of workforce services for the purposes of
- 20 updating and administering the Wyoming unemployment
- 21 insurance system. This appropriation shall be for the
- 22 period beginning with the effective date of this act and
- 23 ending June 30, 2024. This appropriation shall not be
